Editorial

An amateur division two weekend match between Mooroondu and Bethania showed what the game of soccer truly stands for.

It's been a struggle for Mooroondu this season after losing many players earlier in the year.

Instead of withdrawing from the competition, about twelve players turnout each weekend to play for the reserves and then backup for the top team.

On Saturday afternoon at Thorneside it became a little too much for Mooroondu, with only eight players able to return to the field for the second half of the main game.

It all could have been too easy for Bethania. Leading the league by a massive margin, the Rams could have taken the opportunity to spank another team.

But in one of the kindest gestures I have ever hear about on a soccer field, the Rams decided to field only eight players so the match could be played on even terms.

The result of the match is irrelevant. The best part of Saturday's game was the sportsmanship shown by the Rams and the effort of Mooroondu to keep a team on the playing field.

It was a sign of goodwill that was unfortunately not evident between another two clubs over a recent youth match that failed to take place.

If all clubs worked together such as Bethania and Mooroondu did on Saturday, the Queensland soccer fraternity would be much happier.

Similar goodwill will be evident on Sunday when the Premier League "Dream Team" meets the Brisbane Strikers in a benefit match for unfortunate Mount Gravatt player Lincoln Greaves.

With admission being only a gold coin and no other matches having been scheduled for that day, there's no reason why there should not be a bumper crowd at Perry Park.

The time has come for Queensland soccer players, officials and fans to unite as one in a time of desperate need for a fellow comrade.

All money raised goes towards helping the Greaves family with medical bills.

What happened in Round 19

Brisbane City's lead at the top of the Premier League ladder has been cut to eight points and with nearest challengers Brisbane Lions having nine matches of their season remaining there is still hope for a close finish.

City was being held to a 2-2 draw by the Gold Coast at Palm Beach on Sunday. A little later in the afternoon Lions took advantage of their arch-rivals slip up by thrashing Taringa Rovers 4-0 at Richlands.

Should Lions win their game in hand against Toowoomba on Saturday night, City's lead will have been cut to five points.

That would make the round 20 clash in Sunday, July 9 between the two sides particularly mouth-watering, with Lions needing at least a draw to keep their premiership aspirations alive.

Royce Brownlie scored twice for Lions in their win over Taringa. He has now found the net 13 times this season.

Darren Sime and teenage sensation Michael Baird scored Lions other two goals to clinch their side's first victory over Taringa this season.

In an entertaining match at Palm Beach Mark Battistin and Allan Cameron found the net for Brisbane City, with Ian Hutchison and Adem Poric scoring for the home side.

One should not leave Rochedale Rovers out of the premiership equation. They too are eight points behind City following a 3-1 win over the Ipswich Knights at Underwood Park on Saturday night.

Michael Legg gave the home side an early lead, with the three points being cemented late in the match thanks to goals from Ross Davidson and the league's leading marksman Matt Olley.

A Peter Hinks cracker from 25 yards in the game's dying stages was the Knights' sole consolation.

The loss was sixth-placed Ipswich's 11th of the season, a number of defeats only matched by bottom team Mount Gravatt.

But it was Mount Gravatt's draw column that

grew on Saturday night after the Mal Blandcoached team was held to a 1-1 draw at home by the Toowoomba Raiders.

In the battle of the cellar dwellers, Ben Stabler gave Mount Gravatt a 1-0 half-time lead but a second-half Jason Bosward goal meant both sides had to settle for a point.

The weekend's other match saw Wynnum take on Waves in Bundaberg, with Waves running out surprise 2-0 winners on Saturday night.

A goal in each half, the first to Jason Chapman and the other to Rodney Cooper, gave Waves a much-needed victory.

The result may have irreparable damage to the Wolves premiership hopes, with the Peter Tokesi-coached side 15 points behind City.

Tokesi said his team had paid the price in recent weeks for not converting chances.

He has not given up hope of catching City, saying there was still plenty of points up for grabs between now and the end of the season.

It will be all out attack from the Premier League "Dream Team" when it meets the Brisbane Strikers at Perry Park on Sunday.

The match is being played in honour of Mt Gravatt voungster Lincoln Greaves who was seriously injured in a game on the Easter weekend.

The recovering Greaves has selected the Dream Team, drawing players from all 10 Premier League clubs.

His team inludes seven former NSL players who are more than capable of matching with the more fancied Strikers.

Greaves said his side would adopt very attacking tactics.

'We won't lose 6-0 but it could be a 6-6 draw," he said.

Greaves is likely to start with the league's leading goalscorer Matt Olley in partnership with the equally as dangerous Sasa Radulovic in attack.

He said a certain starter would be Brisbane City sweeper Demetri Theochari, who he described as "very strong" in defence.

