# City widens the gap to ten

An interesting round on the weekend with a number of changes in league position but City continue to push ahead.

The Newmarket based side are now 10 points clear of the chasing pack following a 2-0 result against the Ipswich Knights despite a horror run with injuries.

Chris Slater defied a back injury to take the field and justified the decision by once again producing a spectacular goal to complement the earlier strike by Mark Luburic.

Meanwhile, Taringa have weathered the storm following a couple of poor results, their 1-0 victory over Mt Gravatt seeing them leapfrog Lions into second spot on the table.

State team debutant Scott Guyett did the damage, his effort enough to separate the two sides.

Lions made the toughest road trip in the League to Thabeban Sports Complex and came away disappointed. Not only did they lose the game 3-1 to Bundaberg Waves but they also lost second spot on the table.

Miron Bleiberg's team do have a game in hand however, their washed out fixture against Beenleigh now rescheduled for Wednesday, June 3.

Rochedale meanwhile returned to Underwood Park with a point after recording a 1-1 result at the Gold Coast. Aaron Bristow struck first for the homeside with a fierce drive but a well placed header late in the game from recent recruit Wade Baldwin was enough to guarantee Rochedale a share of the points.

Ipswich Knights have come some through patchy early season form to give coach Mike Mulvey reason to look forward with enthusiam, his side currently well placed on 19 points.

Next comes the Gold Coast, more than justifying their inclusion in the competition. One of the better defensive records in the league currently sees them sixth in the competition.

Bundaberg Waves promised plenty last year but are yet to show the same form in 1998. However, the recent acquisition of Strikers squad members Royce Brownlie and Andrew Packer is sure to bolster their attacking options with Brownlie already amongst the goals.

Finally, Beenleigh and Wynnum met at the weekend in the battle of the league's two bottom sides.

The match proved the most entertaining of the round however, due no doubt in part to the recent changes in coaching staff at both clubs.

New Wynnum coach Peter Tokesi was their to watch the match before taking charge of the Wolves this week but it was Steve Dolan, in just his second game in charge of Beenleigh who had reason to smile.

The 4-2 win to Beenleigh was just their second of the season, an incredible statitistic really, given the talent of their side with Brad Ditton and Danny Stowers the standouts.

#### PREMIER PREVIEW - Brisbane Lions v Gold Coast

Brisbane Lions will host the Gold Coast on Saturday determined to reclaim second spot on the XXXX Premier League table.

Lions suffered a 3-1 loss on the tough trip to Bundaberg and with Taringa winning, they have leap-frogged the Richlands side to head the pack chasing Brisbane City.

City are moving away from the field and Lions coach Miron Bleiberg was less than pleased with the effort of his side on the trip

"We had chances in the first 20 minutes but then Robbie Farrow made an uncharacteristic mistake and all of a sudden they were chasing everything and running like hound dogs," he said. "They have a strong defence and a good keeper and this made it hard for us".


Looking forward Bleiberg said the game against the Gold Coast this weekend presented a different challenge as they played a different game to most sides in the league.

The Lions coach summed up his side's chances of bridging the ever burgeoning gap to City by citing one shining example of recent weeks where persistence paid off for a chasing team.

"I look at Arsenal and Manchester United in the English Premier League and it shows me that the season is certainly not over for us yet".

#### PREMIER PREVIEW - Rochedale v Ipswich Knights

Rochedale host the Ipswich Knights on Saturday Knight in what may prove to be a vital game in the season of both sides.

They go into the match level on points, a fact not lost on Knights coach Mike Mulvey.

"We're both on 19 points and if either of us manage a win it will give one the jump on the other," he said.

Mulvey was speaking after his team had suffered a disappointing loss at the hands of the league's runaway leaders Brisbane City on Sunday.

He said he felt his side had dominated in the first half and that it wouldn't have been an unfair reflection on the game if they had gone to the break on or two goals in front.

"We lost our concentration in the second half however, and they scored twice in a 12 minute spell," he said. "But City are a champion side and champion sides can do that to you.

Looking towards this weekend's game against Rochedale, Mulvey said both he and his team were very enthusiastic about the match.

