City - Home and hosed

Brisbane City, short of an unthinkable "choke", all but secured the league championship last weekend with their 1-0 win over the Ipswich Knights.

Danny Wright's first half volley, which was described by coach Bobby Hamilton as one of the goals of the season, ensured the three points for the sky blues.

The win has taken City to 50 points, 11 clear of closest rival Brisbane Lions.

Hamilton said the win would make it difficult for opposition teams to bridge the gap with just six rounds remaining.

"We knew if Ipswich beat us that the difference would only be seven points so that served as a good motivator," he said.

"It was game of two halves as we played some excellent football in the first half and could have easily been three or four goals up at the break if it wasn't for the framework.

"However, after half time, they came out and had a real go at us and if it wasn't for a couple of spectacular saves from Daniel Duke, they could have salvaged something from the match."

Ipswich coach Mike Mulvey echoed Hamilton's views on the match.

"If we were four-nil down at the break, I couldn't have complained," he said.

"But as bad as we were in the first half, we were as good in the second period and the guys realise that if we can repeat that performance we'll be there when the whips are cracking."

At Underwood Park, Rochedale Rovers moved into fourth place on the ladder with a strong 3-0 win against the Gold Coast.

Two goals to Clayton Koch, one of which was a penalty and a goal to Michael Legg kept the Rochedale faithful happy.

Rovers coach Peter Bannon said the result was very pleasing and was looking forward to more of the same in the weeks ahead.

"It was a fairly consistent performance from the lads for the full ninety minutes both in defence and attack," he said.

"The Gold Coast had a glut of possession at one stage and they didn't make it easy for us."

Taringa Rovers also moved up the ladder last week to third spot after defeating Mt Gravatt 3-1.

Locked at 0-0 at break, Taringa burst out of the tunnel in the second half and were 2-0 up after only 10 minutes.

Richard Hilli, Steve Dawes and Cliff Tuck all scored for the home side while Stuart Collins scored Mt Gravatt's only goal.

After experiencing some unexpected losses in recent weeks, Wynnum got back into the winner's circle against Beenleigh at Carmichael Park.

The 1-0 scoreline was courtesy of an own goal but rest assured Peter Tokesi will not be lamenting about that fact.

In the final match of the round, Brisbane Lions took the points from the Bundaberg Waves 2-1 at Lions Stadium.

Darren Hillier and Roy Huth scored for Lions while Greg Thomas netted for the visitors.

Waves coach Aldo Baretta said he believed his side matched Lions in most department's and did enough to take something from the game.

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PREMIER PREVIEW - BUNDABERG v WYNNUM DIST

The Bundaberg Waves will host the Wynnum Wolves in a repeat of the two sides' recent clash in the Queensland Cup.

Waves proved too strong on that occasion, downing the visiting Wolves 2-0.

It was a double blow for Wynnum as the match also served as a catch-up league match and the loss put paid to the finals aspirations of the Peter Tokesi led outfit.

Towards the end of the second round and at the beginning of the third round Wynnum was lauded for their efforts against the likes of Lions, Rochedale, Taringa and City.

However, the side's last three games have yielded just one win and there is no doubt that Peter Tokesi will be out to gain maximum points from this match.

But the Wolves have got the odds stacked against them, as they are yet to beat Bundaberg this season.

Waves coach Aldo Baretta said while this was encouraging, he was reticent to underestimate Wynnum.

"Obviously we should be confident going into this match as we've played well against them (Wynnum) all season," he said.

"But they've proved against the top teams in the competition that they are able to play good football so we can't take them for granted.

"They're a quality side on the same points as us and we're going to have to make sure that all our chances count.

