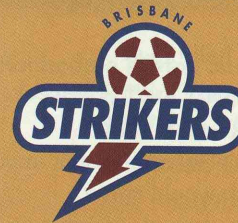

In past weeks I've touched on the philosophical reasons I believe are responsible for some of the problems that soccer has in this country. Maybe its time to get a bit more in depth and one philosophy I have is the one of unity or in the case of soccer, the lack thereof. Don't get me wrong, things can't be rosy all the time. In fact, a little bit of rebellion can be a good thing and with my history in the game I more than most would know that but I must say, the lack of unity in soccer nationally appears to have reached epidemic proportions and in an environment where our competitors are going ahead in leaps and bounds in a commercial sense, we (as a group) are falling behind.

Maybe I feel this way because of my upbringing in the game. I came through when soccer had no identity-it was "wogball", a game for "cream puffs" and pommies and we had to fight every inch of the way for even a scrap of recognition. Now it's all there in front of us, but the petty politics that have been rife in the game for so long are causing us problems.

Look at our competitors- the AFL,NRL and Rugby union. These codes have strong senior governing bodies that give those underneath direction.They, like soccer have internal problems and power struggles but they(unlike soccer) do not air them in public.They show a united front! Soccer has juniors, seniors, amateurs, womens, local federations, state federations,etc, etc-the list is endless and everybody wants their slice of the pie. All have voting power so consequently politics are brought into the decision making process where they should have no place.It's completely fragmented and will continue to be so unless administrative structural changes are made.

This is where the unity issue arises. All of the different organisations are working for the sole interest of themselves (as they should be you may argue) and the meantime the "big picture", the game as a whole is suffering. I may sound like a refugee from the "sixties" (which I am) but for the common good let's work together to give soccer the standing in Australia it has in the rest of the world.

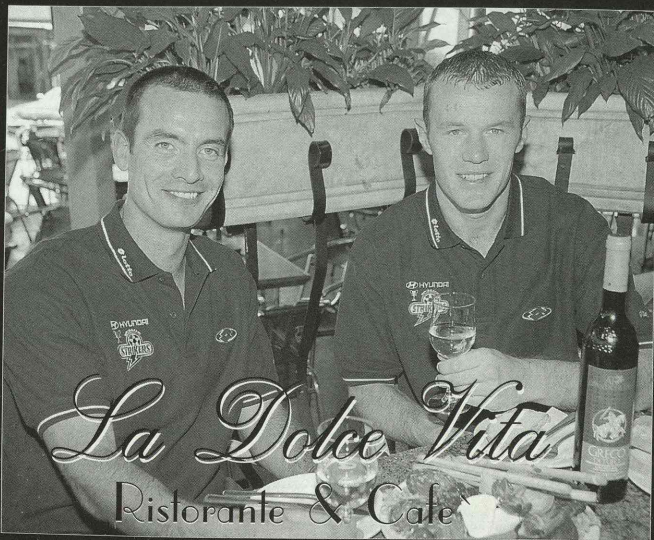

OFF THE PARK

There's more to soccer than playing a game on the weekend. There is skill, determination, hours of training and PASSION.

There are plenty of junior players out there who know this passion and LIVE THIS PASSION. They can be seen kicking the ball around in the playground at every possible opportunity, they carry around Socceroo Hackey Sacks to help improve their coordination and they sleep under a poster of their favourite player. In contrast, however, there are many schools and many children who think the Strikers are a baseball team!

In an initiative to inspire and educate primary school children throughout Brisbane and the Gold Coast, four of our elite key players have been taking soccer 'off the Park and into the Schools'.

Wade Baldwin, Andrew Davidson, Shane Smeltz and Shane Stefanutto have been visiting up to six schools a week to conduct one-hour fun skill and promotion sessions.

The players take their own equipment into the schools. This includes 30 Soccer Pals that are used to teach the children kicking

techniques and 'sweet spots'. After fun drills and skills the players organise a short match and, when possible, jump in to match it with the kids.

A visit would not be complete without the signing of autographs and handing out team posters. The students are also given Skills Brochures containing hints and games to play in the schoolyard, School Pass Application forms and 2-for-1 tickets.

Our aim is to have as many school children as possible living the passion of soccer. So far the four players have attended 36 schools and have another 26 schools on their schedule for March and April.

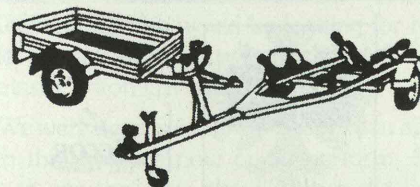
The programme has been so popular that we are extending clinics to regional areas. Several senior players are also planning a "Coaching Road Trip" to Bundaburg, Maryborough, Mackay, Townsville and Cairns during the Strikers "Off Season".

