# **Ball is in Strikers court**

The Strikers host the Melbourne Knights in what promises to be a great spectacle at Suncorp Stadium tonight.

Both teams will be searching for maximum points from this match in an effort to keep alive any chance of a top six finish.

And with just eight games in the season remaining, it is little wonder that Strikers coach John Kosmina is stressing the importance of every point.

"Basically, the simple scenario is that the ball is in our court," he said.

"What happens over the remaining matches is really up to us and we have to try and put ourselves in a position to get the most out of every game.

"We'll be pushing hard for a finals berth and I believe we have the talent and a good blend of youth and experience that will hold us in good stead."

In the Strikers last outing at Suncorp, they thrashed southern glamour club the Northern Spirit 5-1.

It was a big win for the club and it seemed the Strikers were going to find themselves a permanent spot near the top of the table.


However, two losses in as many away games means the Strikers are now in 8th position on the league ladder.

Against the Glory in Perth two weeks ago, the Strikers were comprehensively beaten 6-0, while last week's game against Carlton also proved unforgettable, the Strikers going down 5-2.

However, despite two big losses on the scoreboard, Kosmina said there were many positive apsects to Brisbane's current form.

"The bad results over the last couple of weeks have really been a result of lapses in concentration," he said.

"When we played Perth, I thought we were all over them for the first twenty minutes but



then they scored an unexpected goal and we went a man down which didn't help our cause.

"And against Carlton, as silly as it might sound, I thought we were the better side in that match... and the Melbourne media thought the same after the match.


"Carlton went two goals up and we fought hard to draw even, but again we went a man down and in the end, they caught us pushing forward and punished us."

Captain Glenn Gwynne and the seasoned Chris Zoricich will be missing from the Strikers line-up tonight due to suspension. Their absence is likely to cause Kosmina a few headaches.

"It's unfortunate that they're (Gwynne and Zoricich) not there but that happens in this game and guys like Steve Laybutt and Nick Meredith are going to have to make sure they are tuned in at the back," Kosmina said.

"The Knights have some tremendous players in the form of Ivan Kelic and Zeljko Susa, but I think we have the personnel to do the job.

"Guys like Jeromy Harris and Stuart McLaren are coming back into form, Chay Hews had an outstanding return to competition last week and Des Hughes has been exceptional since joining the club."



# **Fans Enjoy Goal Feast**

There were goals a plenty during Round 21 of this year's Ericsson Cup competition.

In an action packed game at Edensor Park, Sydney United blew a two-goal lead to lose to the Perth Glory in the dying minutes of the game.

Joe Vrkic opened United's account in the 16th minute and when Mile Sterjovski scored in the 23rd minute, it appeared the game was heading towards a home team win.

However, Con Boutsianis got one back for the visitors in the 38th minute, but United maintained their one goal advantage at the break.

The half-time oranges worked wonders for the Glory as they got on equal terms with United in the 55th minute thanks to Alastair Edwards' goals and took the lead in the 63rd minute courtesy of Michael Garcia.

However, Sydney struck back immediately when Steve Berry netted in the 64th minute.


The two sides seemed destined to share the points until Boutsianis unleashed one of his left foot "specials" from outside the box, just three minutes from time.

# **The Melbourne Knights Story**

A club simply called Croatia entered the Victorian provisional league in 1953, merging with Preston Croat in 1965, then taking over the Essendon Lions in 1975.

Under the name of Essendon Croatia, they finished either first or second each year from 1978 to 1984.

Eddie Krncevic, Australia's first overseas success story of the modern era, came through the Essendon state league ranks.

Renamed to Melbourne Croatia, their national league career commenced stunningly in 1984 as the club made it to the preliminary final of the southern conference at their first attempt.

Their first grand final appearance came at the climax of the 1990/91 season, where they lost an enthralling grand final to South Melbourne only on a penalty shoot-out.

The same scenario occurred in 1991/92, the team losing on penalties to Adelaide City. In the 1991/92 season - the inaugural season of Brisbane United - the Knights were the only team to win both their games against United, and were in fact the first team to inflict defeat upon United - a 3-1 result in round four.

Yet another grand final appearance (and another name change - this time to the

Melbourne Knights) in 1993/94 saw another grand final loss, again to Adelaide City (0-1).

