

Editorial

Whatever happened to value for money?

Spectators who paid almost \$40 to watch Australia play Paraguay on Monday at the 'Gabba deserved a whole lot more than the players from both sides offered.

While the venue was great and the presentation of the game was excellent, the final and most important product - the game - lacked specatator entertainment.

In a dull, listless and ultimately boring encounter, neither side attempted to go for the win, and were instead concerned about not conceding a goal.

If it was a World Cup qualifying match you could understand, but it was a friendly game. That's two matches between the sides that have failed to produce a goal - not good enough, we say.

Let's hope that tonight's (Thursday) match between the teams is a little more exciting for the fans. At least one goal is all we ask for.

If Monday's match would have been like Sunday's National League grand final between Perth and Wollongong, nobody would have been complaining.

Six goals in 90 minutes was edge of the seat stuff. It's just unfortunate the match had to be decided by a dreaded penalty shootout.

But congratulations to the Wolves on their victory. Most sides would have thrown in the towel after being down 3-0 at half-time.

Condolences to the Glory, the National League's best side all season.

Why couldn't a replay have been played when scores remained deadlocked after 30 minutes of extra-time? No team deserves to lose via a penalty shootout. For several years there has been talk of a finding an alternative way of deciding matches, but no other solution has been found.

Please find a way FIFA, before too many more players have to carry the guilt with them of missing a penalty that loses their team a huge match.

The people of Perth should be congratulated for setting a National League record crowd of 43,242. While it's sad from a Brisbane point of view for the record set at Lang Park in 1997 for the Strikers v Sydney United final to be broken, it's great for the game.

What happened in Round 17

The weekend wet caused havoc for Premier League teams, with only six being able to complete their round 17 matches.

Two matches - Sunday's Toowoomba v Brisbane Lions clash and Taringa v Wynnum encounter - were postponed because the pitches at Gold Park and Jack Speare Oval were considered in too much of an unstate fit to play.

Three games were completed with probably the most surprising result being the Ipswich Knights 1-0 win over Gold Coast City on Sunday at Eric Evans Reserve, Bundamba.

After a brilliant run, the Gold Coast's premiership challenge has fallen by the wayside in the past two weeks, with successive single goal defeats against lower-placed teams.

The Knights won courtesy of an 85th minute header from their skipper Peter McKendrick. The midfielder lurked at the far post before nodding in a corner from team-mate Peter Hallett.

Despite dominating for much of the second half, the Coast could not find a way through a tough Knights defence led by Clint Scott.

Knights coach Frank Pimblett was a content man after the win, saying the aggressive Ipswich of old had returned.

Two matches were played on Saturday night, with Brisbane City and Rochedale Rovers posting good away wins.

Rochedale defeated Mount Gravatt 4-0 at Dittmer Park, with the highlight being Matt Olley's return to the goalscoring circle after a few weeks without a goal.

Olley scored twice, with the visitors other goals coming from Brad Ditton and Taro Urabe.

The win takes Rochedale into third place, ahead of Wynnum and the Gold Coast, although the Wolves have a game in hand.

Brisbane City left it until late in its match against Bundaberg at the Thabeban Sports Complex, scoring three times in the final 10 minutes to win 3-0.

Substitute Aaron Aldridge scored a double,

with former Brisbane Strikers player Mark Battistin scoring City's other goal.

City coach Danny Wright said it was a relief to take home the three points after a frustrating opening 80 minutes of the match.

"The game was tougher than the score suggests," Wright said.

"We couldn't score, which is worrying."

Wright said conditions did not help his side, with the waterlogged pitch making it hard to play good football.

"The game probably should not have been played. I was concerned about the welfare of my players."

Despite Wright's concern, it was Bundaberg player who picked up the most serious injury of the night. Recent signing Glen Kolpak may have seriously damaged his ankle.

The win extends City's lead at the top of the table over Brisbane Lions to 10 points. Lions have a game in hand, however.

Redlands changing their future

One of the achievers in the southern semi-professional competition, has been the highly under-rated Redlands outfit.

Despite starting in terrible fashion, the Red Devils have hit their straps, boasting three wins from their last three encounters.

Last week's 3-1 victory away to Olympic capped off an impressive run of form, which also included a 3-1 derby victory over Capalaba and another 2-1 win at Slacks Creek.

The turnaround has lifted Redlands on the ladder to a position where the club can mount a serious top four challenge.

