The match will also be a great test for The Gabba before the venue is used for the Olympic Games later this year.

With the Socceroos playing, a few local matches have had to be rescheduled.

The Premier League match between Taringa and Wynnum set down for Monday, June 12 will now take place on Sunday, June 11 from 2.45pm at Jack Speare Park.

The reserves and youth matches between the two clubs have also been moved and will be played at 12.45pm and 10.45am respectively on the Sunday before the Socceroos match.

Other matches having been shifted from the Monday to the Sunday are the semi pro, reserves and youth matches between Easts and Souths at Heath Park. These games will be played at 2.45pm, 12.45pm and 10.45am.

Also on the move to the Sunday is the amateur division one match (2.45pm), plus the reserves encounter (12.45pm), between Brothers United and Darra United at Raymond Park.

Moving from the Monday to Friday, June 9 at 7.30pm is the amateur division five clash between North Pine and Southside Eagles at Bob Brock Park.

# How it was in round 13

**The Wynnum Wolves were the big movers following the completion of round 13, being the only top four side to record a victory.**

Fourth before the weekend, the Wolves are now second courtesy of their 2-1 away win over Rochedale and Gold Coast City's 4-2 defeat of Brisbane Lions at Richlands.

Leaders Brisbane City could only manage a 1-1 draw with bottom side Mount Gravatt, which has resulted in the Wolves narrowing the gap between them and the premiership favourites to six points.

Wolves coach Peter Tokesi was elated after his side's victory at Underwood Park on Saturday night.

"It's fabulous. To beat Rochedale is harder for us to beat (Brisbane) City and Lions," Tokesi said.

"Their game doesn't suit our style."

But the Wolves were able to overcome their problems quickly, taking a 2-0 lead into half-time courtesy of a Paul DeVries double.

An Alun Evans free-kick put Rochedale back in the match in the second-half, but the visitors were able to hang on for a vital victory.

The Wynnum victory put the pressure on Lions the next day when they met the Gold Coast at Lions Stadium.

Win and they would stay second. Lose and they would drop to third, two points behind the Wolves.

Unfortunately for Lions' supporters the latter situation prevailed, with the Gold Coast proving too strong.

A Neil Ferguson double and one goal each to Lee Vernon and Steve Fitzsimmons secured the three points for the Coast. Lions goals came from their deadly striking duo Sasa Radulovic and Royce Brownlie.

Coast coach Ken Lindsay said he "couldn't be happier" with the win.

"It was a very good result," he said.

"I still think we can play better."

Lindsay said the key to victory was his side's lethal efforts in front of goal.

"Our finishing was good. We took our chances well."

In contrast, Brisbane City struggled to find the net at Dittmer Park on Saturday night, courtesy of some poor finishing and a fine display of goalkeeping from Mount Gravatt's Adam Lebihan.

Mount Gravatt took a first-half lead through Max Scott, with City leaving it late to grab an equaliser courtesy of Mark Battistin.

Adding to City's off night was the second-half sending off of midfielder Nathan Carlos.

City coach Danny Wright said he was "a little bit disappointed" with the result.

"We created far too many chances to score only once," he said.

"The more the game went on, the more frustrated the players became."

Wright had a dig at the venue, saying it was difficult to play soccer "on a field like that".

"If we want the XXXX League to improve its standard we have to look at some of the fields and make sure they are up to scratch."

In the weekend's other Premier League match, Taringa recorded a good 2-1 away win over the Toowoomba Raiders at Gold Park on Sunday.

Goals to Craig Collins and Matthew Packer proved to be enough for Taringa. Brent Hyslop replied for the Raiders who have slipped to ninth on the ladder. Taringa is in seventh spot.

## PREMIER PREVIEW - Gold Coast City v Rochedale Rov

**Gold Coast City can overtake Rochedale Rovers, its opponents tomorrow night (Friday) at Palm Beach, with a win.**

Rochedale currently hold fourth spot with 22 points, one ahead of a rapidly improving Gold Coast side, the early season woes of which are a distant memory.