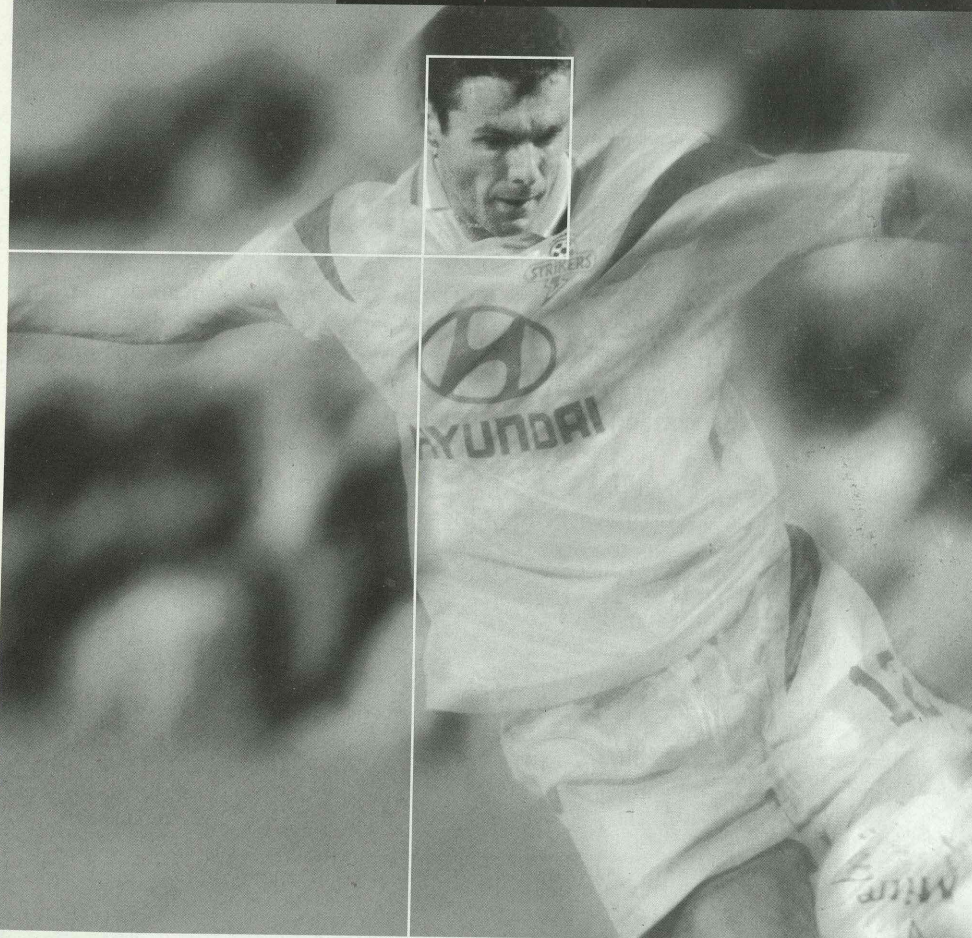

Match Preview

The match tonight against Sydney United looms as a must-win game for the Brisbane Strikers.

A spate of recent unfavourable results has seen the homieside drop six points out of the top six.

And three points against the bottom of the table Sydney United would be welcomed by all associated with the club.

However, while on paper, the Strikers seem capable of taking the points, coach John Kosmina is weary of unpredictable United outfit.

"There's a lot of rivalry between the two clubs so straight away you know it's going to be a tough match," he said.

"They (United) haven't had the best of seasons, and have been patch in their form.

"But that is something that is to be expected with an inexperienced squad... they basically had to rebuild their side at the start of the season after a mass exodus of players.

"In saying that though, when they're (United) hot they are devastating and we certainly will not be taking them lightly."

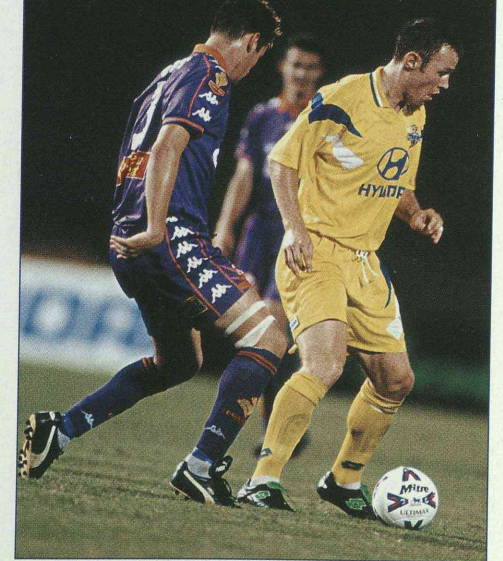
The Strikers go into this game with a full complement of players minus captain Stuart McLaren who will be serving the second week of a two-match suspension.