The form reversal has come on the back of changes including a coaching change in the top grade and alterations in the club's administration.

It all points to a club that is getting serious about meeting important objectives.

"We want to get into a position on the ladder where we can consolidate ourselves in the semi-pro competition for the next few years," club Secretary and First Team Manager Rod Fielding said.

"We currently have more than 800 players in Juniors. Womens and Mens teams, so there's no doubt the foundations are there to build on."

In fact the club's junior ranks have proved to be the perfect feeding ground for many Premier League teams, with last year's premiership youth side providing 12 of its 16 players to the state's premier competition.

"It's unfortunate that we have this sort of player drain from the club." Fielding said.

"Certainly that is the reason we want to consolidate our spot in the semi-pro ranks and then ultimately re-enter the top league."

Off the field the club is also getting things right, having already spent \$40,000 on refurbishments to the clubhouse, with another \$150,000 to be spent later this year.

The club has just named its main field after Arthur and Alan Morris, two club stalwarts, the latter playing more than 700 first team matches for the club and was a part of Redlands only Premier League premiership side.

Lapses in concentration are proving costly for Mount Gravatt in its quest to get off the bottom of the ladder.

Hawks coach Mal Bland says scorelines such as the 4-0 result his side was on the end of against Rochedale last Saturday night are not true indications of Mount Gravatt's performance.

"We're giving away silly goals and we've got to stop doing it," Bland said.

The Hawks coach wants the rot to end on Saturday night in Bundaberg against Waves.

"I'm expecting us to win. We have to start converting our dominance that we have in matches if we want to get off the bottom of the table," he said.

Saturday's clash pits together the Premier League's two bottom sides. Waves head Mount Gravatt by just two points, so a Hawks victory would see them move away from the unwanted wooden spoon spot.

It hasn't been a great season for Waves, who have struggled to find the net all year.

Eleven goals in just 17 games is the main reason why Bundaberg is languishing near the base of the ladder.


Making matters worse for Waves is an ankle injury to star recruit Glen Kolpak, the man who was to solve Bundaberg's goalscoring woes.

Despite being beaten 3-0 by Brisbane City at home last weekend, Waves would take some positives from the match after holding the Premier League leader scoreless for the first 80 minutes of the match.

PREMIER PREVIEW - Rochedale Rov v T'wmba Raiders

Rochedale Rovers will seek a third straight win when they host the Toowoomba Raiders at Underwood Park on Saturday.

After a run of five successive victories, Rovers premiership hopes nosedived with a string of poor results.

But wins over Bundaberg and Mount Gravatt in recent weeks have moved Rochedale from fifth to third.

Rovers are 10 points behind league leader Brisbane City so few slip ups are allowable with just 10 rounds of the season remaining.

Toowoomba has had a week off because of the poor weather, so tiredness will be no excuse against a powerful, but inconsistent Rochedale.

An unlikely victory over Rovers would move Toowoomba from the foot of the table.

The Raiders are just two points ahead of lastplaced Mount Gravatt and equal on points with second-from-bottom Bundaberg.

But after the postponement of their game against Brisbane Lions last Sunday, the Raiders now have a game in hand on their wooden spoon rivals, which could be vital later in the season when last spot is determined.

The Raiders season record is three wins, five draws and eight losses from 16 matches.


It's an effort that would not please their coach John Garside, but if Toowoomba can string some results together in the last third of the season a mid-table finish is not out of reach.

He said young gun Allan Cameron "can't buy a goal" at the moment.


But such is City's depth that the club has a player the calibre of Chris Slater waiting in the wings to make a return.

PREMIER PREVIEW - Brisbane Lions v Ipswich Knights

The Ipswich Knights will seek two straight wins for only the second time this season when they meet Brisbane Lions at Richlands on Sunday.

Not since the first two weeks of the season have the Knights managed successive victories.

As a result, they are in sixth place, with their premiership chances having faded.

But the Knights will be full of confidence going into the match, having beaten Gold Coast City 1-0 at Eric Evans Reserve last Sunday.

"Bring it on. We'll be up for the game," Pimblett said.


Lions will go into the match fresh, with their scheduled match last weekend against Toowoomba being cancelled because of the wet.

PREMIER PREVIEW - Gold Coast City v Taringa Rovers

Gold Coast City's season is at the crossroads following two straight losses against teams placed below the Palm Beachbased side on the ladder.

