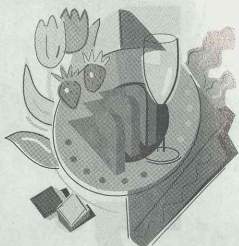

City was awarded the cup as it was leading the table at the end of round nine. Lions were running second at the time.

What happened in round 14

Bundaberg Waves coach Tony Walmsley has written to referees' boss Alan Kibbler protesting several alleged tackles from behind went unpunished in his side's 2-0 loss to Brisbane Lions at Richlands on Saturday night.

Walmsley had no qualms with the final result, saying Waves "weren't good enough on the day". But he did object to at least four first-half challenges which left his players in need of attention.

"It's not acceptable. I'm not satisfied to let that go unpunished" the Waves coach said.

"I'm not against a physical game but I'm not happy with what happened."

Two second-half goals to Royce Brownlie secured Lions victory and moved them into second place on the ladder after Wynnum's surprise 2-0 home loss to Mount Gravatt on Saturday night.

Anthony McCullough and new signing Michael Green scored Mount Gravatt's goals, with Green's effort especially satisfying because it came against his old club.

Wynnum coach Peter Tokesi said the result could come back to haunt his side come the end of the season.

"We didn't play all that well. We missed Steve Foreshaw's leadership," he said.

Foreshaw missed the match for personal reasons and will also be absent this weekend when Wynnum meets Toowoomba.

Tokesi said his side couldn't expect to win

matches when it took 80 minutes for his players to have a shot on goal.

Gold Coast City has moved into third place, ahead of Wynnum on goal difference, following a 2-0 win over Rochedale Rovers at Palm Beach on Friday night.

Goals to Tony Pearcey and Warren Allen sealed victory for the home side and condemned Rochedale to a third straight loss.

Brisbane City opened up an eight-point gap on nearest challengers Lions with a 5-1 thrashing of Toowoomba at Spencer Park on Sunday.

Barry Wilkinson scored two of City's goals, with Damien Waugh, Mark Battistin and Allan Cameron also getting in on the action. Colin Hackwood scored the visitors only goal.

City coach Danny Wright was extremely satisfied with the win.

"It's very pleasing. We kept playing good football right until the end," Wright said.

The only negative was an ankle injury to goalkeeper Mark Bland, which is expected to keep him out of the side indefinitely. The injury has given Scott Higgins the chance to cement a place as City's first-choice custodian.

In Sunday's other match, Taringa proved too strong for a disappointing Ipswich Knights outfit, winning 3-0 at Jack Speare Park.

A Darryl Hathaway header gave the home side a 1-0 lead after 39 minutes. Craig Collins doubled Taringa's lead in the 54th minute, with Craig Barnes sealing the win 14 minutes later with a cracker from 25 yards.

Southern Intermediate Cup goes East

Easts claimed the semi-pro south Intermediate Cup with a 4-2 win over Olympic on Saturday night at Heath Park.

The two sides qualified for the Cup by virtue of the fact they were placed first (Easts) and second after round nine of the competition, a time by which each side had played each other once.

In the northern semi-pro competition, the June 4 clash between North Star and University will be for the Intermediate Cup. North Star was first after nine games, with University in second place.

University will start the match as favourites, having asserted its dominance on the competition since round nine.

PREMIER PREVIEW - BUNDABERG WAVES v TARINGA ROVERS

Bundaberg Waves coach Tony Walmsley hopes seven will be a lucky number for his side when it meets Taringa Rovers at Thabeban Sports Complex Saturday night.

Amazingly, Waves have yet to win at home this season despite hosting teams on six occasions. "It's unbelievable," Walmsley said.

It's a situation the Waves coach wants eradicated, with four of his side's next five matches being played at home.

"I want to burst the bubble this weekend," he said.

But Taringa will be no pushovers. The Willie Wallace-coached side has moved away from the base of the ladder with three straight wins.

To win, Waves will need to cure their goalscoring woes. They have the worst record in the league in the goals scored section, finding the net just 10 times in 14 matches.

New signing Glen Kolpak will hope to solve the Waves problem in the goalscoring area. He's due after failing to score in his first two matches for the club.

Kolpak's former Canberra Cosmos teammate Robbie Hooker looked good in his first game for Bundaberg last weekend, with his Socceroo experience proving vital on several occasions.

Unfortunately for Waves, their third signing from Cosmos, Andrew Clarke, won't play for the club after receiving news that his ankle requires surgery.

