# Editorial

The best news of the season came last week with the announcement there would again be a Queensland team.

After a long absence the Maroons are back, and with a packed end of season program it promises to be an exciting time for Oueensland soccer.

New coach Miron Bleiberg had a tough task in selecting 30 players, but at the end of the day he has come up with a very talented squad.

While some may question Bleiberg's decision to include at least one player from every Premier League team in his initial squad, we applaud it.

It keeps everyone involved and gives some the of the Premier League's underrated players the chance to shine at a higher level.

Let's hope the fans get behind the representative program. The Queensland players deserve to have everybody cheering for them.

In other exciting news, the race for the Premier League title has well and truly come alive after a weekend of interesting results.

The major shock was Brisbane City's 2-1 loss at home to Mount Gravatt.

Danny Wright's team has faltered in recent weeks and for the first time this season looks vulnerable.

Rochedale would be kicking itself that it didn't take full advantage of the situation by only drawing 1-1 with the Wynnum Wolves.

Brisbane Lions would have been pleased by both of the above results and even happier with their own effort to defeat the Gold Coast at Palm Beach.

With five rounds to go the competition is up for grabs. City is still in the box seat but stranger things have happened than a four-point advantage being overturned.

It's with great anticipation that we wait for the latest nstallment this weekend.

## What happened in round 22

Brisbane City no longer has a mortgage on this year's Premier League title after losing 2-1 at home to cellar-dwellers Mount Gravatt at Spencer Park last Sunday.

Two rounds ago the premiership race looked to be over, with City's consistency keeping them more than two wins ahead of its closest rivals.

But successive losses have left the Danny Wright-coached team vulnerable. With five rounds remaining, City's lead has been cut to just four points by nearest contenders Brisbane Lions and Rochedale Rovers.

Rochedale missed an opportunity to reduce the margin by two when it could only draw 1-1 with Wynnum at Carmichael Park on Saturday.

Steve Foreshaw gave Wynnum a 1-0 halftime lead, before Clayton Koch gave Rovers a share of the points with a second-half strike.

Of the three premiership contenders, Lions had the best result of the weekend, with a second-half Danny Britton goal giving them a 1-0 win over the Gold Coast at Palm Beach on Saturday night.

But it was Mount Gravatt's shock win at Spencer Park that had everybody talking in the aftermath of round 22.

City appeared to be heading for a routine win after Mark Battistin gave them the lead, but two goals to Mark Davidson ensured the visitors would leave with the three points and left City coach Danny Wright depressed.

"We hit the post twice, hit the bar, had one goal disallowed, had two cleared off the line...it's unbelievable," Wright said.

"But at the end of the day it's how many you put in the back of the net that counts."

The only consolation for Wright was that his side continued to play in the style that has made City the competition's best team to date.

"I'm not in panic mode. I'd be more upset about it if we were not playing good football."

Lions coach John Ogden said was elated but "shocked" by Mount Gravatt's win.

But Ogden has said all season there were no

easy games in the competition and that any side could beat any other on a given day.

The Lions coach was rapt his side prevailed against the Coast, saying it was one of the toughest matches of the season.

Wynnum coach Peter Tokesi was disappointed to only grab a point against Rochedale.

"We deserved more out of it," Tokesi said.

The Wolves coach said Rochedale was lucky to finish with 11 players, claiming that on three occasions a Rochedale player in the last line of defence brought down one of his players. The referee only saw fit to give out one yellow card.

In the weekend's other two matches, the Ipswich Knights defeated Bundaberg Waves 1-0 at Eric Evans Reserve and Toowoomba beat Taringa 1-0 at Jack Speare Park.

Trent Griffiths scored in the 85th minute for the Knights, while a first-half goal to Colin Hackwood was enough for the Raiders.

The 22-year-old hairdresser has been following the club for about five years, the same amount of time she has been with boyfriend Steven Harboe.


Steven is a member of Samford's amateur division one team, with Lisa being a spectator at all the club's games.

The Hawks haven't had the best of campaigns, as their last-place position testifies.


But their win over City, coupled with Bundaberg's 1-0 loss to Ipswich, leaves them just two points behind Waves.

### PREMIER PREVIEW - Rochedale Rov v Gold Coast City

Can Gold Coast City be ruled out of the premiership race?

Some would say yes, others would be inclined to disagree.

