

Enjoy the game and Happy Millenium



TETREVIEW

The Brisbane Strikers sank to their third straight loss last weekend, when they tackled league leaders Sydney Olympic at Belmore Oval.

Belmore has never been a happy hunting ground for the Strikers, with the team yet to bring back three points from any visit there.

And last weekend was to prove no different for Brisbane, which was trying desperately to turn around a two-match losing streak.

From the outset it was clear Olympic had come out to impress their supporters, with the home side also enjoying the benefit of a massive breeze in the first half.

The Strikers struggled to come to terms with the hideous conditions, evident by an eightnil count in the "corners" department.

To their credit Brisbane held strong until the 42nd minute, when Olympic finally converted the pressure intso a goal.

A Gabriel Mendez free kick was not cleared successfully by the Brisbane defence, the ball falling to the feet of Pablo Cardozo, who crossed for Brett Emerton to head home.

With the wind behind them the Strikers came out much stronger in the second half. however the home side quickly adapted to the changing conditions and before long had stretched the advantage to two goals.

Playing against his old side, New Zealand International Chris Zoricich sent a looping cross to the far post, which was headed down by Zlatko Arambasic to an ever-ready Cardozo, who smashed his first time volley into the net.

Strikers coach John Kosmina praised the Olympic side, although he was a little disappointed Brisbane didn't come away with a competition point.

"They are an extremely skillful side and quite

easily one of the better teams we've come up against so far this season," the Strikers coach said.

"In saying that however, I think we probably allowed them to play a lot more than we should have and I really do think we did enough in the game to come away with a point."

The loss allowed Olympic to further their lead atop the competition table, while at the same time relegated Brisbane to fifth on goal difference.

Despite this Kosmina remains optimistic about Brisbane's performances, suggesting the side was doing exceptionally well to be placed in the top six after the first 12 rounds.

"A lot of people had written us off at the start of the year and to be where we are at the moment is testimony to the players and the club." Kosmina said.

"I've got no doubt we can turn things around. There's still 22 games to go and I think the side has a lot more winning left in it just yet."

In other round 12 action, Damien Mori sparked an amazing return to form for Adelaide Force, with a hat trick against Northern Spirit in a 3-0 win.

Newcastle surprised Perth Glory 3-2, the Football Kingz were fortunate to snatch a 3-3 draw with the Melbourne Knights, Marconi scored a solid 2-0 win over Gippsland, Parramatta downed Sydney United 2-1, with Carlton enjoying the same scoreline over South Melbourne, and Wollongong were 3-0 winners over Canberra.



Match Preview

Brisbane will come into tonight's match against the Wollongong Wolves, desperate to turn things around, following three successive losses.

After running away to an impressive lead on the NSL Table, Brisbane has stumbled in recent weeks, although the side still remains in the top six.

A victory tonight against Wollongong however, is crucial for several reasons.

Firstly it will see the Strikers return to some much-needed winning form, secondly it will keep them in the top six, and thirdly it will allow them to overtake Wollongong on the league ladder.

The task won't be an easy one for Brisbane however, with Wollongong one of the form sides of the competition and coming off a solid 3-0 victory against Canberra last week.

To complicate matters for Brisbane, not only is Nick Meredith sidelined due to suspension, the side is also possibly down on a little confidence following a series of off-field media reports.


And that is something coach John Kosmina would like to put behind the players.

"I'm starting to think some of these negative stories are having an effect on the way the boys have been playing, because quite simply, before all of the reports the team was in a very good state of harmony," Kosmina said.

But Kosmina refuses to use the current offfield drama as an excuse for the side's recent performances.

"I think we've started to complicate our game a little in recent weeks and that was evident in last weekend's loss to Olympic," the Strikers coach said.

"If we just try to simplify things and get back to basics by playing our style of football, I'm



sure we'll come up with the goods soon enough.

"In terms of tonight's game, we're expecting some very tough opposition from Wollongong.

"They are one of the form teams of the competition at present and they have some quality players amongst their ranks.

"They've got a couple of blokes who have been scoring regularly for them and there's no doubt we'll have to be at our best to come away with the win."

Up front, Sasho Petrovski and Scott Chipperfield have been in lethal form, with Petrovski just two goals short of Paul Foster on the leading scorers list.

Both netted last weekend for the Wolves and they will no doubt be looking to add to their tallies at Suncorp-Metway Stadium tonight.

Talking Tactics with Kossie

With Wollongong one of the form sides at present, we are certainly going to have to be at our best tonight.

Despite our recent losses, I think we have pin-pointed several areas that we will be working hard to improve on this evening.

The Wolves have got a good mixture of quality right across the park and their strikers have been in excellent form of late.

We will be out to mark them fairly closely tonight and we will certainly be looking to give them very little time on the ball.

That is one area where we haven't been doing as well lately and if you give quality players too much time on the ball, then they will make you pay for it.

At the same time, we'll be looking for a return to the sort of football that allowed us to go through the first nine matches of the season undefeated.

Stuart McLaren will be a key figure in defence against the Wolves

That means a return to the basics, simplifying our game and balancing up off one another, a little better than what we have done in our past few outings.