Gold Coast showed great form to defeat heavyweights Brisbane Lions 4-2 last Sunday at Richlands, while Rochedale lost 2-1 at home to Wynnum.

Coast coach Ken Lindsay said another victory tomorrow night was vital.

"We want to get into that top four," he said.

"If we play to our potential, we have every chance of getting a result. We have a good attitude."

Rochedale has hit a rocky patch after at one stage winning five matches straight to be just four points behind leaders Brisbane City.

Since then Rovers have lost two matches in a row to drop two spots down the ladder.

With Brisbane City moving further away Rochedale, the Peter Bannon-coached side will be desperate for victory.

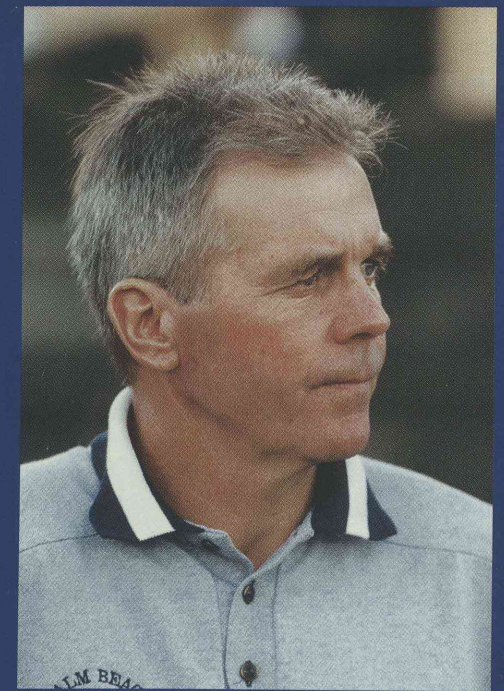
But don't be surprised if a third consecutive loss is coming Rochedale's way. Many are now tipping the Gold Coast to have the best chance of overhauling Brisbane City.

It was only last year the Coast went down to the current league leaders in the grand final. With club run semi-final series being proposed for this year, it wouldn't be surprising if these two teams met in a decider again.

## PREMIER PREVIEW - WYNNUM WOLVES v MT GRAVATT

Wynnum coach Peter Tokesi says that despite the Wolves being placed second on the Premier League ladder, they are not considered by several teams as being in the same class as Brisbane City, Brisbane Lions and Rochedale.

That's why matches such as the Wolves encounter on Saturday night against last-placed Mount Gravatt at Carmichael Park are danger games.

"Teams think they are a chance to get the points from us," Tokesi said.

"We've got to earn respect."

The Wolves are well on the way to being a side that other Premier League clubs fear. After a tough campaign last season, they have bounced back well to be currently placed second on the ladder.

In form duo Owen Filewood and Mark Alaru have proved a menace for opposing defences, as has midfielder Aaron Thiesfield, who when free of injury looks one of the league's best players.

Tokesi is wary of Mount Gravatt, saying the Hawks always gave the Wolves trouble.

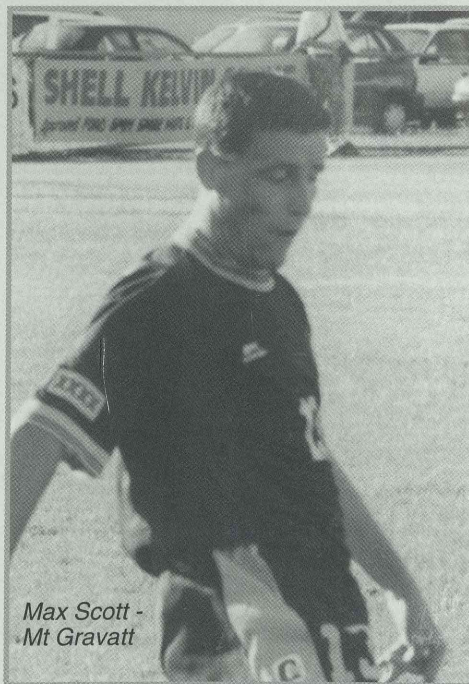
Mal Bland has done well in guiding an inexperienced Hawks line-up this season. Despite being last on the ladder, Mount Gravatt has the capabilities to trouble star outfits.

