# Oh! what a weekend it was

Round two of the Queensland Cup has come and gone with no great surprises although a number of the winning margins were a little larger than might have been expected.

Albany Creek met their Semi Pro North league rivals Mitchelton and, despite being three points behind their local rivals in the league, Creek were comfortable victors with a 2-0 margin.

Goodna are on target for the wooden spoon in Amateur Division 1 and will play no further part in the Cup either after being trounced 5-1 by their high flying Semi Pro opposition Capalaba.

Bundaberg were one of the big winners in the round travelling to Olympic's Goodwin Park and humiliating the home team with a 7-1 victory.

A Premier League side was also in action against North Star, Mt Gravatt shrugging off the inter-club bickering of the past couple of weeks to record a comfortable 3-0 victory over their Semi Pro North opposition.

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Another of the Amateur sides made an early exit with Clairvaux unable to find Cup joy in an already disappointing season and easily outgunned by Semi Pro opposition, Rocklea the victors 4-1.

The University of Queensland were also big winners on the weekend. The students are currently second in Semi Pro North and looked a class above their Amateur Division 1 opposition Redcliffe, dishing out a 7-1 belting to the boys from the peninsula.

One of the big clashes of the round was the all Premier League match between Ipswich and the Gold Coast on Sunday afternoon. The teams are just three points apart in the league and it was not surprisingly a close encounter, with extra time required before the Knights pulled off a 2-1 win.

Inala City and Souths played out an all Semi Pro South tie with Inala too strong at home, holding out for a 3-2 victory.

There were several big results in Round Two but one can't help but feel particularly sorry for division three's Woodridge. They faced up to Semi Pro North's Pine Rivers and while Frank Pimblett's side have hardly set their own league on fire, they went to town against the cup minnows inflicting a crushing 10-0 defeat.

Lions were easy victors over Brothers dishing out a 5-0 thumping and their Premier League compatriots Wynnum had a similar result, overcoming Newmarket with a 3-0 result.

The closest game of the round was a surprise result. Acacia Ridge would have gone into the match fancying their chances against Division 1 Annerley but, with the result 4-4 after extra time, it was Annerley who had the final say with a 5-4 victory on penalties.

Grange Thistle belted Bethania 5-0 in the final game of the weekend and there were several other matches played during the week however, the results of these games were not available at the time of printing.

## PREMIER PREVIEW - BRISBANE LIONS V ROCHEDALE

After a week's layoff to allow for the playing of Round 2 of the Queensland Cup, the XXXX Premier League returns this week.

First up Brisbane Lions play host to Rochedale Rovers, with the visitors backing up after a tough Cup tie against Toowoomba.

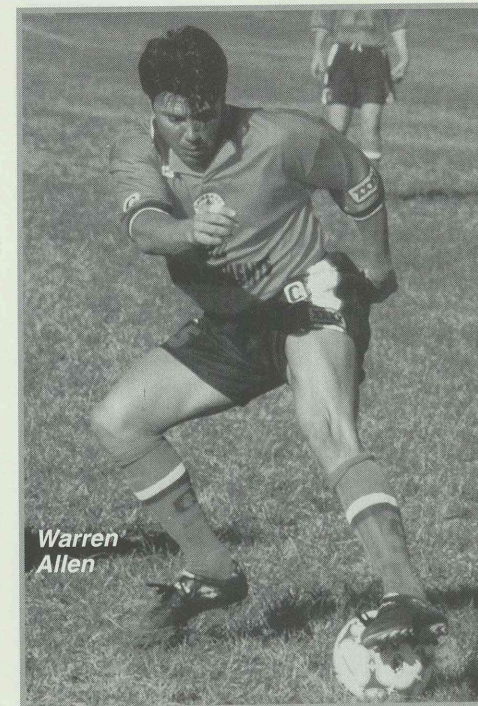
Rochedale have this season failed to show the sort of razzle dazzle we have come to expect from them and they are clearly lacking fire power in front of goal.

Only the Gold Coast, Bundaberg and Beenleigh have scored less goals than Rochedale and Bannon must be concerned that they have failed to find a striker to even come close to filling the shoes of the retired Kieran Cooper.

Th recent call up of Glen Kolpak to the Olyroos squad by coach Raul Blanco, will give the young striker renewed confidence and the club will be hoping he can add to the tally of five goals he has managed so far this season.

In the last few weeks, the top three seem to have sorted themselves out with City streeting the field and Taringa and Lions heading the chasing pack.