In the other camp, Strikers coach John Kosmina said the match should be an "intense"


"The Premier League players, who will be at peak fitness, (will be) keen to match their skills against Queensland's NSL players," he said.

PREMIER PREVIEW - Taringa Rovers v Wynnum Wolves

Wynnum's premiership campaign is on the verge of falling apart after two straight losses.

It's for that reason that the Wolves round 17 catch-up fixture against Taringa Rovers on Saturday night at Jack Speare Park is a mustwin game for the Peter Tokesi-coached side.

"We're desperate to win. We've virtually got to win all our games from now on," Tokesi said.

The Wolves are currently in fifth place on 28 points. Despite having a game in hand on Brisbane City, the Wolves trail the leaders by a massive 15 points.

If they win against Taringa, the margin will have been cut to 12, a gettable target with 24 points still on offer after this weekend.

Tokesi said each of the four sides still having a reasonable shot at City must do each other favours by grabbing points off the leaders when they play them.

Gold Coast started the trend last Sunday by holding City to a draw and Tokesi wants the rest of the contenders to do the same.

For the Wolves to have a genuine shot at the title they must start to convert their chances. Their lack of finishing in recent matches has frustrated Tokesi.

"We can't do anymore than create chances. Players must finish them off," he said.

Taringa has little left to play for this season apart from avoiding the wooden spoon. A win on Saturday night would result in the side moving ahead of Bundaberg and within two points of sixth-placed Ipswich.

PREMIER PREVIEW - T'wmba Raiders v Brisbane Lions

Before worrying about what could be a premiership deciding clash between themselves and Brisbane City the following week, Lions must beat the lowly-placed Toowoomba Raiders at Gold Park on Saturday night.

Lions coach John Ogden said there was no chance his side would be looking ahead to City and treat the deferred round 17 match against Toowoomba as a certain three points.

"Toowoomba have had some good results recently and at home they're a different proposition," he said.

If Lions are to win this weekend and go on to win the title, they will do so without the services of striker Sasa Radulovic and midfielder Darren Hillier.

Radulovic has left the club to trial with several National League clubs down south, while a back injury that has sidelined Hillier for the last month is likely to keep him out for the rest of the season.

Ogden said the absence of both players would be felt, but said that it gave other players at the club the chance to shine.

One such player is 16-year-old striker Michael Baird who has made the most of Radulovic's departure.

The teenage sensation has scored three times in the past two matches, cementing his position as Royce Brownlie's striking partner.

The Raiders too have a lot to play for, with victory ensuring they would leapfrog the inactive Bundaberg Waves on goal difference.

Brisbane's Olympic Games football tournament event director Alan Vessey has welcomed the recent announcement that seven international soccer teams will play at the Gabba during the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games.

Brazil, the Czech Republic, Japan, Slovakia, South Africa, Cameroon and Kuwait will all play preliminary games at the Gabba, vying for one of two places in the quarter-final on September 23

"We are excited about hosting Brazil, the world's number one soccer nation, for three matches, and possibly a fourth, if they reach the quarterfinals," Vessey said.

"Further more, the Czech Republic, who will play two preliminary games in Brisbane, are the number two ranked soccer nation in the world and number one in Europe."

Although the quarter-final match sold out within hours of extra tickets going on sale on June 4, soccer fans can still witness the finals action from the comfort of a hospitality suite or box.

"We have a range of facilities available from eight seater boxes through to dining facilities for larger groups," Vessey said.

"We expect the hospitality boxes will be very popular with soccer clubs," he added.

Vessey said he was excited about the impact this event would have on soccer in Queensland.

"The Olympic Games represents a once-ina-lifetime opportunity for the Queensland soccer community to watch some of the best soccer players in the world in their own backyard," he said.





Nothing much has changed on the ladders of the respective semi-pro competitions following last weekend's round of matches.

Looking at the Lions' statistics it is hard to comprehend that they actually have enjoyed a win this season.

Sadly, that is the only bright statistic for the club, which is biding its time before it reaches 100 goals in the against column.

Despite its position on the ladder, Slacks Creek continues to cause other teams in the competition a bit of trouble. A 2-2 draw with Capalaba at the weekend has kept the Creek in the fight to achieve mid-table status.

With no fixtures set down for this weekend, things will remain as are for a fortinght at least, however nothing will stop Easts from taking out the southern crown.

Whether Eddie returns for the gold medal dinner at the end of the year is one question I forgot to ask him. Stay tuned for an answer to that one.


On the matter of former Gold Coast players, it was great to see a former teammate of mine from Taringa, Ian Hutchison, was back playing with the Coast.