In a team, which has not really fired in the past few weeks, there are still a number of players who continue to shine despite adversity.

One of those is talented attacking utility Peter Grierson, who at 29 years of age, only this season made the step up into Australia's top competition.

Although lacking somewhat in the pace department, Grierson more than makes up for it in his technical ability.

A highly skillful player, Grierson showed he was well and truly up to the rigours of the NSL, when he scored on debut for Brisbane earlier this season.

He then followed up the following week to make it two goals from as many matches, and although he has not scored since, he still continues to be a source of inspiration for the rest of the team.

Coach John Kosmina has been using Grierson a little differently these days, by pulling him back into midfield during matches.

Despite this Grierson has adapted well and is clearly relishing the opportunity of stepping up into the National League ranks.



Peter Grierson

Listening to the man, you would think he had just stepped off a British Airways flight, two hours earlier. In fact it was six years ago, Peter Grierson moved to Australia, but his Liverpool accent is as strong as ever.

In those six years, Grierson has moved through the ranks of Queensland soccer in a fairly steady fashion.

From the local Gold Coast competition with Surfers Paradise and Broadbeach, and into the XXXX League with Gold Coast City, Grierson is now a regular in the National Soccer League with the Brisbane Strikers.

And the 29 year old is delighted with his newest challenge.

"It has been a big step up into the National League, mainly in terms of speed, fitness and certainly skill levels," Grierson said.

"But the more I play, the more I get used to the level of competition that is required."

And for that mater, it really didn't take the Englishman long to adapt to the standard of the NSL at all.

In fact it took less than 90 minutes in a Strikers jersey, for the talented striker to score his first NSL goal.

The next week he showed it was certainly no fluke, when he found the back of the net again, in just his second outing.

"In my first match I was extremely nervous and I really wanted to do the right thing by my team mates and by myself... I really didn't know how I would go," Grierson said.

"So when I scored I was delighted because it took a huge weight off my shoulders."

After two very successful stints with Gold Coast City in the XXXX League, Grierson



came into the Strikers with high expectations and big wraps from coach John Kosmina.

After nine matches in the top competition, those wraps continue to come from the Strikers coach, who has placed him technically, in the same category as South Melbourne's Paul Trimboli.

And that could explain why Kosmina has been pulling Grierson back into the midfield during his last few outings, a move that does not phase the 29 year old utility.

"I feel fairly comfortable in both positions and to be honest I really don't have a preference between either," Grierson said.

"I'm quite happy to be playing wherever 'Kossie' feels I'm best suited. So long as I can get on the pitch, I'm happy."


At 29 Grierson realises that he is a late starter in the NSL, although he believes he still has several good playing years left in him.

"I just want to keep playing at the highest level I can, and that means I just have to keep fit and continue to adjust to the standard of the NSL," Grierson said.

"I've signed a two year contract, so I guess it will be up to the club what happens after that."

Strikers Fan Mail

Dear Strikers Fan Mail

My name is George and I am a committed Strikers fan. I am13 years old and my friend and I go to every match in the rain, hail or shine with our Strikers jerseys on. We talk about the Strikers all the time at school.

But to our dismay the Strikers have started losing. We know that a big reason behind this is that crowd attendance has been averaging at 4300 people per home match, this is bad. The Strikers people in charge aren't advertising games or giving out tickets to schools who play soccer. We need crowds of about 8000 if we want any hope of making the finals.

They know that they have many loyal fans in Brisbane and they receive many emails, faxes and letters to reassure them.

It is a difficult, if not impossible task, to win EVERY game. We still believe the team has what it takes to make the top six and MORE. We hope you don't lose faith in them because they have lost two out of eleven games. The team needs its supporters to remain loyal through the good times and the bad.

The lack of crowds affects the atmosphere

at the stadium but most of our current fans are very good at cheering the team on. The concern with not having paying supporters is that we don't raise enough money to do all the advertising that people like yourself would like us to be doing nor to add all the extra entertainment trimmings.

As you can imagine advertising on the TV and major papers is extremely expensive. We do what we can on a tight budget.

This is what we have done so far this season:

- * Advertise before all home games in the Courier Mail and TV Scene
- * Advertise on Triple M radio before games
- * Send all radio stations 'Community News Lines' information on upcoming games and events
- * Players regularly attend 4KQ Big Breakfast shows on the Friday before games
- * Players perform promotional shows at shopping centres during school holidays and on request and regularly attend school and community fairs and sports carnivals
- * Four of our players currently visit state primary schools to run 1 hour fun sessions and hand out School Passes to the games. They currently attend up to two schools a day.
- * Offer Training BBQ's for public attendance
- * Offer many kids activities such as the Kids Christmas Party, Pee Wee carnival and Family Fun Day, Supporters Party and Functions.

These are just a few of the wonderful things our players and staff do to promote the team. We are very active just not financial enough to afford TV adds. You have to make money to spend money!

There is so much information on the home page that it is almost a little daunting when you first log on.


Fottballing news from around the world can be easily accessed.


An up-to-date edition of the *Laws of the Game* has been included as well as some milestones from soccer history.