But Walmsley said his side had enough players to cover Clarke's absence.

PREMIER PREVIEW - MT GRAVATT v Gold Coast City

Gold Coast City coach Ken Lindsay admits it won't be easy to haul in Premier League leaders Brisbane City.

But his side hasn't given up and plans to continue its great run with victory over Mount Gravatt at Dittmer Park on Saturday night.

"It's a big ask (to catch Brisbane City) but if we keep putting them in, we'll see what happens," Lindsay said.

Since losing its opening two matches of the season, the Gold Coast has only lost two of its next 12 games to be sitting third on the Premier League ladder.

"We're not getting carried away. We'll take each game as it comes," Lindsay said.

He said the signing of experienced players, including Adem Poric, Cameron Watson and Warren Allen, had helped immensely.

"They are quality players."

Lindsay isn't expecting an easy time at Dittmer Park this weekend. He knows Mal Bland's Mount Gravatt side is a much tougher proposition to beat at home.

Bland's team also proved tough to defeat away last Saturday night, prevailing 2-0 over heavyweights Wynnum at Carmichael Park.

The win would have given Mount Gravatt great confidence after a tough season. The victory also moved The Hawks off the bottom of the ladder.

A win over the Gold Coast won't be easy, particularly considering the visitors recent scalps, but it's not impossible going by some of this season's unpredictable results.

PREMIER PREVIEW - ROCHEDALE ROVERS v BRISBANE LIONS

Rochedale Rovers' season could well hinge on their clash with Brisbane Lions at Underwood Park on Saturday night.

Rovers' premiership challenge has fallen by the wayside in recent weeks courtesy of three straight losses.

The poor run has left them in fifth place, 11 points behind leaders Brisbane City. Is it a margin to great to peg back with 13 matches of the season remaining? Many would say yes.

Second-placed Lions are a much more comfortable target for Rochedale. The Richlands club is three points ahead of Rochedale, so a victory by the home side this weekend would see the sides level on points.

If Rochedale's form has been poor of late, Lions' efforts have been patchy to say the best.

"They'll want to get back in the winners' circle," he said.

"It's going to be tough. There's tough games in this league every week."

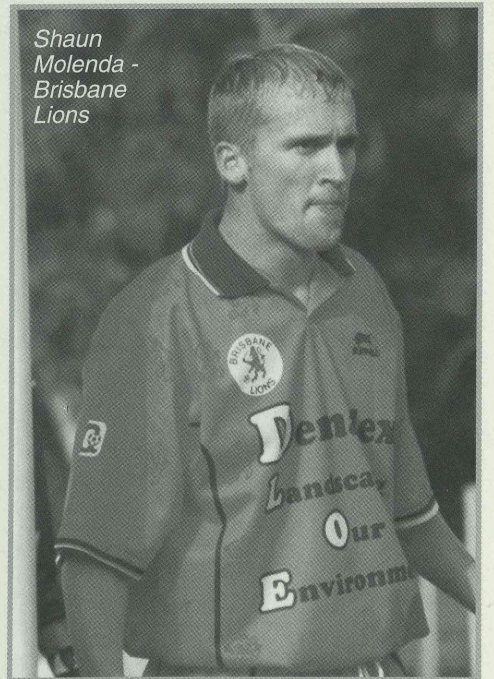
Lions will miss defender Jamie Lowndes, who will sit out the match because of suspension.

But City coach Danny Wright won't let his side become complacent, particularly this weekend at a venue where the Newmarket-based club has traditionally struggled.

"It's always a tough encounter at Ipswich," Wright admitted.

"Hopefully both sides will try to play some good football."

For the Knights to defeat City, they will have to play a whole lot better than they have recently.

They were particularly disappointing against Taringa Rovers last Sunday, with Ipswich coach Frank Pimblett questioning his players desire after the 3-0 loss.

The Knights struggled in all areas, with the services of defender Ken Caldwell and midfielder Brenley Jefferd desperately missed.

Caldwell is expected to be available this week, but a hamstring injury could again sideline Jefferd.