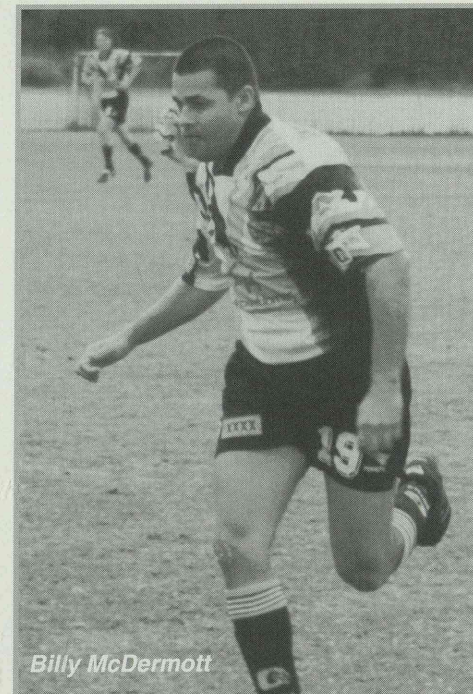
"Playing at home is an advantage and I think we can come away with the three points."

Waves produced another strong performance last week against second placed Brisbane Lions, narrowly losing 2-1.

Lions went into the half-time break holding a 1-0 lead but Baretta thought his side did enough in the second half to take some points.

"It was a close game in the end and I thought we might have deserved a draw," he said.

"The state of the pitch wasn't great and even though it didn't suit our style of play, we didn't adapt to the conditions very well."

PREMIER PREVIEW - MT GRAVATT v BRISBANE CITY

League leaders Brisbane City travel to Dittmer Park on Sunday for the clash with Mt Gravatt.

With just six rounds of the regular season remaining, City is at short odds to win this year's premiership.

The side's 1-0 win at home against the Ipswich Knights last week ensured its lead extended to 11 points.

Brisbane Lions moved into second position with a win over the Bundaberg Waves, while Taringa is lurking a point behind on 38 points.

The Knights and Rochedale are tied for fourth on 37 points.

City coach Bobby Hamilton said he was pleased that his players had once again been able to complete the job at hand.

"I was very happy with the result because every time we can win at this stage of the season, it makes it just that little bit more difficult for the pack to catch us," he said.

Even though Mt Gravatt is out of contention for this year's finals series, Hamilton said he was expecting a tough match.

"I believe the condition of the ground is going to prove as difficult a problem as the opposition," the City coach said.

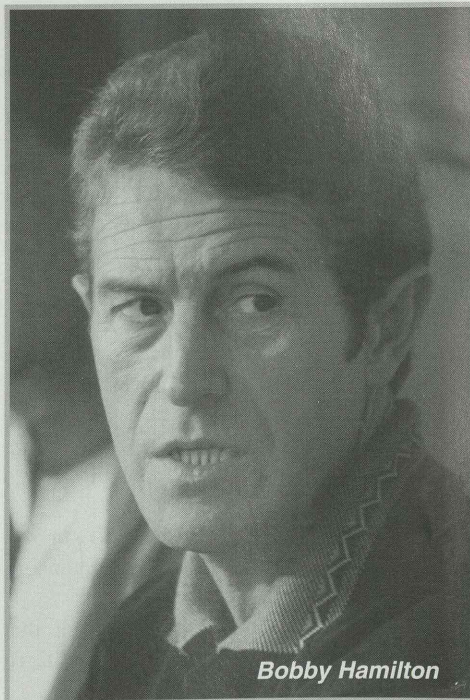
"We're well positioned on the table and have a superior goal difference to the teams that are chasing us so I'll be more than pleased with a one-nil result."

Hamilton said some of the City players were still suffering the effects of knocks obtained during the Knights clash, with veteran striker Danny Wright the most doubtful this weekend.

Mt Gravatt coach Danny Cox said he was looking forward to the clash with the league's top guns.

"City are not on the top of the league because of luck and it's certainly going to be a good test for our guys," Cox said.

"Unfortunately, we'll be without Wayne Knipe as he has gone back to the Strikers and Trevor Evans might be suspended due to an accumulation of points."

PREMIER PREVIEW - BEENLEIGH v TARINGA ROVERS

"Wooden Spooners" Beenleigh face a tough prospect at home when they host third placed Taringa Rovers on Saturday evening.

Taringa moved back into the top four last week thanks to a 3-1 win over Mt Gravatt last week.