"I'm really looking forward to the game. It's always a great atmosphere at Rochedale and should make for a good game," he said.

Rochedale's Peter Bannon is also anticipating an entertaining clash and suggested he would be approaching the game with a degree of caution.

"Ipswich are certainly playing very well but, as I'll tell anyone who'll listen, this is as close a league as we've had in years," he said.

Bannon said he was disappointed with his team's 1-1 draw at the Gold Coast citing an inability to score as something they would need to address.

"We're having enough of the ball but we seem to be bringing the best out of opposition goal keepers," he said.

But he said he was pleased with the way they were finishing matches strongly and it seems the Knights will have their work cut out if their to take the points back to Bundamba.

#### PREMIER PREVIEW - WYNNUM DIST. V BUNDADERG

Peter Tokesi takes charge of the Wynnum Wolves for the first time on Sunday afternoon and they face a tough battle with Bundaberg Waves.

Tokesi, the assistant coach with the Brisbane Strikers, takes over the reigns from George Cowie who was recently appointed to the position of Regional Director of Coaching for the Sunshine Coast.

However, Tokesi is no stranger to the XXXX Premier League having coached Brisbane City to success a couple of years ago.

On the performance of his new charges at the weekend, who disappointingly went down to a 4-2 loss to Beenleigh at the weekend in Cowie's last game in charge, Tokesi said their were a few things he felt should be addressed.

"There were plenty of positives but we need to look at tightening up the defence," he said. "Wynnum are a young side who have plenty of enthusiasm but they lost concentration in the final minutes".


He said he felt the Wolves deserved to win and probably should have at 2-1 up in the dying minutes, but three injury time goals from Beenleigh proved the difference.

Tokesi freely admitted that he wasn't as well informed on the other sides in the competition as he would like to be but Bundaberg's 3-1 victory over Lions had given him food for thought.

He said the Waves had recruited well in recent weeks and this had resulted in a significant form turn around.

"Andrew Packer and Royce Brownlie from the Strikers have certainly bolstered their depth," he said. "They had been struggling for goals but Royce has scored four or five in the four games he's been their and he's showing he's a very strong player in this league".

But, the Wolves have added to their own fire power in the past week signing Wade Cannon from Lions and Tokesi said this acquisition would give him the opportunity to reassess his options in attack.

## What future for Ipswich City

Traditionally Ipswich has been one of the strongest regions for soccer in Queensland. Plenty of teams have come and gone over the years, with names like the Dinmore Bushrats and more recently the Leichardt Eagles and Coalstars coming to mind. But now their are just two clubs remaining in the town, the Knights and Amateur club Ipswich City. With St Helens and Coalstars forced to merge last year, what future is there for Ipswich City?

A host of Premierships and Championships have travelled to Queensland's oldest town, not just in the top grade but also in the lower divisions.

Apart from the silverware however, some of the true greats of the game in Queensland have come out of the area, including Gary Wilkins, Brian "Chooky" Vogler and Gordon "Bunny" Nunn.

However the game has since moved on and that has meant a lot of rationalising at the grassroots level, with many clubs forced to merge or even bail out of competition altogether.

One club that appears to be standing the test of time however is Division Two Amateur battler

Ipswich City, a club which is going from strength to strength despite being just up the road from XXXX League giants Ipswich Knights.

City Secretary Scott Thompson believes the club has remained intact for all these years because of one simple fact.

"We're totally amateur, so we're not forced to make huge player payments and any one who wants to play for us must pay," Thompson said.

"Because of that, we also fill an important niche in the Ipswich soccer market.

"Not everyone can play in the top grades, so we offer players a genuine chance to get on the park at a level that's suitable to them."

Thompson said his club was not competing with the Knights on or off the field, with City players and supporters instead choosing to support their "bigger brothers".

"We don't expect big crowds. We've got a very strong junior base of around 30 teams and it's just nice to see some of the young players and their parents stay and watch the seniors in action," Thompson said.

"As far as sponsorship is concerned, we don't need a great deal and the local businesses are more than helpful to our cause.

"But in all seriousness we just want to see Ipswich soccer rise to the top again, so we're more than happy to support the Knights."