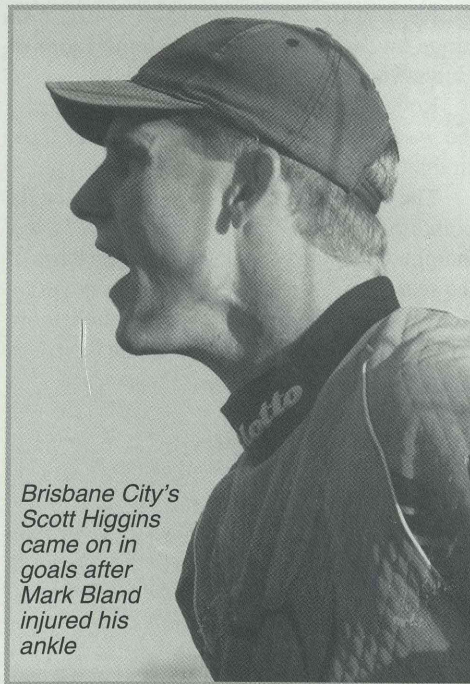
Team-mate John Clark will return to his striking role after a week's suspension.

PREMIER PREVIEW - TOOWOOMBA RAIDERS v WYNNUM

After suffering an unexpected loss last weekend, the Wynnum Wolves need to get their premiership aspirations back on track when they take on the Toowoomba Raiders at Gold Park on Sunday.

The premiership is a long way from the Raiders, who have won just twice in 14 matches this season.

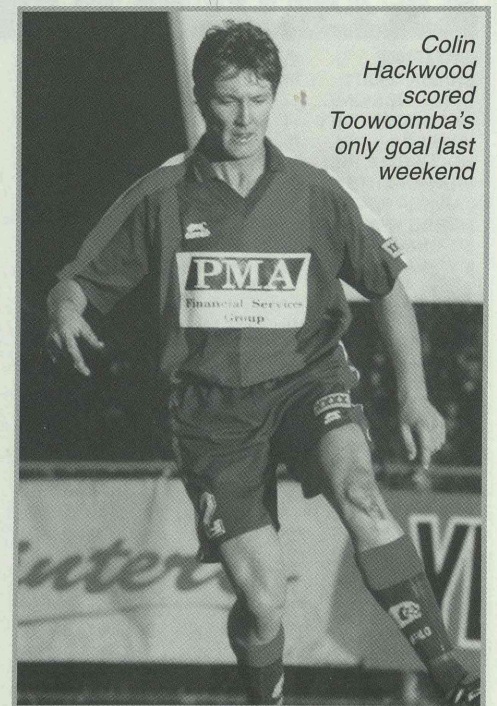
With Mount Gravatt winning last weekend, the Raiders have become favourites for the dreaded wooded spoon.

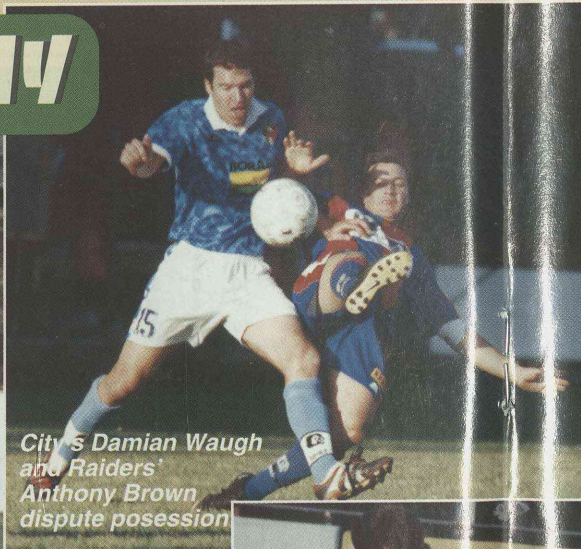

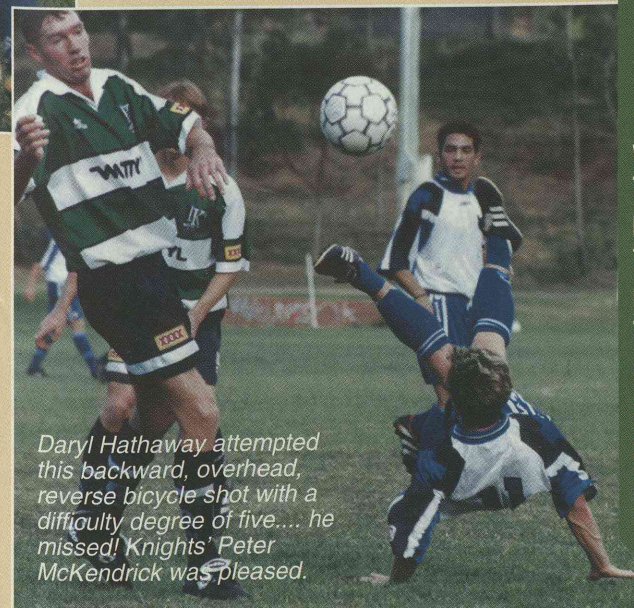

NORTHERN SEMIPROS AND CONS

Another solid victory for the University of Queensland over the weekend has allowed the students to jump out to a handy five-point lead on the northern ladder.

