Unfortunately, a couple of things that have marred the superb coverage of France '98.

Most significant is the unnecessary violence off the field, which reports say, is primarily caused by English supporters.

In any case, the local and national media are to be congratulated on their current commitment to our game.

On the local scene, there's been more coaching movements in the Semi-Pro South division, with Souths United's Matt Carson stepping down from the top coaching position.

Matt tendered his resignation last week, with the decision really coming as no surprise to those following the competition.

Matt's coaching credentials preceed him and it would be a brave person to question his ability, however results indicate he wasn't getting the best out of his players.

Over the past couple of months, Souths were fast gaining the unenviable tag of "the draw specialists", and although they have consistently stolen the odd point from some of the better sides in the competition, it hasn't been enough to take them into finals contention.

After so many frustrating results, I for one wasn't surprised to see Carson stand down from his position.

In his place is former Eastern Suburbs XXXX League coach Walter Oldenburg, who has been coaching the reserves at Souths this season.

The word from Wakerley Park is that Oldenburg will continue coaching both the first grade and reserve grade sides, and I wish him all the best in those endeavours.

## Wynnum Wolves win again

Round 16 of the XXXX Premier League provided some extremely interesting results, with Wynnum once again at the centre of the week's big news.

In round 15 it was the mighty Brisbane Lions that fell victim to a tenacious Wolves outfit.

Last week, cross-town giants Rochedale Rovers were surprised when Nick Hadland scored what proved to be the winner for the Wolves six minutes into the second half.

Midfield dynamo Ben Wood made a surging run down the middle of the field before unselfishly unloading to an unmarked Hadland who coolly side-footed the winner past Rochedale keeper Elvis Guzic.

The win has taken Wynnum to 17 points on the ladder and has given the club an outside chance of making the finals.

Peter Tokesi has got the Wynnum lads firing on all cylinders and on recent form, must be considered a good bet of upstaging Taringa Rovers at Jack Speare Park.

Rochedale coach Peter Bannon said he was frustrated by the loss and pointed to his side's conversion rate as an area of concern.

Brisbane Lions returned to the winner's circle with a comprehensive 3-0 drubbing of arch-rivals Taringa Rovers.

Marc Brockwell scored a brace while Greg Di-Losa completed the rout.

The win has moved Lions to within one point of Taringa and coach Miron Bleiberg said the victory was the result of a desperate situation.

"We knew before the match that we could not afford any more losses if we were serious about the premiership," Bleiberg said.

"We didn't play great soccer and I was a little disappointed with the game from the football side of it.

"However, I believe that we are still in the race for the premiership which we regard very highly and a lot will hinge on the game against City this weekend."

League leaders Brisbane City ground their way to a 3-1 win over the Gold Coast at Nerang.

The match was locked at 1-1 at half-time. but City showed their class and secured the three points with two second half goals.

Chris Slater, Warren Cooley and Shane Haddow each netted a goal for City, while Troy Greenwood scored the Coast's only goal.

The Ipswich Knights continued their recent good form with a 3-0 over the Bundaberg Waves at the Thabeban Sports Complex.

Kevin Meacock, Kasey Wehrman and Nick Seeley each scored for the Knights.

Ipswich have moved quietly into fifth (on goal difference) place on the league ladder and appear to have got their game together at the right end of the season.

In the final match of the round, Beenleigh won their third game of the season, defeating Mt Gravatt 3-2 at Chris Green Park; the Marc Lederhose penalty being the difference.

#### PREMIER PREVIEW - Rochedale Rov v Beenleigh

Rochedale Rovers will be looking to get back into their winning stride this weekend against Beenleigh.

Rochedale's shock loss to Wynnum last week has put them 16 points behind runaway league leaders Brisbane City.

And while Rovers are still a chance of winning the premiership, coach Peter Bannon admitted his side were at long odds for the title.

"You never like giving in before its mathematically impossible, but in reality, it's a big ask," he said.

Bannon said last week's loss to Wynnum had een typical of many of Rochedale's games.

"We dominated the match for long periods but failed to convert our opportunities," he said.

"It was a combination of poor passing, poor crossing and generally poor decision-making.

"For the amount of possession that we had, we should be able to knock a couple of decent balls into the box.

"Too often the chances were squandered as the ball hit defenders or flew out behind the goal.

"It's very frustrating that the players work so hard to get themselves into a scoring position and then don't capitalise on those opportunities."

Beenleigh recorded their third win of the season last weekend when they downed Mt Gravatt 3-2.


It was a game that Beenleigh was probably not expected to win, but the three points will be welcomed by many at Chris Green Park.