Despite the mutual respect for one another at the moment, City does have ambitions to move onto a higher level of competition at some stage in the future.

Thompson said he would personally like to see the club move into the semi-pro ranks by the turn of the century, however he acknowledged there was still plenty of work to do before the club would make the grade.

#### PREMIER PREVIEW Taringa Rovers v Beenleigh

Taringa and Beenleigh come up against each other at Jack Speare Park on Sunday, both off the back of victories, but at contrastingly different ends of the table.

Taringa's one nil result may not have had coach John Ogden gushing with adjectives but it has seen his side continue their march up the table now holding down second place.

"We deserved the win but it was a fairly tough contest throughout," he said. "But, in saying that, every game has been tough".

Ogden's young side seem to have developed a bit more cohesion in recent weeks, the hiccup against Ipswich withstanding, but several of his most talented young charges will be missing for this weekend's game.

"Three of my squad will be away this week with the Queensland Schoolboys," he said. "Aaron Bacher, Glen Dickens and Shaun Molenda".

Ogden is one of a growing band commenting on the closeness of the competition and said they would be treating the bottom-placed Beenleigh with the utmost respect.

"We'll treat them the same we would if we were playing the top side," he said.

Steve Dolan meanwhile has inherited a Beenleigh side who have obviously struggled for results so far this season but their gutsy 4-2 victory over Wynnum at the weekend showed that they certainly haven't given up.

From 1-0 up to then be 2-1 down it looked like Beenleigh was heading for an all-to-familiar fate but they showed character, only fleetingly seen this year, to over-run the Wolves.

Dolan said the match may yet prove a turning point in the season for his team.

"It was an important game for us," he said. "If we'd lost, Wynnum would have gone to 13 points and that would have meant 10 points between bottom and second bottom."

Beenleigh face a tough road in the coming weeks with Taringa this weekend, backing up to meet the same opponents in the Cup just over a week later.

#### PREMIER PREVIEW - Brisbane City v Mt Gravatt

Sunday afternoon sees the Brisbane City juggernaut return home to Newmarket to host the inconsistent Mt Gravatt.

At coach Bobby Hamilton's own admission City, were not able to dominate their match against Ipswich in the way they have most fixtures in 1998 but they once again showed true championship quality by pulling off a 2-0 victory.

Injury to a number of players forced Hamilton to reassess his options at Bundamba, playing a different approach to the attackminded game which had already netted his team 29 goals going into this fixture.

"I was quite pleased as we had five players out injured and, at one point, had four reserve grade players on the field," he said. "Because of the changes we took a slightly different approach to the game in that we were a little more cautious".

But Hamilton has a wealth of talent at the club this year and the most miserly defence seen in the league in years combined with the most potent strike force, makes them more than a match for just about anyone in the competition.

"The beauty of how we're going is our record in defence and our confidence that we can score at any time," said Hamilton.

On Mt Gravatt Hamilton said he felt they had been hot and cold this year and was unsure what top expect from them but that he may not have the luxury of choosing his ideal squad for the match.

"With so many players out with injury how I approach the game will depend on who is available," he said.

Despite concerns over key players, Hamilton issued an ominous warning when he said he felt his side had already passed through the obligatory season slump.

"I'm a firm believer that all teams go through a rough patch in a season and I think we've done that and are coming good again," he said.

#### BEFORE THE WHISTLE

I have not been present at any matches the last two Saturdays due to my being reacquainted with a shovel and earthworks associated with the relocation of a stormwater drain at my place of domicile! Now that's behind me, I can look forward to getting out and about once again and giving some "candid" views of matches around town.

With us fast approaching the half way mark, a quick glance at some of the records of teams to date, with a few more unbeaten tags having disappeared of late.

The club has ambitions of returning to the XXXX Premier League and have a number of former XXXX league players among their ranks, including former state player Craig Collins.


Collins has always been one of the state's best players. A former winner of the Gold Medal, his business interests have forced soccer to take a back seat.

On the other side of the semi-pro divisions, Toowoomba look to have things wrapped up.


Toowoomba has been a breeding ground for quality players and it's only a matter of time before they find a place in the XXXX Premier League.
