You have a 'star team' rather than a 'team of stars' - that's what we set out to achieve at the Strikers a few months ago and I think we are on the right path at present.

Strikers face in-form Carlton

The Brisbane Strikers will want to continue their encouraging early season form when they host last season's grand finalists Carlton tonight.

Carlton had an impressive first season in the Ericsson Cup and surprised many pundits when they made it all the way to the championship decider.

And even though South Melbourne spoiled what would have been a fairytale story, Carlton have emerged as one of the powerhouses of the league.

This season, Carlton's good form has continued with two strong performances and eight goals in as many games.

Last season, Carlton got the better of the Strikers 1-0 when they visited Brisbane but Strikers Coach John Kosmina believes it could be a different story after 90 minutes this evening.

"It's a little difficult to say what they'll be like as they've had a change in some of their personnel this season," Kosmina said.

"When they came to Newcastle last season, to be honest, I thought we should have beaten them

"But they've (Carlton) had two great wins already this season and are obviously in some good form.

"They hold their shape well and are committed to going forward with pace."

Midfielder Vince Grella and forward Andy Vlahos are sure to be keenly watched by the Strikers defence but Kosmina pointed to another two likely match winners.

"Andy Marth has looked dangerous with his surges forward from midfield and I've heard some good reports about their imported striker Alex Moriera," Kosmina said.

"But they're a strong side right across the park and our guys will have to be on their game to take maximum points."

Last week against League hotshots, Perth Glory, the Strikers looked set for a memorable victory with just ten minutes to go.

In the first half, flanker Sean Cranney put the home side a goal ahead with a fine effort.

And in the second half Jeromy Harris, playing in the unaccustomed role of stopper

put the home side a further goal ahead and what appeared to be an unassailable lead.

However, with the game seemingly over, Perth stole a point with a goal each to Bobby Despotovski and Con Boutsianis.

Kosmina said to lose from such a commanding position was difficult to accept.


"It was very difficult for everyone associated with Strikers... the players, the staff, the support crew and the spectators," he said.

"We seemed to lose our shape when we got two goals ahead and the guys relaxed a little too much.

"It was a good lesson for us that the game is not over until the final whistle goes and I think the players will be better for the experience."

Captain Glenn Gwynne returns from injury this week and that can only enhance the side's defence.

Reece Tollenaere is under an injury cloud with an ankle problem, as is Craig Williams who is suffering from a groin strain.

The Carlton Story

Professionalism. The cure to the continuing major problem of A-league: the continuing exodus of our best plavers overseas. Currently there are over 100 Australian players making a living from playing the game they love throughout Europe, Asia and South America. At the 1995 Australian Soccer Summit, incoming Soccer Australia boss David Hill presented a 24-point masterplan, which included that "significant increases in full time professional opportunities for Australian footballers need to be introduced". And in 1997 a five year plan was endorsed by Soccer Australia - proposing that all A-league clubs become fully professional by 2002.

Enter the Carlton Soccer Club. Carlton promised a fresh approach - full time players and a full time coach to supplement a professional administration team.

Carlton signed as club coach Eddie Krncevic, an experienced Australian born and bred footballer who played from 1981 to 1996 in Europe with clubs Dinamo Zagreb (Croatia), Anderlecht, Liege, Aalst and Charleroi (Belgium), Mulhouse (France) and Duisberg (Germany). Commencing training in mid-1997, a new squad that included John Markovski, Alan Hunter, Robert Trajkovski and 1996/97 NSL player of the year Kresimir Marusic were training full-time. The club also unveiled some rather outstanding prospects in throughout their first season, including Simon Colosimo and Michael Bresciano. Other youngsters Vince Grella and Andrew Vlahos matured greatly after being

bought to Carlton from other NSL clubs.


Carlton stunned the established soccer fraternity by not losing any of their first seven NSL games, finishing the regular season in second place, and then reaching the grand final. It was the first time in any major national football code in Australia had made the grand final at their first attempt. And it was only a dubious conceded goal in the last ten minutes that denied the team any chance of grand final glory, losing out 2-1 to South Melbourne.

