



Match Review

STRIKERS unbeaten run ends

The unbeaten run of the Brisbane Strikers came to end last week, when the side went down 2-1 to the Newcastle Breakers.

Although on paper it looked like a match the Strikers should have won, earlier in the week coach John Kosmina expressed some genuine concerns prior to the Friday night kick-off.

The Strikers coach indicated the game was always going to be tough, with few teams able to come away from Newcastle with a good result.

In the end, the narrow pitch and Newcastle's strong defensive tactics paid dividends for the club, with the Breakers inflicting Brisbane's only loss of the season to date.

In fact Newcastle scored all three times, with Andy Roberts and John Buonavoglia troubling the scorers and Brisbane's only goal coming in the form of an own-goal in the 51st minute.

With Newcastle electing to keep plenty of players behind the ball, Brisbane was given relatively few chances to score.

The league's leading scorer Paul Foster was kept quiet throughout, with the Strikers best chances falling to skipper Stuart MacLaren, who hit the post from close range and Wayne Baldwin who was also unable to finish off a good opportunity.

Despite the loss, coach John Kosmina remained extremely positive about the outcome.

"We probably played well enough to win the match, but in the end a few crucial things didn't go our way," the Strikers coach said. "We didn't take full toll of some of the opportunities that came our way, but I don't think we can be too critical because in the past few weeks we have taken those sorts of chances.

"But we had a lot of possession and we kept things moving nicely, so generally speaking I was quite happy with the way we played."

Kosmina cited Newcastle's defensive tactics as the decisive factor in the end, although he refused to enter into any criticism of those methods.

"They got a lot of players behind the ball and the smaller pitch didn't suit our style of play, but like I said, we're not complaining," Kosmina said.

"Their style of play doesn't fit in too well with my style of football, but each coach has their own ideas on how the game should be played."

Despite the loss, the Strikers remain on top of the table, with Sydney Olympic closing the gap to a single point again following their 2-0 win over Adelaide.

In the other round ten matches, South Melbourne accounted for Parramatta Power 4-2, while Perth Glory continued its winning ways with a 1-0 victory over Sydney United.

Northern Spirit upset Marconi 1-0 in the derby match, Carlton flogged Canberra 5-1, the Melbourne Knights surprised Wollongong 2-1 and Gippsland held the Auckland Kingz to a 1-1 draw.

A return to their winning ways could be as little as 90 minutes away for the Brisbane Strikers according to coach John Kosmina.

Last weekend's 2-1 loss in Newcastle was Brisbane's first in ten matches and Kosmina and his charges are eager to return to their previously undefeated ways, starting with tonight's match against the Gippsland Falcons.

"It's never easy to handle a loss of any description but in all honesty I wasn't upset with the way we played down in Newcastle," the Strikers coach said.

"That match is always one of the toughest road trips each season and I really think we didn't play all that badly.


"So I don't think there is any cause for concern for tonight's match and I certainly don't think last week was the beginning of a bad patch for the club."

Kosmina believes a return to the wide open spaces of Suncorp-Metway Stadium this evening will do plenty for the confidence of his players, who will be out to reverse last weekend's result.

"The guys are obviously much more comfortable playing at home, and I think you'll see them have a bit more joy out wide because of the bigger pitch and also because they're back in front of their home fans," Kosmina said.

Despite the loss to Newcastle, the Strikers remain atop the competition table, one point clear of the in-form Sydney Olympic, the side that Brisbane will meet next weekend in Sydney.

And the Brisbane coach believes a victory against Gippsland this evening, could be a necessary ingredient for a successful road trip next weekend.



"There's no doubt it will be much easier to travel to Sydney next week, with a win against Gippsland under our belts," Kosmina said.

"A victory tonight will ensure we remain on top of the table, restore a bit of confidence in the boys, and possibly set up a top of the table clash next weekend."

And even though Gippsland looks to be struggling at the lower end of the ladder, the Strikers coach has still given them plenty of respect for tonight's encounter.

"They're a reasonably well organised side and they do have several players who are able to make a genuine difference," Kosmina said.

"Brian MacNicol's always a threat... Mehmet Durakovic keeps them solid at the back, while Andy Vlahos is quite comfortable in midfield.

"We certainly won't be taking them lightly because they have been known in the past to upset sides."

