## Glamour side to be wary

The Brisbane Strikers will be looking to continue on their winning way when they host Sydney glamour side Northern Spirit in tonight's big clash at Suncorp Stadium.

After the weekend's round, Northern Spirit is in fourth place on the league ladder with 29 points, four clear of the Strikers in eighth place.

The Strikers have soared into finals contention in recent weeks with some big results against some of the league top sides.

The Frank Farina lead Marconi Fairfield were no match for the Strikers in round 16, losing 2-1 at home.

Then on Australia Day, Sydney Olympic travelled to Brisbane full of confidence.

Emerton, Culina and Tome came out firing early in the match but to the Strikers credit, the team dug deep and recorded a memorable 2-1 win.

Strikers coach John Kosmina said he was happy with the Olympic win overall, especially considering the first period of the match.

"We had played well in the game against Marconi the round prior and I felt the guys attitude wasn't one hundred per cent at the start of the Olympic match," he said.

"We let them (Olympic) dictate terms early and didn't make the necessary adjustments on the field.

"In the second half we turned the game around and dominated play for much of the second half."


With the finals looming closer each week, Kosmina said he was happy with the team's progress with a little more than a third of the season remaining.

"We have to now focus on keeping our performances going and securing maximum points from each game," he said.

"Early in the season, we played well enough to get the results but unfortunately for us, they didn't always come.

"I'm a big believer in the old saying that 'you get out, what you put in' and I think we're starting to get rewarded for our efforts."

After the Northern Spirit tonight, the



Strikers have two away matches against Carlton and Perth Glory.

All three sides are above the Strikers on the points table and Kosmina said that these games would go along way to shaping the Strikers season.

"They're very important matches for us, especially the away games, and we will have to make sure that we are on our game."

The injury toll at the club is looking much brighter and Kosmina believes he will have a full strength squad to choose from in around three to four weeks.

Andy Harper has resumed full training and Sean Cranney is almost ready to start, while Chay Hews is under consideration for tonight's starting line-up:

In the absence of some of the side's more experienced players, the young members of the squad such as Shane Stefanutto, Jade North, Wayne Srhoj and Andrew Davidson have all played outstanding football.

"The Young kids have been great," Kosmina said. "But the senior players in the squad have also been outstanding with the likes of Gwynney, Zoz and Nick putting in some memorable performances.

"The other guy who has impressed me is Clint Bolton as he has been extremely focused in recent weeks."

## **The Northern Spirit Story**

In January 1998 Soccer Australia announced the entry of the 38th team to enter the NSL since 1977.

Innovatively named the Northern Spirit, the club's founder is high profile Real Estate Institute of Australia head and former Marconi chairman Remo Nogaretto.

Other big names on the administration side are the club's inaugural president Kathryn Greiner (Sydney Councillor) and director Kerry Chikarovski (NSW Liberal Party leader).

And in July 1998 the Spirit secured a long term partnership with Crystal Palace after the English Club's Executive Chairman Mark Goldberg bought a majority equity stake in the Spirit.

But it is on the field where it really matters, and again it was a predominantly high-profile and quality group initially enlisted.

Returning to Australia to join the club was inaugural Spirit coach Graham Arnold. The longtime Socceroo left Australian shores in 1989 after playing for seven years in the NSL with Sydney United.

Overseas, Arnold had many a successful season in Holland with Roda JC Kerkrade (1990-92), RC Liegois (1992-1994), RC Charleroi (1994-95) and NAC Breda (1995-97), before a brief stint in Japan with San Frecce Hiroshima (1997-98).

Arnold was a great coup for the Northern Spirit, not only as an excellent player/coach in his own right but also as a quality bait to lure other worthwhile players to the Spirit.

Another prolific signing was Robbie Slater, who despite having the option of continuing his English career with Southampton, instead joined former Sydney United and Socceroo team-mate Arnold and the Spirit.

Other experienced signings included Kresimir Marusic (NSL player of the year 1996/97), Troy Cranney (with 198 NSL

appearances under his belt before joining the club), Luke Casserly, Paul Bilokapic, Tony Perinich, Peter Blazincic, Gabriel Mendez, Clayton Zane and Robert Enes. Experienced English import Ian Crook, who had played for six years at Tottenham and eleven years at Norwich (and even made a couple of appearances for the England national team) was also snapped up.

