


Having said that, I take nothing away from the contribution our youngsters have made in recent weeks - it has been superb.

Points are at a premium

The Brisbane Strikers host glamour side Sydney Olympic in tonight's big clash at Suncorp Stadium.

The Strikers have had a solid start to the season and find themselves within striking distance of the top six.

The team has performed well under coach John Kosmina with the hunger of two seasons ago certainly apparent.

But with almost two-thirds of the season completed, the Strikers must now look to make every post a winner in the run to the play-offs.

And that is going to be easier said than done against the quality Olympic outfit.

Olympic have some of the game's biggest names in their side and the Strikers will have to be on their guard against this classy unit.

Former Olyroo and Young Socceroo Peter Tsekenis is one to watch in midfield and current Young Soccer skipper Brett Emerton will test the Strikers defence with his marauding runs out wide

Nick Carle, Jason Culina and and Pablo Cardoza are also some of the players that the Strikers will need to pay attention to.

When the two sides met in Round 2 earlier this season, Olympic scored a narrow 2-1 victory at home.

It was a game that should have gone the other way according to Kosmina.

"We should have won that game comfortably but didn't and from that perspective, it was very disappointing," he said.

"To be honest, we beat ourselves that night and that was something that was acknowledged by the Olympic fans."

The bounce of the ball has certainly not gone the way of the Strikers in a couple of close matches this season.

Kosmina said that while the team had been putting in some good performances, he firmly believed that their position on the table should have been much higher at this stage of the season.

"The bottom line is that we should have got more points from the games we have

played so far than we have," he said.

"But we haven't so we've got to roll our sleeves up, dig deep and put in the extra effort from here on in.

"Over half the season has gone but with thirteen games remaining, there is still plenty of points on offer."

The Strikers have been decimated by injuries to key players in recent weeks with Sean Cranney, Andy Harper, Steve Laybutt and Chay Hews all sidelined for this match.

The loss of those players would test the depth of any squad in the Ericsson Cup, but Kosmina is confident the Strikers possess the player personnel to do the job.

"We have brought some of the QAS lads such as Shane Stefanutto and Andrew Davidson into the side and they have done a good job for us so far," he said.


Kosmina said he was looking for an improved performance from the match against Newcastle.

The Sydney Olympic Story

In 1958, the Pan-Hellenic soccer club was born. It took the club only five years to establish itself at the top level of domestic football at this time - the NSW first division.

Coinciding with a name change to 'Sydney Olympic', the club board in 1976 decided to become a foundation member of the then called Philips Soccer League (PSL). Commencing in 1977, the PSL was Australia's first truly national football competition.

Olympic had a fairly slow beginning to the NSL, not finishing above halfway on the final ladder until 1982. In fact, in finishing second last in 1979, Olympic was relegated back to the NSW league - but not for long.

A NSW championship in 1980 paved the way for a hasty return to the top flight in 1981 - and they have been there ever since.

Backed by a large - albeit demanding supporter base, Sydney Olympic finally started to produce the goods in the NSL in the mid 1980s. In 1984 Olympic won three consecutive finals games to meet South Melbourne in the grand final, and despite a 4-2 loss over two legs, a golden era beckoned for a club that had promised to much in the past.

Olympic lost another two-legged grand final in 1986, losing 3-2 on aggregate after being 1-0 up after the first leg in Adelaide.

Tragedy struck again for the Olympic faithful when the 1989 grand final against Marconi was lost (0-1) with barely one minute of regulation time remaining.

Olympic again won three finals games in succession to make a grand final, this time in 1989/90.

But this time Olympic's moment of glory finally arrived. Buoyed on by the majority of a 26.352 strong audience, Olympic resoundingly beat Marconi in the grand final 2-0.

The old cliche 'the sleeping giant' is an adage that truly describes Sydney Olympic. A relatively bare trophy cabinet does not justify such a strong and loyal support for the club.

After becoming privatised in mid 1998, the club purchased the services of two of Australia's most well-credentialled coaches -Branko Culina and Frank Arok (the latter as coaching director).

The future of Olympic looks like one where more trophies will be joining their lonesome 1990 counterpart.

Your Solution to Quality Impressions

With the departure of Frank Farina and the retirement of the evergreen Rod Brown, the Strikers were left with some big shoes to fill on the front lines at the start of the '98/99 season.

Twenty-three year old Stuart McLaren came to the club late last year and after only a handful of appearances has impressed club administrators and fans alike.

McLaren was born in Glasgow in Scotland on August 28, 1975. His father Robert was a boilermaker, while mother Molly worked at a major retail outlet.

At the age of five, Stuart's family made the long trek down under and after spending time in Brisbane, the McLaren's finally made the central Queensland town of Rockhampton their new home.

Stuary

Stuart said he has been kicking a ball since before he could remember, but it wasn't until the age of 10 years that he began to think seriously about the game.

"It was around that age when I found out that players got paid for playing football," he said.

"I thought that would be a great life and as I progressed, I decided to have a shot at becoming a full-time professional."

Stuart's early football years were spent with Capalaba and Mt Gravatt in Brisbane and later with Rockhampton club Berserker.

It was during his time at Berserker that Stuart first met Queensland Soccer coaching identity Gary Johnson.

"Gary was a big influence on my career as I played under him at Berserker and numerous Queensland junior sides," he said.

"He is such an easy guy to talk to and even now, I find that I can sit down and get his thoughts on various parts of my game.

"The other big influence on my career has



been my dad who was quite a good amateur footballer in Scotland.

"He always encouraged and supported me, but never pushed and after every match I give him a call to discuss how I went."

In 1992, Stuart took up a two-year scholarship at the Australian Institute of Sport. From 1993 —96 he played for Wollongong before making the move to Scottish First Division side Stirling Albion.

Stuart said it was beneficial to see how the game functions in Britain and gained valuable experience during a two-season stint.

"The league in Australia is certainly comproble to the first division in Scotland with the only major difference being the pace of the game," he said.

"I think that has a lot to do with the climate as it's very hard to keep running for ninety minutes in the Australian heat while over there, you have to keep running to stay warm."

McLaren said he had enjoyed his time with the Strikers to date and was looking forward to attaining future goals with the club.







Tonight's game against Sydney Olympic, probably the country's best youth side, who play open attractive football, will certainly bring out the best amongst our athletes.


And being my former club, a win tonight for the QAS is the only result thinkable to avoid a transfer to Woop Woop FC!






