
I would like to sincerely thank all of the loyal fans who took the time to either write in or email the Strikers to voice their opinion on a possible relocation to Carrara.



Match Review

A host of cards that resulted in two suspensions has given rise to further disappointment for the Brisbane Strikers, following their 2-1 loss in Gippsland last weekend.

Jade North was sent from the field and a fourth yellow card for Jeromy Harris meant that neither player would take the field this evening against Marconi.

In a game that was described as "scrappy" rather than spiteful, by coach John Kosmina, a total of seven cards was issued, however the Brisbane coach defended the match official, suggesting he handled the match quite well.

The first sign of trouble came in the 24th minute when Jade North clashed heavily with former Socceroo Mehmet Durakovic.

"Jade's tackle was fairly aggressive and he probably deserved what he got, but that should have been the end of it," Kosmina said.

"But one of their players came in to keep going on with things and the fracas developed from there... we certainly didn't instigate the all-in... just like we didn't start things against the Melbourne Knights."

Coming off the back of a 4-0 victory against the Knights the previous week, Brisbane went into the Gippsland game full of confidence.

However Gippsland also saw the match as one they needed to win in order to stay in touch with the competition front runners.

"They're a very competitive side because they chase everything until they drop, and in the end their hunger paid dividends," Kosmina said.

It was just on 40 minutes when Gippsland's hunger first paid dividends. Durakovic sent a long ball through to former Queenslander Brian MacNicol, who chipped Clint Bolton

for the first of the home side's goals.

"They caught us on the break for their first goal... they were banging a few long balls over the top and eventually that tactic came through for them," Kosmina said.

The Falcons extended their lead in the 62nd minute after taking advantage of a free-kick, the result of Jade North's second bookable offence. From the ensuing play, Andy Vargas launched a sensational drive past Brisbane's defensive wall and into the net.

The visitors reduced the deficit with less than ten minutes to go, when Nick Meredith converted from the penalty spot, however Gippsland held on to make it two wins against the Strikers this season.

"I think we played well in patches and a draw probably would have been a fair result, but we came away with nothing and now we have to look to this week's match," Kosmina said.

Match Preview

Strikers coach John Kosmina will be forced to make a series of changes for tonight's match against Sydney glamour side Marconi Fairfield.

The reshuffle comes as a result of the suspensions of Jeromy Harris and Jade North, who both fell foul of the match official during last weekend's encounter against Gippsland.

North was automatically suspended after receiving a red card following his second bookable offence, while Harris accumulated his fourth yellow, thereby ruling him out for this evening's match as well.

Coach John Kosmina said he would more than likely bring David Pilic back into the squad, while Paul Foster will also return following a week off through suspension.

His inclusion should allow the Strikers to be a bit more potent up front, in a match that both sides really need to win.

Kosmina said it was vital for Brisbane to come away from this evening's match with the three points, because the side was facing a tough draw in the coming weeks.

"We've got an extremely tough period ahead of us, with a lot of away matches and a lot of the competition's top teams lining up to play us," the Brisbane coach said.

"The next nine weeks will certainly sort out the competition and more importantly, it will confirm our position and how we're going.

"There'll be 27 points up for grabs and I think if we're going to be there at the end we need to get at least 15 of them, but I would be happier with 20.

"It won't be easy though because we're coming up against some red hot competition... teams like Auckland, Adelaide City, Perth, Northern Spirit and Carlton."



Because of the tough draw, the Strikers coach emphasized the importance of winning and taking maximum points at home.

Traditionally Brisbane-Marconi matches have been extremely tough, and the Strikers coach is expecting nothing less this evening.

With a host of stars, Marconi is one of the most feared sides in the National League. Players such as former Socceroos Dominic Longo, Kris Trajanovski and Francis Awaratefe ensure Marconi can always pull out that little something special on most occasions, although as Kosmina pointed out, they have been anything but consistent this season.

Last weekend's 3-2 loss to the Canberra Cosmos highlighted Marconi's current plight, but it also gave Kosmina cause for concern, with respect to tonight's match.

"To be honest I haven't seen a lot of Marconi this season but I do know that they have a lot of talented players," the Brisbane coach said.

"And I know that last weekend's loss to Canberra prompted their coach Eddie Krncevic to have a bit of a whinge to his players, so I'm sure they'll be pretty fired up tonight."

Talking Tactics

Marconi is a side that has plenty of great individuals. You just have to look at their team lineup to see that.


Names like Kris Trajanovski, Dominic Longo and Brad Maloney ensure they remain a major force in the National League.

Despite this wealth of talent however, they have been extremely patchy this season, although we can't count on that tonight.

Once again it will be a case of balancing up a bit better than we did against Gippsland last weekend. If we don't balance up properly tonight, then we will have plenty of problems trying to contain a fast Marconi outfit.

With Paul Foster's return and the introduction of several other players who haven't seen much action lately, I'm confident we'll shape up well tonight.

The other thing we will be looking to improve on this evening is our ball retention in the front third of the park.



It is in this area where we have been giving away possession far too cheaply, so I would like to see a major improvement in this department tonight as well.

WHO'S HOT

Although he will be sitting out tonight's match, Jade North could not be overlooked for this week's Who's Hot section.

Despite being one of the youngest members of the squad, North has adapted well to National League condition since his arrival from the Australian Institute of Sport late last year.

That stint in Canberra seemed to have benefited the teenager greatly, with the 17 year old playing an instrumental role in the Joey's recent World Cup success.

His efforts for the Joeys in New Zealand not only impressed his Strikers coach John Kosmina, but also a host of Strikers fans.

It seems several overseas scouts also took more than just a passing interest in the youngster, following the Joeys success.

Although nothing has been set in concrete there has certainly been a number of overseas approaches regarding North.

Playing wide on the right for Brisbane, North has come into the side with renewed confidence.

At just 17 years of age he has speed and skill to burn and he is certainly a "hot" player of the future.



"Nick Meredith is probably the only other player in the side with more National League experience, but really when you look at the competition as a whole, there's a lot of other more experienced players going around."

Brought up in the far North Queensland town of Mossman, Gwynnie has and probably always will be a country boy.

The young Glenn Gwynne began playing football with the Mossman juniors at age seven and was always a defender.


He left North Queensland straight after high school, where he spent a couple of seasons with XXXX League club Taringa.

Before long, the stoic defender was given the call up into the National League with the original Brisbane United squad.

After two years establishing himself in the country's top competition, Gwynnie was lured to Sydney club Parramatta Eagles, where he really began to shine.

But after another two years Parramatta folded and the Queensland lifestyle lured him back home... this time with the new look Strikers.

In a career that has included a National League title (with the Strikers), suprisingly

"Because of the way the system is, it's hard to play for Queensland, and that is a little disappointing," Gwynnie said.

"Personally I would love to play for Queensland against the other states, but I just don't know how passionate some of the southern players are about a State of Origin type concept.


The only other thing this clear-minded defender would like to do before his career ends, is what every tough defender wants to do... deep down.