Mathematically, the Palm Beach-based side still has a chance. With 15 points up for grabs, the Coast is nine behind leaders Brisbane City.

Therefore, a win over Rochedale at Underwood Park on Saturday night is vital for the Coast.

Lose and the Ken Lindsay-coached side can start planning for next season. Win and the slightest of slight hope remains.

Rochedale has a lot to play for also. Only four points behind Brisbane City, Rovers are genuine premiership contenders.

Their cause was not helped when they could only manage a 1-1 draw with Wynnum last weekend, but with Brisbane City losing 2-1 in a shock result against Mount Gravatt, Rovers lived to fight another day.

With the competition becoming tighter goal difference could eventually come into play and if that is the case, Rovers need to improve theirs.

Of the top three teams, Rovers difference of plus 14 is the worst. Lions are ahead by eight and Brisbane City by a massive 17.

### PREMIER PREVIEW - Bundaberg Waves v Brisbane Lions

Brisbane Lions have everything to play for when they meet Waves in Bundaberg on Saturday hight at Thabeban Sports Complex.

Brisbane City's two successive losses have given Lions a new lease of life.

The John Ogden-coached side is now only four points behind first-placed City and with five rounds remaining, it's a deficit that's gettable.

But Ogden does not want his side thinking about winning the premiership. He'd rather his players concentrate on one match at a time, starting this weekend against Waves.

The Bundaberg side has had a forgettable season. Just two points ahead of last-placed Mount Gravatt, there's a real chance Waves could finish with the wooden spoon.

Ogden and his players won't underestimate Waves, but if the visitors fire, the locals could be in for a long night.

If Waves are to cause an upset they must find a cure to their goalscoring woes.

The Tony Walmsley-coached side has only scored 16 goals in 22 matches this season.

That's 32 less than the league's highest scoring side Brisbane City and five fewer than the competition's second worst goalscoring team Toowoomba.

Waves had few chances last weekend against the Ipswich Knights, but had they had a proven goalscorer they may have made the most of the their limited opportunities.

Perhaps Jacob Noe will get a start this weekend. Waves looked a better side after his late introduction against the Knights.

### PREMIER PREVIEW - Ipswich Knights v Taringa Rovers

The Ipswich Knights will seek to avoid a 2000 hat-trick of losses against Taringa Rovers when the two sides meet at Eric Evans Reserve on Sunday.

Despite being placed below the Knights for the entire season, Rovers have had the wood on the Ipswich side, with two of their five wins this year coming against Frank Pimblett's team.

But Pimblett is desperate for his side to win. If the Knights do prevail, it will be only the second time this season they have strung two wins together. The other occasion was in the first two matches of the campaign.

Victory to the home side would also continue its stop-start pursuit of fifth-placed Wynnum.

With five matches of the season remaining, Pimblett is confident his side can overtake the Wolves.

The return of Andrew King will help the Knights. King is back from a knee operation he had after the season's opening match.

He made his first starting appearance since his return last Sunday in the Knights 1-0 win over Bundaberg.

Normally a defender, King was wisely used in the midfield by Pimblett, with his presence ensuring the Knights remained patient in attack on several occasions.

On the same day the Knights were winning, Taringa was losing, going down 1-0 at home to Toowoomba.

The loss has dropped Rovers to outright third last, with bottom side Mount Gravatt now just three points behind.

### PREMIER PREVIEW - Toow Mba Raiders v Brisbane City

Can the Toowoomba Raiders hand Brisbane City a third straight loss when the two sides meet at Gold Park on Sunday?

To even ask that question only a couple of weeks ago would have been ludicrous.

But it's now a very real possibility with City vulnerable after two successive defeats.

City coach Danny Wright said his players were devastated in the dressing room after losing 2-1 at home to Mount Gravatt last Sunday.

"It was like we had lost a grand final. That's how badly they took it," he said.

While City's players may be down on themselves, their Raiders counterparts are on a high after Toowoomba's 1-0 away win over Taringa last weekend.

It was only the Raiders fifth win of the season, but it has moved them into outright seventh on the ladder and keeps them within striking distance of sixth-placed Ipswich.

In the Raiders favour this weekend is that the match is being played at their home ground, a venue away teams do not enjoy having to visit.

"It's going to be a difficult game for us," Wright admitted.