Rochedale are fourth but, with the season reaching its midway mark, they must start to get a roll if they are to make certain they are in the final four come September.

They are another side to have a reasonable return in the goals for column but, despite having Queensland reserve keeper Mark Bland between the posts, they have conceded plenty as well.

On just 14 points from 13 matches, it seems likely all fans will be saved the sight of seeing Ready make good on his promise of a naked romp should they make the finals, something that will please everyone but the most devoted Mt Gravatt fan!

## PREMIER PREVIEW - BEENLEIGH v BRISBANE CITY

Chris Green Park sees a battle of two clubs at complete polar opposites on the XXXX Premier League landscape.

Beenleigh, who prop up the bottom of the table with just six points from 12 matches played, host the seemingly unstoppable Brisbane City who are currently eight points clear on top of the competition.

They played Taringa in the Cup on Tuesday, hoping to reverse their 1-0 loss in the league just the week before and give themselves a small bright spot in an otherwise black season.

But it wasn't to be, the score 1-1 at half time before Maroons hero Des Hughes finished the tie with a Golden Goal.

They've managed just 16 goals so far, albeit a couple of spectacular ones with the most notable a thirty yard rocket from Brad Ditton in one of the early rounds.

But of far more concern is the 35 times keeper Chris Roche has had to pick to ball out of the net and, on the balance of form, you would expect him to have to do it a couple more times this weekend.

However, City stuttered somewhat in their last Premier League encounter, looking like a side who knew they didn't really need to win.

The league leaders scraped a seat-of-the-pants 3-3 home draw against Mt Gravatt, a result they scarcely deserved.

They played the Gap on Wednesday night in the Cup and, with former XXXX League stars like their own former favorite Cameron Pearse in the opposition lineup, one would expect they will not find it easy to bounce back after what was surely a bruising encounter.

But City have scored just one goal less than Beenleigh have conceded, Chris Slater is scoring at will and, even if he doesn't find the net, they also have the best defensive record in the league.

Nothing but the biggest upset of the season would see Beenleigh trouble the visiting City but, with nothing to lose, the hosts may cause them more trouble than many expect.

Bundaberg promised plenty in their inaugural season in the state's top competition last year and many astute judges expected to see them challenge for a semi finals berth at the very least this time around.

But Aldo Baretta's side have struggled to make a significant impact on the league with just Wynnum and Beenleigh below them on the table.

They have struggled to score and have also conceded plenty of goals but the recent addition of Andrew Packer and Royce Brownlie to their squad via the Strikers in recent weeks has began to pay dividends.

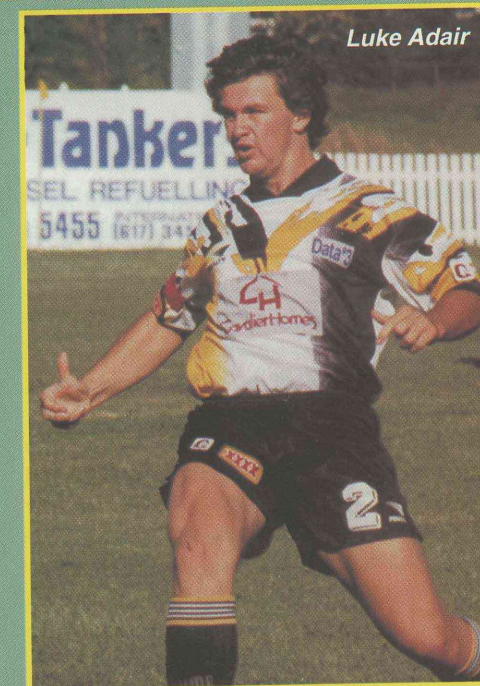
With just three wins and a draw from 12 matches the Wolves are currently just four points clear of the league's cellar dwellers Beenleigh.

### Defence key to Gap's confidence

The Gap coach Mauro Saftich is confident his side can turn the tables on Mitchelton this week, when the two sides clash at the Walton Bridge Reserve.

Mitchelton easily won the first encounter between the two sides back in the first round of the competition, but Saftich believes his players have learned plenty of lessons since then.

"They thumped us in the first round," The Gap coach said. "They played some very good football during that game and we played very poorly, and I'm confident we can only improve on that performance.

"They've also been running a bit hot and cold recently so I think we may just have the edge on them this time round."

But the same could be said about Saftich's team at the moment. The Gap promised much in the pre-season, but have only delivered on several occasions this year.

Last week's 2-2 draw with Grange Thistle, indicative of the side's topsy-turvy season, although Saftich believes otherwise.