The quality of the youngsters recruited by the Spirit is exemplified by the signing of Paul Henderson from Sydney state league club Sutherland.

The 22 year old keeper was signed as an apprentice and third string keeper, backing up for much more experienced John Perosh and Peter Blazincic.

Yet a series of strong pre-season performances saw Henderson establish himself as the number one keeper for the start of the season, and he was been first choice ever since.

The club draws most of its support amongst the Sydney's northern suburban sector stretching from the northern beaches across to the north-western suburbs.

It is a population base close to one million people, including many thousands of junior players whom the club has specifically targeted.

And a balmy Friday night at the picturesque North Sydney Oval, watching the speedy Slater, magical Marusic and company, offers a very attractive after-work haven for those thousands of office workers of the congested North Sydney office precinct located a ten minute stroll away.

Meanwhile, the Sydney Central Business District is just a twenty minute train trip and walk away.

There are many reasons why the Spirit have attracted many fans from not just Sydney's northern suburbs - but from all over Australia's largest city.



# Blackburn Rovers on fact finding mission

English Premier League team Blackburn Rovers have sent out club representative Bobby Downes to visit the Brisbane Strikers. Downes arrived in Brisbane on Friday.

The impetus for the visit was created by Strikers' sponsor Uhlsport who also sponsor Blackburn Rovers.

Australian Distributor for Uhlsport and managing director of Statewide Sports Mick Matula, was visiting Stuttgart last June for the company's International Conference when the initial contact was made.

"As both clubs have Uhlsport as their sponsor, I thought it would be a good idea that some type of "Sister Club" relationship be formed," Matula said.


"I suggested the idea to the English Promotions Manager for Uhlsport and the whole thing has developed from there."

Strikers Chairman Ian Brusasco said the club welcomed the visit.

The Brisbane Strikers have been ravaged by injuries in recent weeks to several of the team's key players.

The likes of Sean Cranney, Andy Harper, and Chay Hews have all spent time warming the sideline bench.

And while their collective experience and talent has been missed on the field, the Strikers have been blessed that many of the younger players at the club have taken the opportunity presented to them.

Nineteen year old Gold Coast youngster Shane Stefanutto is one such player that has blossomed in the country's premier football competition.

A QAS squad member for a couple of seasons, Stefanutto's first taste of the NSL came last year under then coach, Frank Farina.

Training with the Strikers was a step up from the QAS and Stefanutto said the experience has improved his game.

"It made me realise that in the top league, opportunities are very limited," he said.

"I probably didn't take my chance then and I made the decision that I would give it one hundred per cent if I got the opportunity this season."

With injuiries taking their toll on the Strikers squad a third of the way through the season, coach John Kosmina called upon the services of Steffanuto, Andrew Davidson, Jade North and Wayne Shroj to fill the void.

Since that time, Shane has played six games on the trot and is looking comfortable in his defensive role at left back.

"When I was called into the team against South Melbourne, I was determined to play as good as I could," Steffanuto said.

"I've now played a few games in a row and am really enjoying the challenge of playing against quality opposition each week.

"Playing against Brett Emerton last week was a great experience for me and when you're

a rookie like I am, you tend to learn a lot from the great players."

Shane begain his soccer career at the age of five years playing for the Atherton club in the local Carins competition.

He represented the Far North Queensland region on several occasions, and was selected to play for Queensland as a junior.

In 1996, after receiving advice from South-East Queensland director of coaching Andrew Bettel, the Stefanutto's moved to the Gold Coast so that Shane could further his soccer

"Mum and Dad sacrificed a lot just packing up their lives and moving to the Gold Coast," he said

"We had a great lifestyle in Cairns and lots of family friends and there's no doubt in my mind that the decision to move south has had a huge influence on my career."

For the moment, Shane said he was happy in establishing himself in the Ericsson Cup.

However, a professional career beckons overseas and that is certainly something that Shane aspires to.
