Tokesi's week of training has been thrown into turmoil by the injury clouds over the likes of Hinton and Popplewell.


On a positive note, defender Steve Foreshaw is expected to return to training this week after suffering a fractured eye socket earlier in the year.

"We were playing quite well until they got a man sent off, but within five minutes, Wynnum scored two goals against the run of play.


"We were very casual in defence, got punished and really deserved to.










NORTHERN SEMIPROS AND CONS Uni after North Star wounded Creek Widens Gap

University of Queensland coach Tibor Hagymas remains optimistic about his side's chances against reigning champions Albany Creek when the two sides meet this weekend.

The Uni coach said he and his players would be putting aside last weekend's 2-0 loss to Easts and focus all of their attention on this weekend's match against Creek.

"The loss to Easts was a little disappointing because we played well enough to win the match, but just didn't put our chances away," Hagymas said.

"In the end it was a case of them putting their chances away and getting away with the three points."

Hagymas said his side's inability to score in recent weeks was beginning to concern him, with the coach set to work hard on that aspect of his team's game at training over the next week.

"It is frustrating and a little concerning that we haven't been able to score goals and put sides away," Hagymas said.

"It's probably just a confidence thing at the moment and I really think we're not all that far away from turning things around.

"But the only way we will turn things around is if one or two of the players put their hands up and decide they want to be the ones to score."

The University coach is confident the goals may come this weekend against the struggling Albany Creek, citing the reigning champions lack of confidence as a major factor in the game.

"They're not travelling all that crash hot at the moment and really they now find themselves in the same boat as us," Hagymas said.

"They're needing a win just as badly as we are, because like us, they've also had a fairly lean few weeks."

North Star has extended the margin between itself and the rest of the competition with a 4-0 victory over the luckless Gap.

The win was the young club's seventh this season and has confirmed their new found status as the team to beat this year.

Three first half goals laid the foundation for the victory, but despite the final lopsided scoreline, North Star coach Steve Faulkner had nothing but praise for The Gap.

"It was a much tougher match than our first round encounter against them," Faulkner said.

"We won that match 7-4 and let some very soft goals in. The pleasing thing about the weekend's victory was that we didn't concede a goal, and that holds us in good stead for this weekend's match against Grange."

And despite the obvious difference between the two sides on the competition table, Faulkner refused to go into the match complacent.

"Paddy's (Higgins) results over the past few weeks haven't been all that bad," the North Star coach said.

"They haven't really played with much luck on occasions, but they are certainly a side that can cause an upset on their day."

Last week's 3-0 loss to Rivers could not have helped Thistle's confidence however. They are a side which has struggled to both score goals and defend against them this season, and an upset against the top team this weekend looks unlikely.

Faulkner's only real concern this weekend. should be on how to keep his side motivated to continue playing their winning style of football. However the North Star coach said he had that one covered as well.

"We'll just make sure that competition for first team spots remains high," he said.

A 1-1 draw with reigning champions Albany Creek has restored some faith in the Mitchelton fans and some confidence in the players as they prepare for this weekend's important matchup against Pine Rivers.

The scoreless draw has been arguably one of Mitchelton's best results this year, despite the fact they were up against an Albany Creek outfit lacking in confidence at the moment.

It was a result and a competition point the club deperately needed for it to increase its confidence for the remainder of the season and have any hope of threatening for a top four position.

At the Queensland Academy of Sport there is the Talent Identification Program run by Chelsea Warr.

The aim of the program is to identify athletes who may be able to go from one sporting pursuit to excel at another.