Locked at 0-0 at the break, Taringa buried Mt Gravatt's hopes of an upset with two quick goals 10 minutes into the second half.

With Rochedale and Ipswich playing off on Sunday, Taringa has a chance to cement a spot in the top four.

A win could put the John Ogden coached side four points clear of fifth place, although the coach said it was important to guard against complacency.

"On paper we should win it, but that's not what it's about and we'll have to go there and put in a good performance to make sure we get the result we're after," Ogden said.

"We certainly won't be taking them (Beenleigh) easy as last time we only got home one-nil.

"At this stage of the season, it's vital that we keep winning as every point is so important."

Taringa skipper Demetri Theochari returned to the field last week and according to Ogden, was probably the best player on the field.

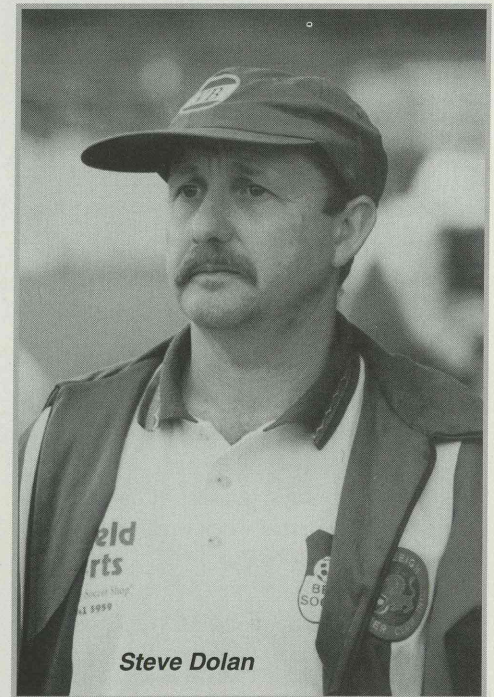
Danny Britton has returned to the centre of midfield for Rovers after an extended lay-off and Steve Dawes is on his way back after injury.

Ogden said he was delighted that club was almost back to full strength as it promoted healthy competition amongst the players that translated into strong performances on the field.

Beenleigh coach Steve Dolan said the beleaguered outfit would be taking the remaining games one at a time.

"We're not having a lot of luck at the moment, but that is usually the way it goes when you're down at the bottom end of the table," Dolan said.

"Taringa have not got to where they are because of luck and we'll just have to battle on and give a good account of ourselves."

PREMIER PREVIEW - Gold Coast City v Brisbane Lions

The Gold Coast host league giants Brisbane Lions at Glennon Park Nerang on Sunday afternoon.

On paper second placed Lions (39 points) should be too strong for 9th placed Gold Coast (21 points).

However, head to head this season, the score is one-all. The Gold Coast sprung one of the first major upsets of the season in round 4 when they beat Lions 1-0.

In round 13, Lions came back from 2-1 down with five minutes to go, to win 3-2.

Lions coach Miron Bleiberg said his side could not afford to be complacent on the strength of those games.

"In a lot of ways, the Gold Coast are a lot like Bundaberg in that when we play them they perform much better than what their position on the table would suggest," he said.

"We enjoyed quite a bit of luck when we beat them the second time round and they played very well that day.

"But I still believe we are a better team and I don't think I'm being over confident when I say that we should beat them."

Bleiberg said last week's win against Waves was very pleasing as it had moved the club into outright second on the league ladder.

"Over the last couple of weeks, I've expected Rochedale, Taringa and Ipswich to perform a little better than they have, but they haven't and so now we find ourselves behind City," he said.

"I thought we played very well against Bundaberg and were in full control of the game.

"It was a great all-round performance by the team and no-one really stood out.

"If you look at the top ten scorers in the league, not one Lions player is in the list despite the fact that we have the second best goals for column behind City.

"That's testament to the fact that everyone works for each other and its a team effort."

PREMIER PREVIEW - Ipswich Knights v Rochedale Rov

The Ipswich Knights will host Rochedale Rovers in the match of the Round at Eric Evans Reserve on Sunday.