"That result against Grange was a little disappointing, and although I'm not going to offer any excuses for the performance, it was clear many of the players just weren't interested in the game," Saftich said.

"That's not to take any credit away from The Grange though. They came out very enthusiastically and were probably a little unlucky not to come away with a win."

Saftich said the key to winning this weekend against Mitchelton lay with his side's defence.

"We let two very soft goals in against Mitchy last time, partly due to our keeper and partly because of some poor defence.

"I think we can win if we keep things tight at the back this weekend," The Gap coach said.

### Easts revel in extra games

Eastern Suburbs are hoping to put an end to a fairly average patch in their 1998 season, when they take on the much improved University of Queensland outfit at Heath Park this weekend.

Easts have had a tough few weeks with draws against Newmarket and Mitchelton and a Queensland Cup loss to southern counterparts Capalaba.

And Tigers coach Jim Quinn is hoping his side can turn the tables this weekend against University.

"We have had a tough run recently but I think it's been character building for the side," Quinn said.

"After having such a strong start to the season, it's obvious that teams are beginning to really lift when they meet us, so most of our games are extremely tough.

"But I think the lads are getting used to it and starting to lift themselves accordingly, each week."

### Creek in need of consistency

Albany Creek coach Justin Kilshaw is looking for some consistency from his side when they take on young guns North Star this weekend.

After a shocking start to their semi-pro campaign, the Creek have fought back to be in the top four of the competition, and the coach is extremely pleased with his side's efforts.

"It's a much different outfit to the one that went round at the start of the competition," Kilshaw said.

"There's a lot more desire in the camp and a bit of self-belief amongst the players.

"The boys know they can compete with any side in the competition and that's exactly what they're doing... going out there and competing."

And that's been showing in the side's second round results. A couple of resounding wins over Mitchelton and several other prize victories have lifted Kilshaw's outfit into the top four, a position where he wants to remain for the duration of the season.

"Apart from a minor hiccup against Uni a couple of weeks ago, we've had a fantastic second round," the Albany Creek coach said.

"Our main aim has been to compete against teams where we failed to do so in the first round, and so far, except for the Uni game, we've been doing that."

Kilshaw said North Star was another side to whom his team had a point to prove, following a lacklustre first round performance.

"They were another side we didn't do too well against in the first round, so it's important I think that we go out and compete well against them this weekend," Kilshaw said.

"There's a big difference in our side now from when we last met North Star, and I think we'll shock them this time round".

### Thistle lads at last combining

Three good results in the space of a week has restored some confidence in the struggling Grange Thistle outfit.

Thistle are currently languishing at the bottom of the semi-pro south ladder, but their results over the past week or so would seem to indicate otherwise.

"We've managed to put the same team on the park for the last four weeks or so and I think that has had a big bearing on our latest results."

"The combination that we've found over that time has been doing the job for us and I think it would be a mistake to make too many changes."

The Thistle coach said the same side would again take the field this weekend against a Newmarket team which has forged some encouraging results of their own in recent weeks, and is coming off a tough Queensland Cup encounter with the Wynnum Wolves.

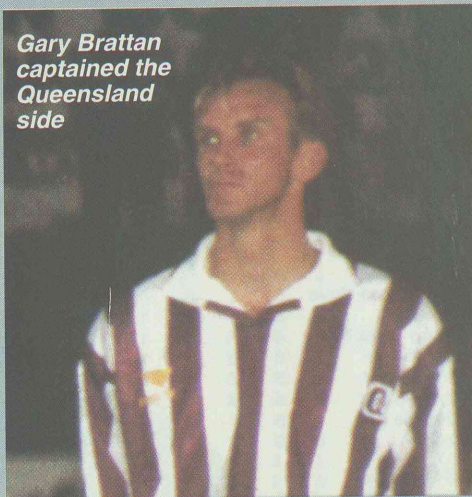
Auckland left New Zealand's shores with a good mix of youth and experience but with only 14 players after several pulled out of the touring party with work commitments.

Hughes beat three defenders along the edge of the area before swerving past a fourth to set up Koch with a delicately timed cross.

Koch almost made it 3-0 for the Maroons, but a long range shot was denied by a brilliant diving save from Auckland keeper Ross Nicholson.

Auckland had two great chances in the match to crack the Queensland defence.

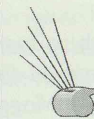
The first came from a mistake from Queensland defender Damian Harris who attempted a pass across his own goalface which was intercepted by Auckland's Robbie Clark.
