

What happened in Round 18

Brisbane City's 4-0 thrashing of the Wynnum Wolves at Carmichael Park on Saturday night has kept the Danny Wrightcoached side 10 points clear of nearest rivals Brisbane Lions, who have one game in hand.

Lions had a tough 2-1 win over Ipswich Knights at Richlands on Sunday, with the Knights reduced to 10 men with half an hour remaining after striker John Clark was sent off for his second yellow card.

Rochedale Rovers remained in third place with a 2-0 win over the Toowoomba Raiders on Saturday, while the Gold Coast City moved into fourth with a 2-1 defeat of Taringa Rovers.

In the weekend's other match, Bundaberg Waves and Mount Gravatt played out a 1-1 draw at Thabeban Sports Complex on Saturday night.

Jason Chapman scored only the Waves' 12th goal this season, while Mark Davidson grabbed the Hawks goal.

At Carmichael Park, Brisbane City players Mark Battistin, Damien Waugh, Wayne Strange and Nathan Carlos each found the net.

City coach Wright said the 4-0 scoreline was a true indication of his side's dominance.

"We played well all over the park," he said.
"The conditions were difficult with the cricket pitch in the middle, but the boys carved it out."

Wright joked that "two sixes were hit" from a couple of City shots that cleared the fence and that there were a "couple of near run outs" in the middle.

City's squad has been further bolstered by the short-term signing of goalkeeper Daniel Duke, the Brisbane Strikers custodian who has recently returned from a loan stint in New Zealand with the Football Kingz.

With City 'keeper Mark Bland expected to miss the rest of the season with an ankle injury, Duke's signing will increase the pressure on current custodian Scott Higgins.

Another goalkeeper, Ipswich Knights' Jason Lucas, drew praise from his coach Frank Pimblett despite being on the losing side in Lions 2-1 victory on Sunday.

Pimblett said Lucas kept the Knights in the game against the club he left at the end of last season with some "world class" saves.

But Pimblett was disappointed with the Knights first-half effort, saying his side gave Lions' Michael Baird two "soft" goals.

Ipswich fought back after half-time reducing the deficit to one through a header from captain Peter McKendrick who later missed a penalty.

At Palm Beach on Sunday, Adem Poric scored twice on his return to the Gold Coast side, with Craig Barnes scoring a first-half goal for Taringa.

Rochedale's win over Toowoomba on Saturday night came courtesy of a Matt Olley penalty strike and a Brad Ditton goal.

Olley now has 13 goals for the season and is two ahead of Lions' striker Royce Brownlie atop the Premier League goalscoring chart.

Lincoln has not long been out of hospital after a being involved in a collision during a Premier League reserves match which left him fighting for his life.

The Greaves family has battled hard to help their son, who might again be able to play soccer

To help raise money for Lincoln's medical expenses, Mount Gravatt coach Mal Bland has organised a match between a Premier League "Dream Team" and the Brisbane Strikers.

Mount Gravatt has lost two more matches and like the Raiders, has just three wins to show for in a season entering its final stretch.


Such is the tightness at the bottom end of the table that a win to either side could see them leapfrog eighth-placed Bundaberg, which has a hard encounter against Wynnum.

PREMIER PREVIEW - Rochedale Rov v Ipswich Knights

Rochedale Rovers attempt to continue their quiet move up the Premier League ladder when they meet the Ipswich Knights at Underwood Park on Saturday night.

Without a great deal of fanfare in recent weeks. Rovers have moved from fifth to third on the table thanks to a string of positive results.

Unfortunately for Rovers the good efforts have come after several losses which put a dent in their premiership aspirations.

With nine matches of the season remaining, Rovers are 10 points behind leader Brisbane City, so more wins are needed if they are to challenge for the title.

The premiership is out of reach for the sixthplaced Knights, whose 2-1 loss to Brisbane Lions last Sunday has left them 20 points behind City.

Sunday's loss was the Knights 10th of the season, with only bottom side Mount Gravatt having lost more matches.

Knights coach Frank Pimblett knows his side must string some wins together during the final full round of matches if the Ipswich team is to break into the top half of the ladder.


Despite their loss last week, the Knights will take some confidence into Saturday's match, having defeated Rochedale at the same venue in their first game of the season.

PREMIER PREVIEW - B'berg Waves v Wynnum Wolves

The Wynnum Wolves will seek to restore some lost pride on Saturday night when they travel to Bundaberg to meet Waves.

The Wolves premiership hopes have all but ended after an embarrassing 4-0 home loss to Brisbane City at Carmichael Park last weekend.

Despite having a game in hand on the leaders, Wynnum is still 14 points behind City, which could be too much ground to make up so deep into the season.

City also has a massive goal difference advantage over the Wolves, being 27 ahead of the Peter Tokesi-coached side.

Even if they cannot catch City, Wolves will want to finish the season on a high, with Brisbane Lions, Rochedale and Gold Coast City all reachable targets.

Waves would also love to come home with a flurry in their final nine matches of the season.

It's been a hard campaign for the Tony Walmsley-coached side, which has just three wins to show for its efforts.