This is a crucial match for both sides as they look to cement a place in the top four.

The Knights glory run of six straight wins has come to an abrupt end in recent weeks with consecutive losses to Taringa Rovers and Brisbane City.

Coach Mike Mulvey said he would be looking to correct that trend against Rochedale.

"In two matches we've gone from the penthouse to the cellar and it's certainly no fun being in fifth place," Mulvey said.

"Losing is never nice, I don't like it and the lads are really hurting and I think that will be enough to get them focussed on the game."

The Knights proved too strong for Rochedale a few weeks ago in a catch-up match and Mulvey said his side intended taking the game to the visitors.

"We beat Rochedale one-nil three weeks ago and played so well that even some of the hardened Rochedale fans said we were the best team they had played all season," Mulvey said.

"The difference is instead of playing for outright second, we're competing for fourth."

Ipswich plays four of its last six games at home and Mulvey said it should prove advantageous in the quest for a finals berth.

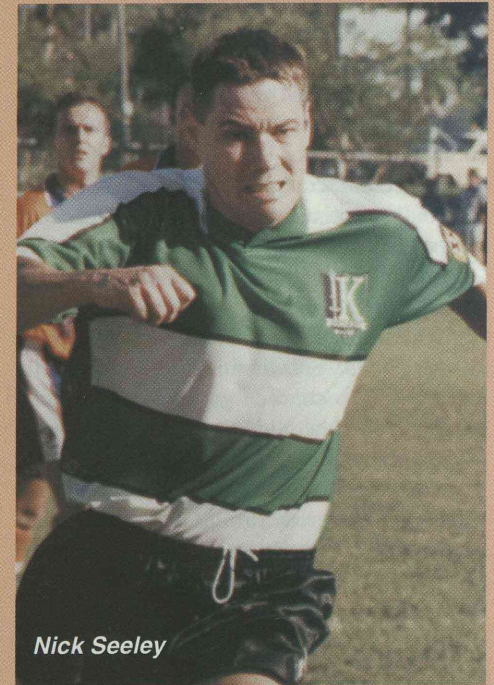
Rochedale coach Peter Bannon was surprisingly relaxed about big clash.

Wing back Duncan Bedford broke down the left side, cut cleverly inside and drove a left foot shot into the back of the net.

Rocklea almost conceded another goal one minute later when David Knight headed to Gareth Stevens but the keeper managed to parry with his feet.

Ben Healan and Dean Weatherall combined in the 62nd minute to send the score to 3-0.

The reserve fixture saw Souths down the Rocklea side 2-1. Goals to Lee Kool and Ryan Lonergan will see Souths consolidate their third spot on the ladder.

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Redlands celebrate milestone

The Redlands United Soccer Club celebrates its 80th anniversary this year.

The club was originally founded under the name of "Cleveland Rovers" back in 1918, with its home ground located opposite the Grand View Hotel in the now Raby Bay development.

The term "Rovers" emanated from the huge distances that players had to travel to get a game, with players coming from as far as Redland Bay in the south and Wellington Point in the east.

1922 saw the renamed Redlands United Football Club finish runners up in the B division.

However, it was only some 12 months later before the fledgling club placed its hands on its first bit of silverware, winning both the second grade premiership as well as the Herald and Nissen Cup competition.

The club relocated to the Cleveland Point grounds, the current site of the Cleveland Point boat ramp and the Air Sea Rescue where it

remained until 1970 before moving to its current location at the Redlands Showground complex.

January 28, 1973 saw the opening of the new clubhouse and the club was promoted to the first division in 1976.

During the next two decades, the club experienced mixed results enjoying the highs of winning the grand final and the lows of relegation in men's, women's and junior's.

In July, 1997, the new changing room facility was opened adjacent to the present clubhouse which provided the club with facilities equal to any in Brisbane.

In 1998, we have seen the construction of the new dugouts, the additional training field, and an upgrade in lighting facilities.

Some of the additional projects on the drawing board include upgrading the car parking area, the refurbishment of the clubhouse and the lighting of the school oval.

