


Mr Melville is currently employed as the Chief Executive Officer of the largest YMCA in Australia.

The people involved now are energetic. They have that naïve enthusiasm which can get things done where knowledge of the system and experiencehave failed.


If you love football in South East Queensland, or if you love the Strikers, why on earth will you not join the BSSA?

And even though Peter Grierson's wining goal came less than a minute from time, Kossie said it was a win that was thoroughly deserved.


As for tonight's opponent, the Strikers struggled to create any chances against Olympic last time the two teams met.


"We were facing our third loss on the trot and I think the lads panicked a little," Kosmina said.

Tonight we face a very classy outfit in Sydney Olympic. It is no fluke that they are third on the league ladder and have a wealth of talent in their ranks.


There midfield is especially strong with Olyroo's skipper Brett Emerton adept at catching sides on the break.