Talking Tactics

For a start I don't think we'll be changing things too match from how we played last week against Newcastle, because I don't think the boys played all that badly.

However I do think the bigger pitch will suit our style of play a little better, and we will certainly be trying to get outside them on the flanks and making better use of crosses into the box.

Gippsland is the sort of side that gets in there and scraps hard for their results. Like us they don't have many stars but they have plenty of players who are willing to put in the hard yards.

They like a challenge and enjoy rolling up their sleeves and getting their hands dirty, so that's the sort of match we're expecting tonight.

To combat that we're really going to have to get in there and mix it with them, but we'll have to be very careful that we don't with Kossie

lose our shape and we stick to our game plan.

The guys were extremely disappointed not to come away with the points in Newcastle last weekend, and I don't think there will be any lack of motivation for them tonight. But maintaining discipline will be a key.

WHO'S HOT

Following on from his selection in the Socceroos squad that recently played Brazil, Clint Bolton is a man oozing with confidence.

He is a picture of concentration and a solid last defensive man for Brisbane, with his skill and agility in front of goal instilling plenty of confidence in the players in front of him.

The former Young Socceroo, Olyroo and now Socceroo has been one of the standout performers for Brisbane this season, and indeed one of the top keepers in the National Soccer League.

Clint has made an exceptional start to the season, breaking the record for the most number of club games for the Strikers and conceding just nine goals in ten matches.

With that statistic behind him, Bolton boasts the second best keeping record in this year's competition and there was little wonder Australian coach Frank Farina called the 25 year old up for national team duties last month.

His consistency so far this season has been second to none and if he can continue the sort of form he has been showing for the remainder of the season, who knows where Clint Bolton will finish in the year 2000.

They also have a defensive recored to be proud of, 3rd best in the League, and have players in their ranks more than capable of causing my fellow defenders and I a few problems.





Paul Foster

He may be approaching his 32 birthday, but Paul Foster feels as though he is just starting to reach his prime as a potent striker in the National League.

Already with nine goals to his credit from the ten matches this season, Foster is a well ahead on the NSL goal scorers ladder, but he certainly is not resting on his laurels.

Born in Lismore, Paul grew up playing the round ball game with his Socceroo brother Craig, and at the age of 17 left Northern New South Wales for the AIS.

It was there that he joined up with some other familiar names such as Queenslanders John Koch and Jason Polak, and South Melbourne playmaker Paul Trimboli.

At the end of his stint with the AIS, Foster was picked up by South Melbourne, where he spent two years, before making the switch to Sunshine George Cross.

It was during his stint at Sunshine that things started to turn sour for the talented striker. Before long he had snapped his ankle and was forced to return to the AIS for rehabilitation.

A stint with the Canberra Metros in the State League led to a season in Hong Kong with Happy Valley, then another year back in the NSW State League with Avala.

From there the young striker was picked up by the Parramatta Eagles in 1993, however one season there and he was back under the knife, this time with a badly damaged knee.

"We had just made the final of the Cup and I snapped my knee three days prior to the match at training," Foster said. Another year in rehab and Foster must have begun to wonder if it was all worthwhile, but that really was not the case.

"I think it just made me more determined to get out there and succeed at the highest level I could," the quietly spoken striker said.

"I always felt that I could be a good player if I put the effort in, however I never really thought I was ever playing to my potentiall."

Following another year off, Foster again tried his luck in the Asian leagues, firstly with Tyrwhitt in Singapore and then in Hong Kong with Kitchee FC and then Instant-Dict.

The move proved to be extremely fruitful, with the talented striker finding the goal on 68 occasions during his three years in Hong Kong, each year collecting the league's Golden Boot award.

He was also selected as a guest player in the Hong Kong national team, where he played against a host of world-class outfits including AC Milan, Tottenham, Anderlecht, and the Swedish, Polish, Chilean and Nigerian national sides.

With such an extensive playing background behind him, there is little wonder John Kosmina welcomed Foster to the ranks of the Strikers after last season.

However Foster plays down the notion of professionalism.


"People get carried away with the notion of professionalism," Foster said. "The reality is that professionalism is a mindset. It's how you approach training and each game that makes someone a true professional."

Like we said, no wonder Kossie welcomed him to the squad.

Upcoming social events are also listed as well as fixtures and a results section.


One of the really nice parts to this home page is the photo gallery, conveniently located towards the top left of the home page.