## PREMIER PREVIEW - BRISBANE LIONS v BUNDABERG WAVES

Buoyed by the recent signings Canberra Cosmos trio Robbie Hooker, Glen Kolpak and Andrew Clarke, the Bundaberg Waves will be no pushovers when they travel to Richlands to meet Brisbane Lions on Saturday night.

Refreshed after a week off, Waves could spring an upset on a faltering Lions outfit.

Lions have been patchy at best in recent outings, with last Sunday's 4-2 home loss to Bundaberg relegating the John Ogden-coached side to third on the Premier League ladder.

That's two spots and eight points behind league leaders Brisbane City, so with the season about to enter its second half, Lions cannot afford to drop too far behind their arch-rivals if they want to finish first.

Bundaberg has problems at the other end of the table. The Waves not playing last weekend allowed Taringa to move ahead of the Bundaberg side on the ladder.

Waves are now placed eighth, with 13 points from as many matches. Of greatest concern to Bundaberg coach Tony Walmsley would be the fact his side has only scored 10 goals this season, the lowest by any Premier League club.

It's for that reason that the signing of former Brisbane Strikers player Kolpak could be the acquisition of the season.

Hooker's Socceroo experience will also help seal up a leaky Waves defence that has conceded 21 goals this campaign.

Patrons are reminded that the match will kick-off at the later than normal time of 8pm.

## PREMIER PREVIEW - TARINGA ROVERS v Ipswich Knights

Taringa Rovers can make it three straight Premier League wins if they beat the Ipswich Knights at Jack Speare Park on Sunday.

The streak would be a grand achievement considering Rovers have only won three times in 13 matches this season.

One of those wins came over the Knights at Bundamba earlier this season.

Rovers have found form of late to move to seventh place, putting some space between them and cellar dwellers Mount Gravatt.

Victory on Sunday would see Taringa draw level on points with the sixth-placed Knights, who have been inconsistent all year.

Ipswich's 13-match record of five wins, one draw and seven losses has disappointed coach Frank Pimblett. Only Mount Gravatt has lost more matches.

Already five points behind fifth-placed Gold Coast, the Knights could fall even further behind the top half of the ladder with a loss this weekend.

The Knights are in desperate need of a return to fitness of playmaker Brenley Jefferd. His vision and creativity have been sorely missed.

But his hamstring injury isn't likely to have mended in time for Sunday's match.

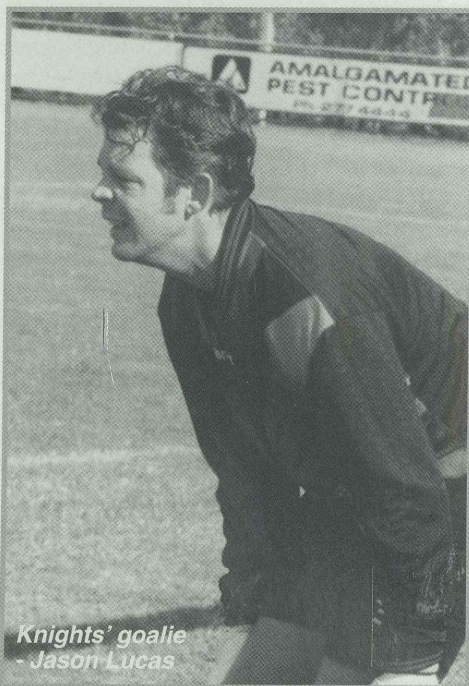
Also missing from the Knights line-up will be their leading goalscorer John Clark, who is suspended because of points accumulation.