Rivers dream a step closer

Semi-pro north quiet achievers Pine Rivers have moved a step closer to securing a top four berth following an emphatic 4-0 victory over The Gap.

It was a very satisfying win for Frank Pimblett's side, after The Gap took the points away from them at Wendy Alison Park in the first round.

But apart from the personal satisfaction, the victory has also pushed the side into fourth place on the ladder, equal on points with Mitchelton but ahead on goal difference.

Both teams are on 26 points, however Rivers are plus four on goal difference as compared to Mitchelton's minus one.

Breathing down their necks is The Gap on 25 points, with the loss to Rivers also sending their goal difference into the negatives.

Rivers have a real chance to consolidate their top four position this weekend, when they travel to Grange Thistle.

Pimblett's side has had a good record against Grange this year, although credit must be given to the young Thistle outfit, which under coach Paddy Higgins, has improved in leaps and bounds over the current season.

A 2-0 Cup loss to Redlands last weekend has been one of Thistle's few blemishes in recent weeks, and with North Star and Newmarket just one point behind them on the table, the possibility of the wooden spoon still looms large.

However, even though they are ten points out of the four there are still seven rounds remaining, giving Thistle a slight chance of pushing for a semi-finals berth.

Victories against sides like Rivers will now count for six points rather than three.

Creek search for Uni revenge

Albany Creek will be chasing their first point against the University of Queensland when the two sides meet this weekend.

Albany Creek are yet to take a point off the students, and have not even scored a goal against them on the two occasions they have already met.

But Creek coach Justin Kilshaw is confident of changing that in front of the club's home fans this weekend.

"The first time we met Uni, I think we put in the worst performance that I have ever seen from an Albany Creek side," Kilshaw said.

"The second time we just weren't on our game. But full credit to Uni, they've scored three times against us in 180 minutes of football and we haven't cracked their defence once.

"And that's what's on the minds of our players at the moment. They've been looking forward to this match ever since our second round loss to Uni."

Kilshaw said the motivation was also there for his side to hold down the all important second spot on the ladder.

"Uni are breathing down our necks at the moment and if we lose to them this weekend, they'll move back into second spot," the Albany Creek coach said.

"It's probably a bit early to suggest that this game will decide the team that finishes second on the ladder, but it will certainly go a long way to finalising it.

"For us it is important we get a win, to establish a psychological blow prior to the semi's.

"We need to show Uni that we can beat them, just as we've shown every other team in the competition."

The Gap Gators will be looking for a much more committed effort all round, when they take on the resurging Newmarket this weekend.

With all the hype and media interest of late about the World Cup and its length, I must agree that four weeks of football is a pretty long time for any tournament, even the World Cup! He was particularly high in his praise of Shane Haddow. "Shaddow" has long been one of the league's most enigmatic players.

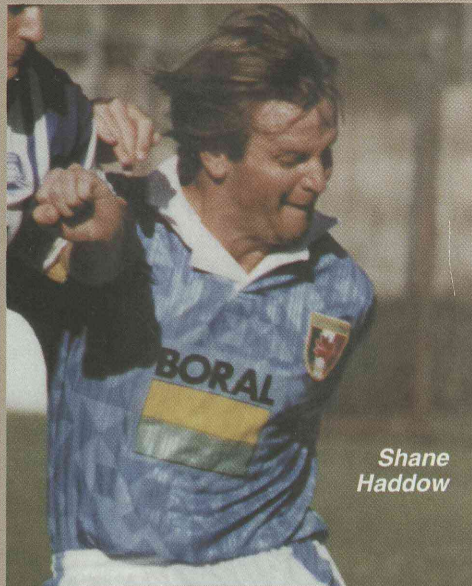
On his day, he's capable of destroying any side in the league. The only criticism over Shane probably surrounds his motivation.

Book them in for a finals berth and draw straws to fill the remaining places.

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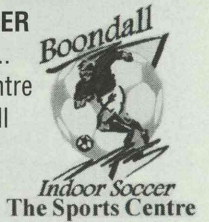


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