Their top of the table match against Pine Rivers resulted in a 2-0 victory to University, with the subsequent five-point gap on the table, confirming the students as the team to beat.

Mitchelton did themselves no favours last weekend, going down to neighbours Newmarket 1-0 and losing a genuine opportunity to mount some pressure on the competition frontrunners.

However, according to coach Gary McDowall the result was not all that surprising.

"We've got no excuses but we've got five players out at the moment and we just don't have the depth to cover those sort of losses," McDowall said.

"We took a team of kids there and they did very well but a lack of depth got the better of us in the end."

Still seething over the loss of former Socceroo striker Greg Brown, the Mitchelton coach believes his side's chances for the title were now very slim.

Brown was recently appointed director of coaching on the Sunshine Coast, resulting in the QSF taking away his playing privileges.

"The QSF told Brownly that there was a conflict of interest with him coaching and playing, but I can't for the life of me see where that conflict of interest is," McDowall said.

"I'm very disappointed with that attitude and even more disappointed that the public are losing the privilege of seeing a player of Brownly's stature go round each week.

"Besides that I think it has really put a big dent in our premiership chances. You tell me where I can go out and find a player like Brownly."

Regardless of the Brown situation, the win was a real shot in the arm for Newmarket, a side which unfortunately has not been able to string a series of victories together this season.

They will travel to North Star on Saturday night in an attempt to surprise another of the

title favourites and claim it's second win in as many matches.

Gary McDowall's Mitchelton outfit remains in the top four despite the loss to Newmarket, however they are now eight points shy of leaders University.

Mitchy take on the students this Saturday night, in a match they simply must win to have any chance of closing the gap between itself and the competition leaders.

"There's little doubt that if we lose this weekend, we can kiss our title chances goodbye, because I don't think we will be able to make up an eleven point deficit," McDowall said.

For University, Saturday night's match represents a real opportunity to consolidate its position atop the ladder and enjoy another favourable result over another top four team.

The Gap meanwhile continues to make inroads up the competition ladder, with a solid 4-2 win away against North Pine.

Victories at North Pine are always hard to come by, however that did not seem to worry the young Gap outfit last weekend.

Seemingly just out of contention at this stage, The Gap will resume its Cup campaign this weekend against tearaways Easts.

One of the more pleasing results from a spectator's perspective last weekend, came at Lanham Park where Grange Thistle held Albany Creek to a 1-1 draw.

This year has been an amazing fall from grace for Albany Creek, which after winning last year's Grand Final, looks destined to fight out the wooden spoon with Thistle.

Last weekend's point was Thistle's second for the season and still looks like the club that will carry the wooden spoon title again.

Things don't get any easier for either team this weekend, with Albany Creek hosting North Pine on Friday night and Thistle travelling to Pine Rivers on Saturday evening.

SOUTHERN SEMIPROS AND CONS

Things are becoming even more one-sided in the southern division, with Eastern Suburbs surging ahead in the competition and now enjoying a thirteen point lead over second placed Olympic United.

In another top-of-the-table clash last weekend the Tigers proved too strong once more, downing the highly fancied Olympic 4-2 to consolidate their stranglehold on this competition even further.

With the season now at the halfway point, things look grim for the other sides in the southern competition, who are really now just battling for the minor placings and credibility.

In the other round fifteen match in the south, Acacia Ridge will travel to Rocklea, also on Saturday night.

Fresh from a bye, the Ridge has lost just three matches this season and at this stage remains just outside the top four.

Victory over Rocklea would thrust them straight into the top four, marking an amazing turnaround from its efforts of last season.