Bannon said despite the two sides being poles apart on the league ladder, he was expecting stiff opposition from Beenleigh.

"I'm sure they'll be fired up after their win last week and we need to get back on track with a win," Bannon said.

"I watched them play against Mt Gravatt last week and they did quite well."

The game is a local derby of sorts and should be quite exciting. Brad Ditton plays for the first time against his former club and if both teams play to the form guide, Rochedale will prove too strong.

### PREMIER PREVIEW - MT GRAVATT V BUNDADERG

Mt Gravatt hosts Bundaberg Waves at Dittmer Park on Saturday evening, with both teams desperate for points.

Mt Gravatt is in 6th place on the league ladder on 17 points, while Bundaberg is four behind in 9th place.

With two-thirds of season over, both teams have some ground to make up on Rochedale Rovers and the Ipswich Knights who are currently vying for fourth spot on 25 points.

Mt Gravatt is following on the back of a disappointing 3-2 loss against the Knights last weekend.

However, according to new coach Danny Cox, there were some positives to take from the match.

Cox said he was expecting a tough game from Bundaberg and was hopeful of securing three vital league points.


"They're (Bundy) a good side and I'm quite impressed with their style of play," he said.

### PREMIER PREVIEW - TARINGA ROVERS V WYNNUM

Another good match on the weekend sees Taringa Rovers hosting the in-form Wynnum Wolves.

Wynnum has surged into equal 6th place on the league ladder after pulling off two upset victories against more fancied opposition in consecutive weeks.

The club's 2-0 win over Brisbane Lions in round 15 surprised many local fans.

But that surprise turned to amazement on the weekend as the Wolves served a 1-0 defeat up to fourth placed Rochedale.

"If we can win and Lions manage to beat City, it will make the competition a little more interesting," he said.


"We play City in a couple of weeks and a win then could open the whole league up again.

Nickia's family have a long association with Newmarket Soccer Club.


Her brother Lloyd has been a player at the club for 14 years and currently plays with the reserve grade side.

"Over the next few weeks, we play Lions, Wynnum, Taringa and Rochedale," he said.


"If we can get some good results and get ourselves into a positive position by the end of that time. I think we will be difficult to catch.

## Lessons learned | Campbell to from local derby

Capalaba coach Alan Prentice is confident his side will learn from last Saturday night's 2-2 draw with close neighbours Redlands.

The Raiders were too good for Rocklea in the first round of the competition, downing them 2-0 at Dunn Road.


But Scott believes this weekend's match will be a totally different ball game, with so much at stake for the Rocklea outfit.

## BEFORE THE WHISTLE

Last Saturday night Redlands United celebrated their 80th anniversary with a gala day of activities culminating in the local derby against near neighbours Capalaba.

Redlands United was founded in 1918 with a mere handful of players compared to their current membership of in excess of 2,500 from Rooball to their over 35's!

The club waited till they were drawn at home against close rivals Capalaba to organise a huge day of activities which included junior fixtures and "non-fixtures", plenty of amusements for the ankle biters, including the jumping castle. A skydiver dropped in prior to the main match and such was his accuracy that he landed almost plum on the centre spot.

A fireworks display then took place with the main match then kicking off in front of, what would have to be the largest crowd that I have seen at a Semi Pro match in many, many years. At its peak I would estimate there would have been approximately 700 people in and around the grounds, this, quite naturally, included the many children that were there to participate in the many activities. I cannot speak highly enough of how impressed I and many other people I spoke to, were of the atmosphere generated by such a large and extremely enthusiastic crowd.

The main match fully lived up to expectations and with the conditions as cool as they were, the match was played at the proverbial "hundred miles an hour", but there was plenty of skill, and, due to their higher standing, it wasn't unduly unsurprising when the visitors took the lead and tended to dominate the first half to the extent that at half time the score was Capalaba 2 - Redlands 0.

What a contrast the second half was, Redlands came out full of fire, particularly determined to do well in front of the largest crowd they'll ever play in front of, and what a difference it made when they pulled one goal back and had Capalaba on the back foot. 
# Milestone for QSF's Trish

Predictions of Rochedale's sudden push for league dominance may also have been a bit off the mark.


Wynnum hit another high in their topsyturvy season with a tight win over Rochedale at home at the weekend.

Koch and Jackson are likely to be integral parts of their XXXX League sides for the remainder of this season.


Expect to see both players giving a little bit extra as the season climaxes.


On other matters it seems there has been another coaching casualty in Brisbane with the resignation of Souths United coach, Matt Carson.