Kosmina said he would be looking for his side to pick up from where they left off against Carlton last week.

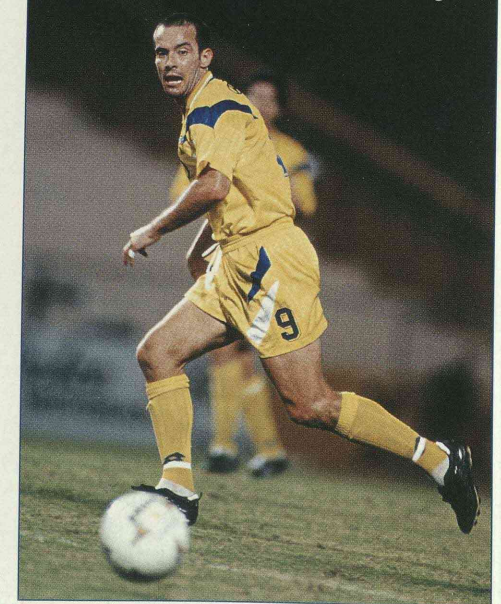
"We were dead unlucky against Carlton and with the pressure now on to perform, I'd like to see the guys play like they did last week," he said.

Stuey's Say

Frustration is a feeling soccer players often speak of when they are forced to miss matches due to injury or suspension.

This feeling taken to the extreme is what I am experiencing at the present moment, and I believe it comes down to two main reasons.

The first is simply the fact that this time of the season is the time I enjoy the most.

You suffer through pre-season looking forward to the opening game of the season, but for my money, nothing compares to the excitement of the so-called pressure situation of a tight run-in.

This, obviously, is no more applicable than our present situation of needing to win a high percentage of the nine remaining games.

The second reason for me having to tear my hair out (I have the physical evidence) is that I believe I should not even be in this position.

I am no angel as anyone who knows me will tell you, but I am not a dirty or undisciplined player and I'm sure that everyone who has watched me play this season will agree.

But what I am is someone who competes in the spirit of the game and never shirks a physical challenge.

This, however, is something I have been cautioned for on numerous occasions, resulting in my suspensions.

This is not to say that I haven't deserved some of the yellow cards but certainly not all.

I am also concerned, and it is something I shall be taking up with the Professional

Footballers Association, with the fact that we are now playing a 34 game season and still enforcing one match suspensions after only 4 cautions and further 2 match suspensions after another 3 cautions.

The most annoying aspect of this topic is that other peoples decisions can substantially affect my livelihood as after all, I play not only for the love of the game but for money also.

The only positive I can take from this is knowing that whilst on the sidelines I will be watching 11 of my team-mates doing all they can to get the 3 points and push us towards that top six.

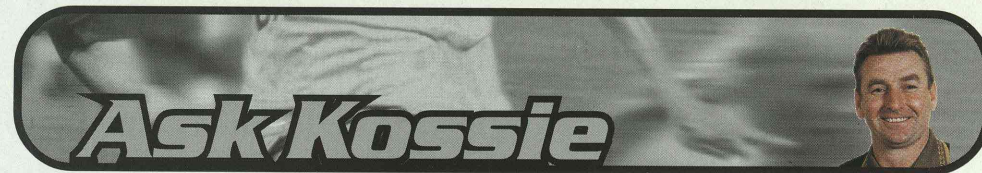

Most of these training sessions are held at Perry Park and are technical and fitness training sessions.

Some times we do team building training sessions at places like the Enoggera Army Base [Endurance & Agility], the Defensive Driving Range [Focus and Quick Reflexes] and Abseiling at Kangaroo Point [Confidence, Strength & Stamina],

Many of the players have their own fitness routine outside of training which include running, swimming, surfing [never underestimate the value of balance and fancy footwork!] and gym workouts.

All of our players have gym membership at Healthworks Gymsnasiums.

If you want to watch the Strikers training why not come along to the next training BBQ to be held on Saturday 25th March.

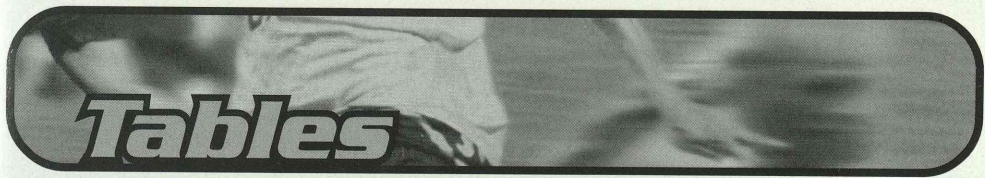
