

Strikers face United front

The Brisbane Strikers host the highly fancied Sydney United outfit in tonight's big clash at Suncorp Stadium.

There is no doubt that it will be a tough match for the home side as Kossie's men look to get maximum points from the match and move into double points on the league ladder.

Sydney United is currently in fifth place on 16 points and will no doubt be looking to cement a playoff spot with the likes of Adelaide City, Sydney Olympic and the Adelaide Sharks just a couple points in arrears.

United scored maximum points from last round's clash with the Northern Spirit, winning 1-0 at home. The 38th minute goal to young striking sensation Mile Sterjovski proved the difference between the two sides on the day.

Meanwhile the Strikers find themselves in 11th place on the table, five points clear of the six, but with a game in hand on most of the teams ahead of them.

Last week it was the club's turn to sit out a week due to the round bye and Brisbane coach John Kosmina had mixed feelings about being away from competition for a fortnight. "The players probably appreciated the week off and were able to let their hair down a little, but to be honest I would have preferred to be playing," he said.

"During our last few games, I believe we had some momentum going and the guys were playing some pretty good football.

"Whenever a team has a week off, it is very hard to keep the players motivated.

"It is virtually impossible to recreate the psychological and environmental strains of a match situation and like anything, the more you experience them the better you become."

The Strikers will go into this match at full strength with the only real injury concern during the week being Andy Harper's hamstring.

However, Kosmina said that Harper appeared to have pulled up in fine shape by week's end and was confident of having a full complement to choose from.

The big news of the week was the Strikers

bid to secure the services of young forward Stuart McLaren.

The 23-year-old McLaren, who grew up in Queensland, has had stints in Scotland and Asia and has impressed Kosmina during his short time in Brisbane.

"Stuart's a good solid player and his style of play is quite different to our other strikers so that can only be a positive for us," Kosmina said.

"Whereas the other guys do a lot of running and battling for the ball, Stuart likes to get the ball into feet and because he is very strong and possesses good balance, he is able to hold the ball up which is something that we don't have at the moment."

Kosmina said the team would be aiming for three points tonight but admitted that Sydney would be tough opposition.

"They (United) have some outstanding young players at the moment such as Mile Sterjovski and Joel Griffiths, and arguably the best defensive three in the business in Kupresak, Plesa and Vrkic." he said.

The Sydney United Story

Sydney Croatia sports club emerged in 1957 and began competing as a soccer team one year later. Like lots of other football clubs which emerged at that time, Croatia were formed to provide a haven for Croatian migrants who had chosen to make Australia their new home. But the Croatia Soccer Club soon became much more than a just social establishment.

After joining the NSW first division in 1963, the team was one soon highly revered by opponents, with a squad containing many imported players from all over Europe and South America. Yet Croatia was also developing a strong youth team structure-one that eventually reaped many rewards.

Often drawing crowds around the 10,000 mark. Croatia won the NSW championship in 1977, 1978, 1979, 1981 and 1982. They joined the A-league in 1984, and by 1988 had reached their first A-league grand final. Their 1988 team was one chock full of Socceroos, including Tony Franken, Craig Foster, Graham Arnold and Robbie Slater.

Renamed Sydney United in 1993, the club has continued to be an important breeding ground for the national team. Experienced

Socceroos Mark Bosnich, Zeliko Kalac and Tony Popovic, and the newer breed of Mark Babic, David Zdrilic, Ante Milicic and Paul Bilokapic all learned their trade through the Sydney United youth ranks. In terms of the development of such high class players, no one club has contributed as much to the success of the Australian national team over the past fifteen years as Sydney United. And for this they must be acknowledged.

Sydney United are the only team that the Strikers have played against in finals games. Amazingly, the two teams have met in five finals games! In the Strikers' first finals appearances in 1995/96, United defeated the Strikers in both of two (semi-) finals games (2-1 and 1-0). The next two semi-finals clashes, in season 1996/97, resulted in a 1-0 win to Strikers followed by a 2-1 win by Unted - but this was enough for Brisbane to advance to a home grand final. And who could forget the next finals clash - a 2-0 classic over United on THAT day, May 25, 1997.

Despite reaching the 1996/97 grand final, only four of the starting eleven for this match stayed with the club in 1997/98. Despite this mass-exodus, including a change of coach, United were still able to finish fourth in 97/98.

Many local soccer fans rejoiced when Chris Zoricich returned to the Strikers colours in the 1997/98 season. His tenacity, game knowledge, experience and all round skills made (and still do) him a valuable member of the Strikers outfit.

He is so versatile he can literally play anywhere in the defence or midfield and is certainly one of those rare talents that coaches love to have on their team.

And years of international football and numerous national caps for his native New Zealand make him one of the most experienced players at the Strikers and indeed in the Ericsson Cup.

Born on May 3, 1969, Chris began his illustrious football career in 1985 with New Zealand side University FC.

Between 1986 and 1988, he played for Papatoetoe before spending a year at the Sabah club in 1989, also in New Zealand.

During his time in New Zealand, Chris represented the national U21 side and also debuted for the senior side in 1987.

Since that first appearance, he has worn the All White strip on 25 occasions and recounts one of his fondest memories as being the 2-2 draw with South American giants Uruguay in Uruguay.

In 1990, Chris made the move offshore and linked with UK second division club Leyton Orient. He played for the club until 1993 and it was during this time that Zoricich sights one of his career highlights.

He said it was a huge thrill to mark English superstar Ian Wright who was then with Crystal Palace in an FA Cup match with Leyton Orient.

In 1994, he spent a year back in New Zealand with Central FC before joining the Strikers. And his first full season with Brisbane, Zoricich took home all of the club's major awards.

At the end of that year, Zoricich rejected a number of lucrative offers from the bigger "A" League clubs, opting to stay with Brisbane for a second season.

However, during the 1996/97 season, Zoricich decided to try his hand at overseas once again, and went to the United Kingdom for 12 months.

He spent time at high flying English clubs such as Watford, Wolverhampton, Fulham and Chelsea.

While in England, he received a recall to the All Whites squad and played for them during the Optus Four Nations tournament in February '97.

"Zoro" as he is known to his team-mates has once again become an integral part of the Strikers defence since rejoining the side.

Zoricich along with captain Glenn Gwynne and young lion Steve Laybutt, have developed into a well drilled defensive unit.

Their combination will be vital to the side's chances of gaining another league championship, which coincidentally is on the top of Zoro's list of goals for the next two years.