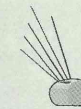

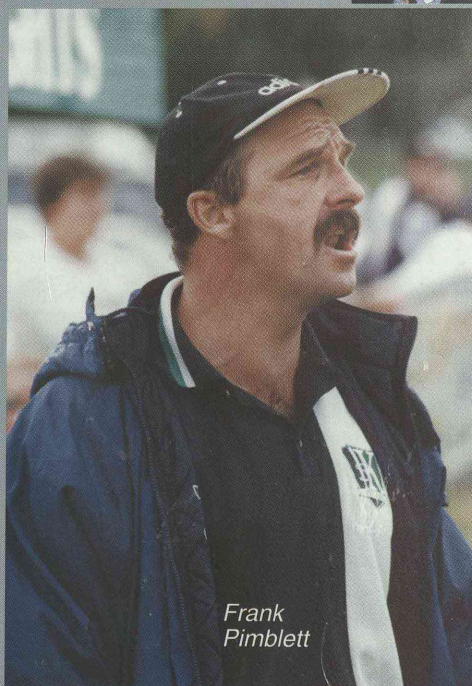
At the other end of the scale, losing becomes a habit as well.

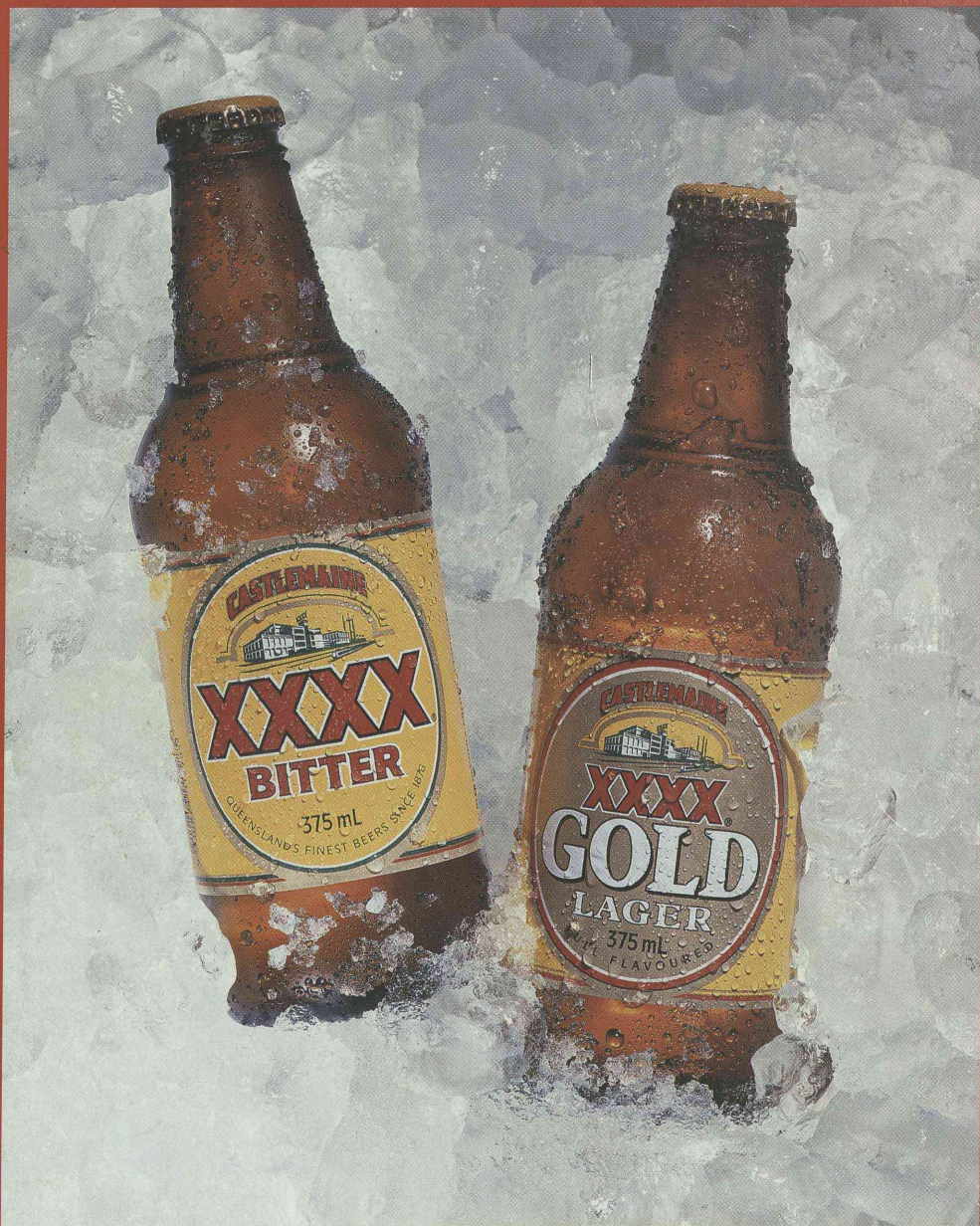
