

That Review

STRIKERS V's Northern Spirit

An opportunist goal in the final minute of play denied the Brisbane Strikers of a fourth consecutive victory in the National Soccer League last Saturday night.

The equaliser from Abbas Saad, was not the prettiest of goals, with the former Socceroo on the spot to tap home Clint Bolton's parry from a Matthew Bingley bullet.

The goal allowed the Spirit to draw level at 2-2 to snatch a vital competition point and deny the Strikers of another two, although Brisbane's unbeaten record remained intact.

Strikers coach John Kosmina, although a touch disappointed with the result, was extremely pleased with the performance of his charges.

"I was very happy with the way the boys played. We were a bit unlucky to concede two goals that really came from decisionmaking mistakes, but having said that, the boys played some wonderful football, which would have kept the thousands of Strikers supporters very happy," Kosmina said.

Brisbane started the match in the best possible fashion, when Paul Foster converted from a set piece corner. His powerful volley flew past the Spirit keeper in the seventh minute to give the home side a 1-0 lead.

That appeared to spur the Strikers on, with the side giving the Brisbane fans plenty to cheer about for the remainder of the first half, producing some creative football and a number of genuine scoring opportunities.

Kosmina's tactical changes looked as though they were proving too much for Graham Arnold and his men, with National League debutante Peter Grierson causing all sorts of problems up front with Foster, and

However the Strikers missed opportunities would serve to haunt the Brisbane players and supporters in the 35th minute.

The Spirit worked a quality movement through Luke Casserley and former Brisbane midfielder Sean Cranney, to allow Matthew Bingley enough space to ease his shot past Bolton and into the back of the net.

The equaliser did not phase the Strikers though with the home side remaining composed and striking back in the 40th minute through new signing Peter Grierson, who slammed home from close range after good lead up work from Paul Foster.

That gave the Strikers a 2-1 lead going into the break, a lead they held onto for the majority of the second stanza.

Despite several chances though, the Strikers could not penetrate further, and the last minute lapse allowed the Spirit to steal a draw.

Match Preview

The Parramatta Power will be a team on a mission tonight, according to Strikers coach John Kosmina.

The Strikers coach believes last weekend's 3-2 loss to Canberra, in front of their Parramatta Stadium supporters, should be enough to motivate the talented Power outfit to have a big game this evening.

"It's a very similar situation to our last game," Kosmina said, "... they are coming up here and they feel they have a point to prove after a disappointing result the previous week

"But that hasn't worried us so far this season and I'm not expecting it to worry us again tonight."

Although Brisbane had a disappointing end to last weekend's match, the Strikers coach played down media reports of "de-ja vu" for the team.

"That's rubbish! It wasn't the best note to finish the match on, but that's part of the game," the Strikers coach said.


"Statistics all around the world show that there are plenty of goals scored in the last five minutes of the first half and the last five minutes of the second half, so I'm not concerned about those comments at all.

Sydney's newest franchise in the National Soccer League, the Parramatta Power has prompted plenty of interest from soccer pundits right around Australia.

The team is made up of a host of former Sydney United players, with several other big names joining an impressive list of recruits.

Names such as Milan Blagojevic and Walter Ardone are the ones that readily come to mind, but last week it was the speed and skill of Joel Griffiths that came to the fore.

Griffiths scored both his side's goals in their



3-2 loss to the Cosmos, a statistic that did not go unnoticed by Kosmina.

"He's very quick and he has a lot of skill, but there are plenty off other dangerous players in the side as well," Kosmina said.

Despite the talent that lies within the Power however, Kosmina believes the new club is possibly a bit vulnerable at the moment, as it adjusts to the demands of the NSL.

"I think they are a little out of sorts at the moment and it's not because they haven't played together for a long time, because most of the players have been together, so David Mitchell has got a good foundation to work from," the Strikers tactician said.

"I think it's more likely that some of their players are still coming to terms with the transition from part-time players to full-time professionals.

"In saying that though, they will hit their straps at some point, but we will be out to make things very difficult for them tonight."

Talking Tactics with Kossie

Although it was a little disappointing to come away from last week's match against the Spirit with a draw, I really can't fault the way we played.


Apart from a couple of defensive errors, the boys put together some excellent football, and for that reason, I really don't see a great need to change things too much.

The positional changes we made last week worked very well, with Peter Grierson complementing Fossy up front superbly, and Pete Dwyer looking very comfortable back on the left side.

Tonight's match will be much like our last two home games, in that we are coming up against a side that is on the back of a loss.

For that reason, I'm sure the Power will be extremely fired up tonight and it won't be easy to take the three points that are on offer.

I'm expecting nothing but class from (Milan) Blagojevic. He is an excellent player technically and he can cause plenty of headaches for opposing teams.



Sterjovski has also been in good form of late and Joel Griffiths is lightning fast, so they'll be another two we'll have to watch.

The key thing for us tonight though will be to continue with our current game plan, which has been working for us, and to eliminate our defensive errors so we don't allow the Power to score any soft goals.