Pimblett has the option of moving Richard Hilli forward from the midfield to partner Peter Hinks or may elect to start up front with utility Tim Reece.

## PREMIER PREVIEW - BRISBANE CITY v T'WOOMBA RAIDERS

Brisbane City coach Danny Wright says his players are "champing at the bit" to take on the Toowoomba Raiders at Spencer Park on Sunday.

Wright said his team was keen to make amends for dropping points in last Saturday night's 1-1 draw at Mount Gravatt.

"The boys want to start hitting the net again," he said.

The league leaders wasted several good chances against the Hawks, much to their coach's dismay.

But Wright is at least pleased his side is still creative in attack.

"I can't fault the players effort."

City go into Sunday's match six points ahead of nearest rivals Wynnum. The Raiders are 20 points behind the leaders in second last place.

It's been a tough season for the Toowoomba side. Two wins from just 13 matches would not please Raiders coach John Garside.

The Raiders have only managed 13 goals, with only Bundaberg Waves (10) having found the back of the net fewer times.

But Wright won't underestimate Toowoomba, knowing his side has already been punished this season for indifferent efforts against lowly-placed teams.

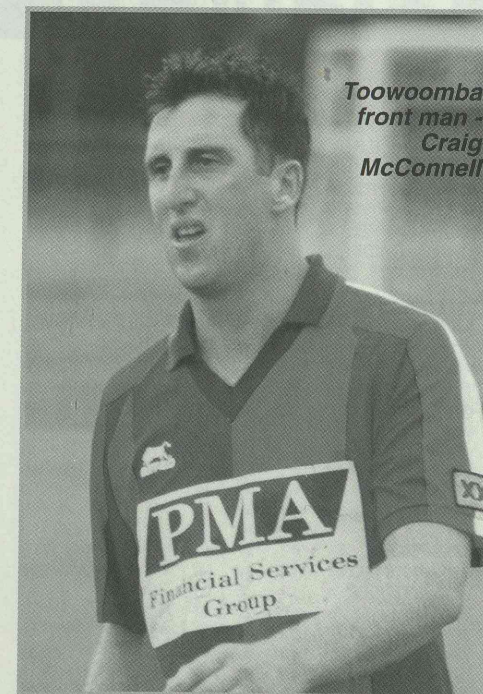
Chris Slater still isn't ready to make his return to the City line-up following a knee injury, but Wright is pleased with the progress his star striker is making.

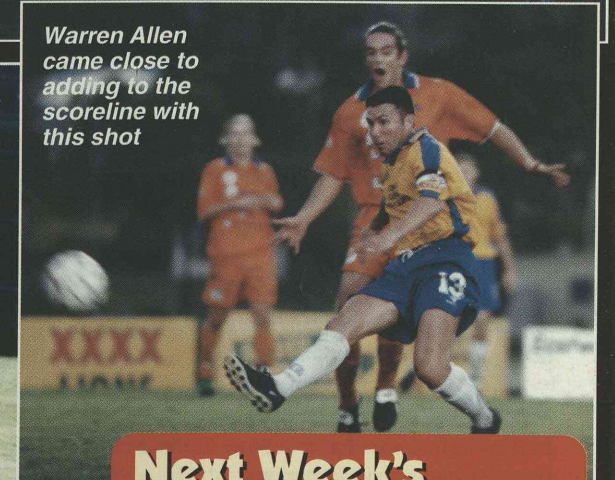

## NORTHERN SEMIPROS AND CONS

**The surprises just keep popping up in the northern semi pro competition, with North Pine handing out a 4-2 result to reigning premiers North Star.**

The result could not have come at a worse time for North Star, a side that has struggled for consistency of late.

For North Pine though, it was a real confidence booster and a result, which must give the club favouritism for this weekend's clash with The Gap, despite their impressive 8-0 victory over current champions Albany Creek.