Although Markovski, Hunter, Trajkovski and Marusic left the club in 1998, Carlton had a quite formidable albeit younger squad in 1998/99, although to supplement this talent the club did sign experienced NSL hard man Andrew Marth in mid-1998 to form another strong line-up in their second year.

Another highly regarded aspect of the club was the adoption of an official 'feeder club' system, where clubs throughout Victoria were adopted by Carlton even before they had played their first NSL game. And in the 1998/ 99 pre-season trials Carlton travelled to play other Victorian teams, incorporating youth training camps, which has established congenial relations with other Victorian clubs.

Although the element of surprise has waned in this, their second season, there is no doubting that Carlton boasts one of the most promising line-ups in the NSL. Competent players, coaching and the general day-to-day operations of this Australian soccer club can only lead to continued success.

It seems like Craig Williams has been around for an eternity. At 32, he is nearing the end of his playing career, but obviously still has a lot to offer the game and fans in Brisbane.

His peers regard Williams as a superb "reader" of the game. And while the years might have slowed the legs a little, the mind remains as sharp as ever.

At present, Williams is a vital cog in the defensive ranks of the Strikers. Along with captain Glenn Gwynne and young gun Steven Laybutt, "Willo" as he is known, forms one of the league's most underrated central defences.

And if early season form is anything to go by, the Strikers will once again be well served in season 1998-99 by the evergreen Williams

Williams was born in the Sydney suburb of Wahronga on June 6, 1966.

Craig

At four years of age, Craig's love affair with the world game began when he became an integral member of the under six Carlingford Redbacks side.

"Mum reckons as soon as I could walk, I was always kicking a ball around," he said.

"Up until the age of 15, I was playing Inter-District Tennis five or six times a week and attending soccer training five times a week.

"Something had to give and I had to make a choice as to which sport I was going to

"Soccer has always been my first sporting love so I suppose it was a fairly straight forward decision in the end."

Craig was a regular member of New South Wales State teams as a teenager, before joining National League side Parramatta Eagles.

Williams made his debut in the National League in 1989 and has played 141 games and scored a solitary league goal.

In 1991, a change of scenery beckoned and Williams made the move north to link with

fledgling NSL club Brisbane United

The early days in Brisbane were certainly tough, but Williams stuck with Brisbane and except for a brief stint with Singapore side Tampines Rovers in 1996, has been with the club ever since.


"I was given the opportunity to play over there and thought it would be a great experience," Williams said.

"I did enjoy my time.... (but) I'm glad I decided to return home.

"Winning the Grand Final in front of 40,000 plus fans was the most unbelievable experience and I feel very privileged to have been one of the players involved.

"All the hype leading up to the game, the police escort to the ground and the two to three weeks of celebration after our victory was something to behold."

The Strikers seemed to have turned their poor form of last season around this year, with a win, a draw and a narrow loss from their first three outings.

A DIFFERENT View

Watching the Brisbane Strikers on Saturday night, two things became patently obvious.

One, Kasey Wehrman is a class act, the likes of which we haven't seen in Brisbane for quite some time.

Two, if the Strikers are to make the finals, they are going to need Glen Gwynne back on the park.

It's doubtful if there is a team in the competition that relies on two players as much as the Strikers do on those two.

There's little doubt his future is overseas.

Gwynne has been the Strikers rock for several years now. If he's on the park on Saturday night, the Strikers win the game.

You couldn't see the club panicking and

throwing away a two goal lead with him at the back.

Gywnne is a phlegmatic character. A country boy with an even temperament. He never seems to lose his cool.

The Strikers are going to battle to score goals this season. Saturday night showed that. Their forwards rarely looked dangerous and are having trouble getting their names on the scoresheet.

The club's leading scorer is Jeremy Harris, who played at the back at the weekend.

With that in mind, the Strikers need a Gwynne-led defence to restrict their opposition's chances.

You can see them winning plenty of 1-0 and 2-1 games this season.