Waves have also just 12 goals to their name, a poor strike rate in an 18-match-old season.

The Bundaberg side has just four more matches at home, so to move away from the bottom portion of the table, one would think Waves have to get at least 10 points out of a possible 12 from their remaining games at Thabeban Sports Complex.

It will not be easy though, with several visiting teams enjoying the wide-open spaces and good surface the Bundaberg venue offers.

PREMIER PREVIEW - Gold COAST CITY V BRISDANE CITY

Brisbane City's game against Gold Coast City on Sunday at Palm Beach is the first of three matches coach Danny Wright says will make or break the leaders premiership chances.

Despite ahead of nearest rivals Brisbane Lions by 10 points, City is still not guaranteed the premiership.

Wright said good results against the Coast, Brisbane Lions and Rochedale in the next three games should go close to giving his side the title.

"It's a hard stretch for us," the Brisbane City coach said.

"We'll just take one game at a time and play each game on its merits."

Wright is expecting a tough time on Sunday against the Gold Coast, the team that Brisbane City beat last year to win the grand final.

"They're well organised and a good team. They've got a couple of good players in (Adem) Poric and (Steve) Fitzsimmons," he said.

Wright is also wary of a Palm Beach pitch he said was narrow.

"Every week there's a challenge. We just have to expect the unexpected."

Had the Gold Coast not lost two of its last three matches, Sunday's game could have had a greater bearing on the premiership.


But instead of six points behind the leaders, the Coast are 12 points adrift. This margin means a win is essential for the home side this weekend.

Brisbane City has already travelled to Palm Beach once this year, having returned to Newmaket with the three points.

PREMIER PREVIEW - Brisbane Lions v Taringa Rovers

Brisbane Lions can only do one thing if they want to catch Premier League leaders Brisbane City - keep winning.

Their next must-win match comes at Richlands on Sunday against a talented but inconsistent Taringa side.

Second-placed Lions are currently 10 points behind City, but have a match in hand on their arch-rivals.

The two teams clash on July 9 in what is shaping as a classic encounter, but until then Lions must concentrate on their battles at hand.

They kept the pressure on City with the hardfought 2-1 home win over the Ipswich Knights last weekend and need a similar result against Taringa Rovers on Sunday.

Lions coach John Ogden knows Rovers will lift for the match. Ogden left Taringa for Richlands at the start of the season and brought with him 10 players.

The sides have already met at Lions Stadium this season, with Taringa leaving with a point.

A similar result on Sunday would harm Lions' premiership chances, but would be a good reward for Taringa, which has improved throughout the season.



A House of Rep's speech

The following is a transcript of a speech given to the House of Representatives by the member for Fowler, Mrs Julie Irwin. It makes for interesting reading.

"Last weekend there were a number of major football matches held around Australia. Rugby league and AFL rounds were well covered by free-to-air television, but strangely the match, which had the largest ground attendance, was not directly broadcast on free-to-air television.

That match was not the final of the Super 12 rugby competition, but that is another story. The game that attracted a record crowd of 42,764 to Subiaco Oval in Perth last Saturday was not an AFL game.

It was nor a game of rugby league. It was a semifinal match between the Perth Glory and the Wollongong Wolves in the National Soccer League.

If the AFL grand final or the NRL grand final were not broadcast live there would be an enormous outcry.

Fans of those codes would demand that their government take action to ensure that there was live free-to-air coverage. But a commercial television network licensed by this government can turn its back on a huge viewing audience without the Minister for Communications, Information Technology and the Arts saying a word. How many viewers watch soccer?

Let me give you the facts. The 1999 AFL grand final had a viewing audience of 2.97 million. The NRL grand final had a viewing audience of 2.9 million. Compare that with the viewing audience for the Manchester United versus Australia game last year, which attracted a viewing audience of 4 million.

Why was last Saturdays soccer semifinal not broadcast live and why will this Sunday's final not be broadcast live?

Before you think about that question, I should explain the full situation. Channel 7 has an agreement with Soccer Australia giving it exclusive rights to televise soccer in Australia.

Channel 7 actually paid Soccer Australia \$25 million for exclusive rights for 10 years. So why did they not show the game live?

Why was it that, having shown highlights of every AFL game, in its sports news, Channel 7 did not show a glimpse of the soccer game?

Around the bars of soccer clubs it doesn't take much for rumours of conspiracy to get started. So when a television network with a high stake in AFL pays out big dollars for exclusive rights to soccer and then stops it from going to air, you have to wonder if there may be some truth to the rumours.

Why won't Channel 7 broadcast the final this Sunday? Take a look at its program line-up next Sunday afternoon. Channel 7 in Sydney gives us continuous AFL from 11am to 5pm six hours of AFL but no time for soccer.

Does Channel 7 want to kill off soccer in Australia? Does it want to convert all of us to Australian Football?

Fortunately, the game of soccer is bigger than the likes of Channel 7, fortunately the ABC provided a delayed telecast of highlights of last Saturday's match and will provide 55 minutes of highlights of this Sunday's final.