The Coast face another lowly-placed team on Sunday when Taringa makes the trip south.

Second only a couple of weeks ago, the Coast is now placed fifth after losses to the Toowoomba Raiders and the Ipswich Knights.

The tightness of the ladder means the Coast is only two points behind second-placed Brisbane Lions, although the Richlands-based club has a game in hand.

But it's Brisbane City's position that would be most concerning to the Gold Coast.

After a great run of results, the Coast looked poised to challenge for the premiership. But the Coast's two losses have given City a 12-point jump on the Ken Lindsay-coached side.

The Coast dominated in patches against the Knights last weekend but were unable to capitalise on some good work.

The absence of stars Adem Poric and Cameron Watson proved costly in the end.

Both are expected to return to the Coast lineup for Sunday's match against a Taringa Rovers side that had last weekend off.

Rovers home match against Wynnum last Sunday had to be postponed because of the wet conditions.

Taringa's inactivity allowed Ipswich to increase its buffer in the battle for sixth spot. The Knights are now five points ahead of Taringa, but Rovers have one game in hand.

Mount Gravatt 40 years young

Mount Gravatt identities of the past and present have gathered at Dittmer Park to celebrate the proud club's 40th year anniversary.

The only thing that put a dampener on the celebrations last Saturday was the rain, which prevented a bigger crowd.

But Mount Gravatt secretary Carwyn Arnold said a great time was had by all involved.

"It was a lot of fun. It was a shame it rained, though," she said.

"It was too cold and too wet for a lot of people."

Mount Gravatt dominated Queensland soccer in the early 1980s, winning three Bill Waddell premiership trophies.

The first came in 1980, the first time the trophy was played for, with the other two premierships coming in 1981 and 1984.

The 1981 achievement was particularly special because the Hawks achieved the premiership-championship double.

Mount Gravatt also tasted success in the 1990s, winning the Ampol Cup in 1991.


The highlight of Saturday was the planting of five trees to commemorate the past, present and future of the club, which was founded in 1960.

Among those planting the trees were members of the Quinn and Peterson families, Harry Schmitz, the club's current Premier League coach Mal Bland, and club president Terry Bowness.

Despite the pouring rain, a roll call of honour was held, with Mount Gravatt stalwarts such as Stuart Woodruffe, Gordon Peterson and Bill Davis being introduced to the crowd.

Woodruffe was the club's star goalkeeper who played six times for Queensland.

Apart from the rain, the most disappointing aspect of the occasion for the Hawks was that the club's Premier League team lost 4-0 to Rochedale in the evening's main game.



Meanwhile, a benefit match for Mount Gravatt player Lincoln Greaves is set to be held at Perry Park on July 2.

Young Lincoln was seriously hurt in an onfield accident and has only recently returned home after spending several weeks in hospital.

The match, an idea of Hawks coach Mal Bland, will pit together the Brisbane Strikers and a team of Premier League All-Stars.

It is understood that Lincoln will choose the Premier League team, with at least one player expected to be chosen from each club.

All money raised from the day will go towards Lincoln's rehabilitation from his illness, which at one stage was life-threatening.

Despite the fundraising nature of the match, Bland stressed the game's sole purpose was not to raise dollars.

"It's not a money-making exercise. I just wanted to get some unity within the code," the Hawks coach said.



NORTHERN SEMIPROS AND CONS

Upsets were the order of the day last weekend, with several matches going the way of the underdogs.

The weekend's round of matches did plenty to open the competition up a little, despite the fact that there was little movement in the actual table placings at the end of the round.

That result would have done little for Thistle,

however it would have restored some confidence in the struggling North Star outfit.

The form of North Pine would indicate that another upset is on the cards. They defeated Newmarket 3-2 at the weekend and have looked good all season, so Uni can expect another tough encounter this weekend.

In the other round 18 match this weekend, Mitchelton should take the points when it travels to Albany Creek on Friday night.

Buoyed by its impressive 4-1 victory over Pine Rivers and the return of former Socceroo Greg Brown, Mitchy should have too many guns for the struggling Creek to contend with.

SOUTHERN SEMIPROS AND CONS

The upsets continued in the southern ranks of the semi-pro competition, although not on the same scale as those in the north.

The biggest surprise of round 17 came at Goodwin Park on Sunday, where Redlands upset second placed Olympic United 3-1