A win would go a long way towards restoring Wright and his players' confidence. With five matches remaining their destiny is still in their own hands.


Unlike City's closest rivals, the Newmarketbased club doesn't have to rely on results from other matches.

## Bleiberg to coach state side

Each Premier League club is represented in the first Oueensland soccer squad named in more than two years.

Newly-appointed coach Miron Bleiberg has named an initial squad of 30 players, which is expected to be cut by at least five as the Maroons packed end of season program draws closer.

Oueensland will play in up to 10 matches. Possible opponents include Brisbane-based Olympic teams, the Olyroos, the Solomon Islands, East Timor and the Brisbane Strikers.

Bleiberg, to be assisted by former greats Kieran Cooper and Frank Mengotti, was delighted that Queensland would again have its own soccer team.

"We'll be playing more games than Oueensland has in the last 20 years. I think it will be exciting," Bleiberg said.

Bleiberg said it was important that all Premier League teams had at least one player in the preliminary squad.


He said the public would enjoy the chance to see their favourite local players do battle against some of the world's best.

Four teams - Brisbane City, Brisbane Lions, Rochedale Rovers and the Ipswich Knights have each supplied four players to the squad.

Gold Coast City, Taringa Rovers and Toowoomba each have three players in the squad, with Mount Gravatt and Wynnum each supplying two. Tony Roebuck is Bundaberg's sole representative.

There are perhaps three surprise omissions in Rochedale and former Brisbane Strikers goalkeeper Graham Ross, Gold Coast City attacker Adem Poric and Wynnum defender Steve Foreshaw, who many consider to be one of the Premier League's best players.

But there are always controversial selections and omissions when such squads are named, with the 30 players picked more than capable of holding their own in elite company.




Ross was beaten into the squad by Knights 'keeper Jason Lucas and Toowoomba custodian Trevor Gilliland.


Among the defenders preferred ahead of Foreshaw were Brisbane City's Wayne Strange, Lions' Chris Day and the Knights' Ken Caldwell.

But Bleiberg has not ruled out drafting other players into the squad, with the Knights' Clint Scott at least one player still under consideration.

## NORTHERN SEMIPROS AND CONS

While the southern semi-pro competition is now a fait accompli, competition in the north is really heating up, with the premiership race now really a race in four.

With five rounds of fixtures remaining, the University of Queensland, North Star and Mitchelton are realistically the only teams that can take out this year's northern title.

Six points separates these three sides, with Pine Rivers falling by the wayside somewhat in recent weeks, slipping ten points behind the current competition leaders the University of Oueensland.

Last week's 1-1 draw with Newmarket has seemingly put an end to Rivers campaign, even though the club is mathematically still in the hunt.

bye, with Mitchelton sitting out of fixtures last weekend and North Star set to take a week off this weekend.

That is unfortunate for North Star, a side coming off the back of an impressive 7-1 thumping of North Pine and looking to continue the momentum.

For teams like North Star, poor early season form is starting to hit home and the bye is now an unwanted enemy.

The reigning premiers will be hoping Mitchelton and the University of Queensland will not gain points this weekend, as a win for Uni would almost certainly spell the end for North Star's chances of back to back titles.

The students must travel to Pine Rivers on Saturday night for an encounter that has huge implications for the top four sides. A Uni victory would put the students in a very good position for the last four rounds, while a Rivers win would open the premiership race up even more.

The other match this weekend that could have a huge impact on the outcome of this year's competition is the clash between Mitchelton and Newmarket, also on Saturday night.

Traditionally one of the most anticipated match-ups of any season, this encounter will be a beauty, as Mitchy struggles to keep its title aspirations alive.

Newmarket has already shown it will prove to be nuisance value as the end of the season draws nearer, with last weekend's score draw against Rivers testimony to that fact.

After this weekend's round of matches, northern supporters will have a better idea on just where this year's premiership trophy will be headed.

One thing is certain though, the real competition looks as though it is just beginning.

In last week's other northern match, Albany Creek surprised The Gap by holding it to a 2-2 draw. The Creek will host Grange Thistle this Friday night, while The Gap will take on North Pine at The Gap the following evening.

### SOUTHERN SEMIPROS AND CONS

Even though the southern premiership crown is signed, sealed and delivered safely in the hands of the Eastern Suburbs Tigers, the surprises continue.