WHO'S HOT

He may not be the most physically intimidating man to grace the football field, but what Dave Pilic lacks in size, he more than makes up for in spirit.

And that could not have been illustrated better than in last weekend's match against Sydney glamour side Northern Spirit.

Despite copping a bad knock to the head, the plucky 21 year old returned to the pitch (with stitches to a head wound), where he continued to make his presence felt.

To watch the young man in action, it is hard to believe he has just four National League caps to his name. However "Pili" is quickly making his mark in the NSL, with his decisive midfield play.

It is quite clear, he has carried the lessons learned from his time with the QAS and the experience gained playing with this year's XXXX League premiers Rochedale, into this, his latest challenge.

Guts, determination and persistence personify this talented young man, who will be one to watch for, during this evening's clash with the Parramatta Power.

I would like to add that media coverage in our own state has, as you would expect, been positive.


My only gripe is that we don't get enough of it. This, however, is something we are hoping to rectify.

Strikers Profile

Brad Ditton

Two Seasons ago many wrote him off as another National League discard... a young man who just a few seasons earlier had the world at his feet, but had unfortunately succumbed to injuries and other perils associated with top league football.

Mid-way through the post Grand Final season, it came as no surprise when he, like many others before him, fell into the National League wilderness.

But after two seasons of relative obscurity, and now four matches back in the country's top competition, it is quite obvious Brad Ditton is back.

"I ummed and ahhed for ages about the decision to return," Brad said, "...and it really did take me a long time to decide to go for another season with the Strikers."

And it was a decision that coach John Kosmina and Strikers fans around the country would no doubt be very happy with, after seeing the sort of form this talented young midfielder has been in recently.

Formerly from Mackay, "Ditts", as he is affectionately known, was spotted at an early age and soon became a Young Socceroo.

It wasn't long before he had a host of National League clubs vying for his signature, however being a true-blue Queenslander it didn't take much to persuade the young man to sign with the newly formed Brisbane United.

After playing with United and then with the Strikers, Ditts trialed with English First Division side Oldham, before playing a season with Second Division club Chesterfield.

After a year in England the young midfielder

returned to Australia where he took up a place with the Strikers again, however before long, injury set in and some personality differences with coaches had Ditts in a state of disillusionment.

"Things probably weren't going my way and I guess I got sick of putting in such a big commitment and never getting on the paddock," Brad said.

"So I gave it away mid way through the season after we won the Grand Final, returned to the XXXX League and started up my own personal training business."

After playing a staring role with Beenleigh, Ditts was picked up by Rochedale, the club with which he played an instrumental role in winning their first ever premiership this year.

With such a good season behind him, Brad was offered another chance with the Strikers, and after much deliberation and consultation with his girlfriend, he took the opportunity.

"I think I really had some unfinished business to do in the National League," Brad said.

"I didn't reach my full potential previously and I was really eager to show people that I could cut it in the top competition.

"Kossie offered me another chance and after a lot of thought I decided I would give it another go.



The National Soccer League covered dating back to the 996/97 season.


However, if you're after something a little different, the site also covers the Gladesville Hornsby Womens Soccer Association and the Ku-Ring-GAi & District Soccer Association, as well as the National Rugby League competition from this season.

The home page for the site provides some excellent links to other football sites both in Australia and around the world. There is also a guestbook for visitors, which allows individuals to place a supporters message on the site for the world to see.

The NSL information is quite extensive and and more than 43,000 hits is testimony to its quality.

Major events, news items and upcoming games are highlighted, but the really interesting part of the site is the results section.

Once inside the results section, there is a form guide, division summary, leading goal scorers, goal analysis and attendance stats.



And as mentioned earlier, you can compare statistics from the last four seasons.

The goal analysis statistic provides some interesting reading as it documents the various periods throughout the matches that goals have been scored during the first four rounds of the season.

For example, a total of 9 goals have been scored in the first 15 minutes of all matches, while 17 goals have been scored in the last 15 minutes of all matches.

Perhaps the only dissappointing thing about the site is the lack of graphics but if you are a hardened stats fan, that will be the least of your worries.

The site is listed as the unofficial website of the NSL and is well worth a look.



CONGRATULATIONS CLINT BOLTON




Last week Clint Bolton (pictured right) played his 150th NSL game, on the 23rd October Brisbane Strikers vs Northern Spirit.


SPARKY COMPETITION

Gwynnie's Guide to Landscaping

This week in gardening with the Strikers I will talk about something that is most important when planning a garden and that is Mulch!!

A good garden should always be well mulched. A thick layer of mulch prevents water loss thus reducing the amount of water needed.

It also prevents the growth of weeds, keeps the soil encouraging good root growth and enriches the soil as it breaks down.

When choosing mulch anything is better


than nothing although lawn clippings should ideally be composted for a month before using.

My personal favourite is Hoop Pine while though expensive is well worth the effort as it is the best mulch for steep or sloping garden beds.

Other mulches include Pine Bark, Sugar Cane Bales and Garden Mulch all of which are more than satisfactory.