In 1994/95 the Knights finally gained revenge by defeating Adelaide City 2-0 in the most one sided of national league grand finals ever played.

No one team has dominated a season like the Knights did in 1994/95.

The team were champions, minor premiers and cup-winners - the first time ever that one club has ever taken out the 'treble'.

A 6-0 win in the national cup final was again the most one-sided final of this competition.

Teenage sensation Mark Viduka took out the player of the year, under 21 player of the year and top scorer of the year.

Mirko Bazic was voted coach of the year and amazingly, the same two people had won the same four awards the previous season.

Despite losing many players, the club won the league again in 1995/96.

Even more players disappeared after the 1996 grand final, but the club never know how to say die and have doggedly continued to compete strongly in the NSL.

# Australia loses gifted physcian

Australian Sport suffered a great loss this month with the passing of Dr John McNee.

Dr McNee, aged 57 years, was at the forefront of the sports medicine industry within Queensland and Australia for many years.

As consultant Sports Physician to many of Queensland's sports injury rehabilitation specialists, Dr McNee was undoubtedly one of the most respected sports physicians in Queensland.

He devoted his life to sports medicine and over the years treated some of Australia's finest sporting exports including tennis star Patrick Rafter, netballer Vicki Wilson, cricketer Carl Rackemann and the Broncos Steve Renouf.

The "Doc" as he was commonly known, was also Medical Director with the Sydney Organising Committee (SOCOG) for Olympic Soccer, Consultant Sports Physician to the Queensland Academy of Sport (QAS) in the disciplines of Athletics, Hockey and Soccer and a Medical Director for the Queensland Bulls.

But many local soccer fans would know Dr McNee for his involvement with the code for more than a decade.

In 1987, Dr McNee took over from Dr Keith Pearson as the QSF's Chief Medico, which included the oversight of all medical aspects for the state team.

During the 90's, Dr McNee worked as the Medical Director for Brisbane United and then the Strikers, a position he held until his passing.

In 1993, the "Doc" was appointed as Chief Medical Officer for all World Youth Cup matches in Brisbane.

Brisbane Strikers Chairman Ian Brusasco said the Queensland Soccer fraternity had lost one of its great servants.



"John was one of those doctors that everybody liked and trusted," he said.

"He (Dr McNee) was a gifted physician and was respected by those who knew him both professionally and personally.

"His knowledge saved the career of many an athlete and I'm sure I speak for everyone involved with soccer in the state when I say that his services will be sadly missed.

"He had a unique ability to not only treat an injury, but also provide emotional support for athletes, which is an important part of the healing process."

During his career at the Spring Hill Sports Medicine Clinic, Dr McNee saw as many as 10,000 patients, of which approximately 78% were under the age of 17 years.

One of his foremost concerns was nurturing and educating our up and coming young athletes in the prevention and management of injuries.

He conducted lectures on sports related issues at many Brisbane schools, colleges and universities.

Dr McNee leaves behind a wife, Theresa, and four children, Catherine (26 years), Angela (28 years), Maree (29 years) and Brendon (31 years).

Danny Watkins, Graham Arnold and Robbie Slater each scored for Spirit, while Ivan Kelic and Ice Kutlesovski netted for the Knights.

At Bob Jane Stadium, league leaders South Melbourne defeated the beleagured Marconi Fairfield 2-0.

First half goals to Paul Trimboli and Vaughan Coveny mean that Frankie's headache will continue for at least another week. Rumour has it that he is even considering strapping on the boots in a desperate bid to rescue the Stallions!

In the final match of the round (not considering the Strikers/Carlton game), Newcastle scored a 1-0 win over the Gippsland Falcons.

So, the table as it stands after 21 rounds of the Ericsson Cup has South Melbourne on top on 43 points, with Perth Glory and Sydney United battling for second on 36 points. The Strikers are currently in 8th position on the league ladder on 28 points.

In 1994-95, Laybutt accepted a scholarship at the Australian Institute of Sport before embarking on a national league career with the Wollongong Wolves.

He played with Wollongong during the 95/96 and 96/97 seasons.

In 1997, Laybutt was selected to play for the Olyroos against the highly fancied Brazilian outfit and Stephen cites this as the highlight of his career to date.


In 1997/98, Laybutt decided to make the move north and begin a new chapter in his career with the Brisbane Strikers.