After last weekend's results, this match has now turned into a top of the table clash, with both University and Rivers in good form.

Rivers has been grinding its victories out round by round, last week downing Newmarket 2-1, however Hagymas believes that is the sign of a good team.

The club's attack is not the most potent in the league, however Bob Hamilton has got Rivers working extremely well in defence.

"Rivers haven't lost a match since we beat them in the opening round," Hagymas said. "They're on a roll at the moment but we broke North Star's roll a few weeks back and I'm pretty confident we can do the same thing against Rivers."

Another side still well and truly in the premiership hunt is Gary McDowall's Mitchelton outfit. They had last week's bye, yet still find themselves just five points off the lead

This week they take on Newmarket, in a match that could go either way. The difference between these two sides has been that Mitchelton has come away with maximum points from most of its matches, while Newmarket has had a draw on too many occasions.

Make no mistake though, despite the apparent mismatch, these teams are a lot closer than what their ladder positions would indicate, and this encounter will be a very good spectacle.

In the only other match in the north this weekend, Albany Creek will travel to Grange Thistle on Sunday afternoon.

## SOUTHERN SEMIPROS AND CONS

**The Eastern Suburbs juggernaut rolls on in the southern competition, with the Tigers securing their biggest win yet last weekend, humbling the young Capalaba side 10-0.**

Unfortunately results like this are becoming all too common in the southern division, and with talks of a combined semi-pro competition next year, it looks as though the majority of teams in that league, should it come to fruition, will be from the north.

# Finals decision now finalised

The QSF is not running a Grand Finals/Championship series this season.

The team that finishes the premierships season in first place will be the league's best.

"The decision not to conduct grand final series this season was announced more than 12 months ago, recent submissions from clubs were considered but the Board reiterated its stance" QSF president Wallace Dann said.

"The decision was based on the need for a shortened season which would conclude prior to the staging of Olympic Football matches in Brisbane in September 2000."

Dann said in this "one-off" situation, it was considered more important to leave the home and away premierships competitions intact and to reallocate the prizemoney usually made available for grand finals to those competitions.

"The fixture calendar for season 2000 was

drawn up to allow for all competitions to finish before the end of August - an approach which has been adopted by major sports around Australia." Dann said.

"While the absence of grand finals may be disappointing we really do need to recognise that the Olympic Football matches will be a 'once in a lifetime' attraction on which all attention will be focused at the time."

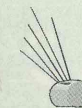
Dann said Olympic teams drawn to play in Brisbane would arrive by September 2 and would probably want some warm-up matches before the Games begin on September 13.

Clubs are welcome to run their own top four end of season competition on the proviso that all regulations pertaining to pre and post-season competitions are adhered to.

Applications to run such a competition must be received by the QSF by June 30.

One wonders whether that could be to their detriment as we get closer to the end of things.

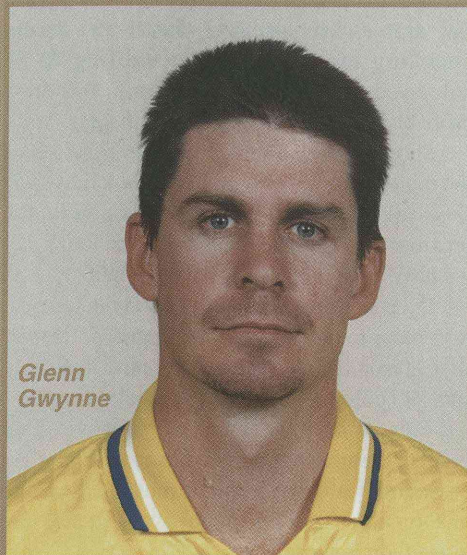
Coach Peter Tokesi certainly has the magic touch with the team and he would be preaching to his players not to get too carried away with where they are at the moment.