Fortunately, SBS provides a good coverage of Australian and international soccer.

With over 600,000 active players and at least four million fans, soccer is the biggest football code in Australia.

Surely with this level of support the semifinals and finals of the National Soccer League deserve to be declared 'classic sporting events' and therefore subject to the anti-hoarding provision of the Broadcasting Services Act.

This would force, Channel 7 to show the finals live on free-to-air TV or allow them to be shown live on ABC or SBS for a fee of \$1.

Will the minister do this in time for Sunday's match? One could hope that he is a Carlton supporter who does not mind seeing his team beaten by Wollongong live, on free-to-air TV this Sunday."



NORTHERN SEMIPROS AND CONS

In the northern competition, Michelton and The Gap were the only sides to move ahead, with drawn results in the other two key matches over the weekend.

Eastern Suburbs remains unbeaten atop the southern ladder following another victory over Redlands at the weekend.

The Tigers just managed to hold off the resurgent bayside club 2-1, a result that allowed them to increase the lead on the remainder of the competition to 15 points.

And while Eastern Suburbs continued to display its dominance over the remainder of the southern competition, Redlands continued to display encouraging signs of further improvement, even though it has in all reality come too far into the season.

A series of wins against quality opposition and the smallest margin in defeat against the undisputed title favourites has given the baysiders plenty of confidence.

The other side able to jump into outright second spot is Rocklea United, another team that has lacked consistency all year.

That defeat was Rocklea's sixth for the season and like the rest of the competition, is well out of premiership contention. Rocklea remains in a tight tussle for the minor placings.

Rocklea's opponent on Saturday night is Olympic, one of the sides in that tussle. Pride is now set to be the deciding factor in these matches for the remainder of the season.

In the remaining round 19 match this Saturday night, the Capalaba Bulldogs will be out to make it back to back victories when it travels to Slacks Creek.

After enjoying a comprehensive 3-1 win over Rocklea, the Bulldogs will go into the Slacks Creek encounter fairly confident, although Usher Park has proved to be the downfall of many sides n the past.

Enjoyment a must for Runje

One of the clubs in the semi-pro competition that does not voice its Premier League aspirations much is Souths United.

One of the more established clubs in Brisbane, Souths boasts a strong junior base and an impressive senior record over the years.

More recently the club took out last year's southern semi-pro premiership and that victory has inspired many within the club's fold to push for higher honours and attempt to eventually enter Queensland's top competition.

One man who would love to see that happen and indeed help take the club to those heights is current Souths striker Martin Runje.

"I would definitely like to take the club into the Premier League at some stage in the near future," the 28-year-old said.

"There are certainly some players in the club right now who are more than capable of playing XXXX League, but they haven't had the chance to with Souths.

"But the club has a four or five year plan in place and I think it has the right sort of foundation to launch a Premier League assault down the track."

Bold words from a man who in the early 1990's played XXXX League with Acacia Ridge, when the Ridge was in its prime.

"We had quite a good team at Acacia Ridge back then. I was only young and I gained a lot of experience playing alongside guys like Dave Richardson and Tony McVeigh," Runje said.

During his five-year stint with Acacia Ridge, Runje was partnered up front with his current striking teammate, Jason Eacott.

The young Runje also played alongside an even younger Kasey Wehrman for a six-month stint at a time when he was the club's leading goal scorer for five consecutive years.

"I had a great time at Acacia Ridge and learned a lot in my stint at the club, but after five years I was looking for a bit of a change so I moved to Logan City Kings for a while," Runje said.

Not long after his move to the Kings, Runje's new club had gone bankrupt and he was forced to find another side.

It was then that the talented forward moved into the ranks of the Commercial League with Rochedale, a playing stint that proved extremely short.

"I started to get the hunger to play more competitive football again, after half a season in the commercial league," Runje said.

"So I followed a few mates down to Souths and I've been there now for the past two seasons."

Runje said he felt there was a lot of parallels to be drawn from his previous stint with Acacia Ridge and his current time at Souths.

On the team's current title defence, the striker believes his club faces an uphill battle to pull back the 15-point deficit that currently exists between his club and the competition leaders Eastern Suburbs.

"We were able to pull back an 18 point deficit last year to storm home and take the premiership," Runje said.

"But to be honest, I think the prospects are a little lower this year. It's going to be very tough because Easts are a much classier outfit than anything that we had to come up against last year."

The experienced Souths forward said that the club was still eager to mount a successful title defence, however the goals would have to be re-evaluated somewhat if they did not begin to peg back some of the start Easts had.

"I guess the next best thing will be to play well enough to be included in the revamped competition they are currently talking about," Runje said.

"Hopefully we can pull off another title but I think we have to be a bit realistic about things."

In the meantime though, before any promotion of any sort takes place, the young carpenter/builder is just concerned about one thing... "enjoying my football"!

Versatile Clay cements defensive role at The Gap

It would be fair to assume that not too many current senior soccer players have also played senior rugby union.

It should be an excellent game and it's for a worthy cause so I'd encourage everyone who can get to the game, to do so and support it in a big, big way.



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