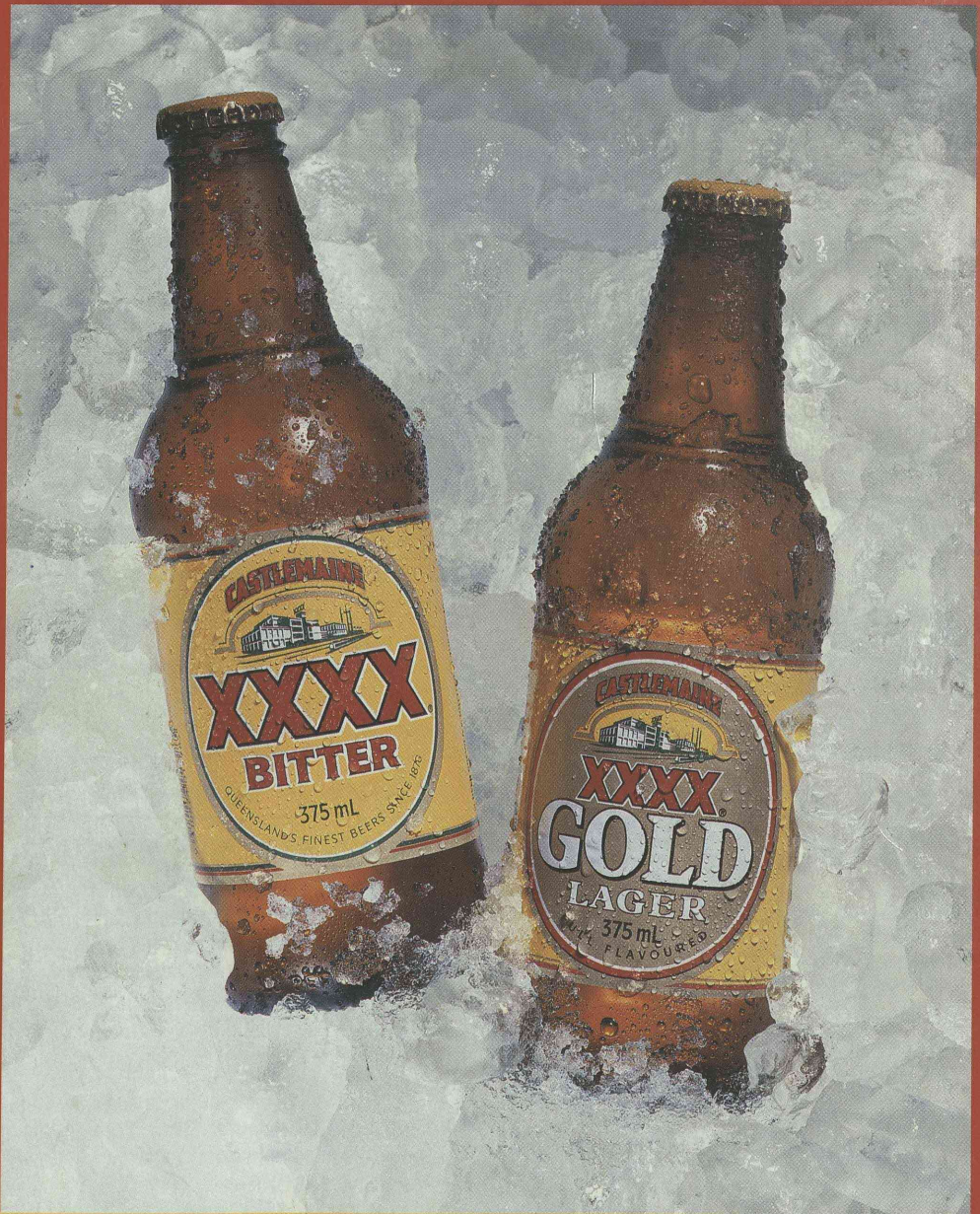
