What happened in round 24

The Premier League title is all but on its way to Newmarket after Brisbane City's clinical 2-0 victory over the Ipswich Knights at Spencer Park last Sunday.

First-half goals to Mark Battistin and Vedran Becirbegovic sealed City's win against an outclassed Knights outfit.

City now holds a six-point lead over nearest challengers Brisbane Lions and with three matches remaining, it would take an almighty slip-up from Danny Wright's team for Lions to win the premiership.

Lions coach John Ogden admits that his side had little if any chance of catching City.

He said City's seven-match winning streak at the start of the season had proved to be the difference between the two sides.

And he's right. Since then City has lost four matches. Lions have also lost four times this season, but City's ability to win, rather than draw, three extra matches has proved the difference.

Lions put a mortgage on second spot on Sunday at Richlands with a 4-2 defeat over a disappointing Rochedale.

A Royce Brownlie hat-trick ensured Lions would win. Whiz-kid Michael Baird scored Lions' other goal. Roy Huth and Matt Olley replied for Rochedale.

Brownlie has now scored 21 goals this season and seems certain to finish the year as the league's leading scorer. Olley, who has 16 goals, is his nearest rival.

Round 24's biggest upset came at Carmichael Park on Saturday night when the visiting Toowoomba Raiders upset Wynnum 2-0.

A goal in each half to Lions reject Anthony Brown sealed the Raiders win and continued their improving efforts of recent weeks.

The Wolves have been on a downward spiral in recent weeks and will battle to hold on to fifth place when they meet the Knights at Bundamba on Sunday.

At Palm Beach on Sunday, Gold Coast City turned around a 1-0 half-time deficit to defeat last-placed Mount Gravatt 3-1.

Drew Oberle gave the visitors a 1-0 lead before second-half goals to Neil Ferguson, Karl Dodd and Adam Vermillion sealed the Coast's victory.

The win gives the Coast a chance to finish the season in third place ahead of Rochedale. The margin between the sides is just two points.

In the weekend's other match, Taringa and Bundaberg played out a dull 0-0 draw at Jack Speare Park on Sunday. The season cannot end quickly enough for these two underachieving sides.

Meanwhile, Lions coach John Ogden has criticised the Queensland squad, saying the decision to pick players from all Premier League sides "cheapens" the state jersey.

"It should be called the XXXX League select-team not Queensland," an angry Ogden said.

Ogden said if a true Queensland team was picked only players from a few clubs would have been chosen.

With the Olympic teams being under 23 combinations, Ogden said a golden opportunity had been missed to match them up against a state under 23 team.

"It would be a heck of a team," he said.

"We are taking steps backwards instead of going forwards. There's no-one with any foresight."

PREMIER PREVIEW - BUNDABERG WAVES v ROCHEDALE ROV

Rochedale Rovers will play for nothing but pride when they travel to Bundaberg on Sunday to meet Waves.

Last Sunday's 4-2 loss to Brisbane Lions ended Rochedale's premiership aspirations.

With the title out of reach and a place in their own top-four competition sewn up, Rovers will go through the motions in the final two matches of the regular season.

Even if Gold Coast City pass Rochedale to finish third it won't mean much in the top-four matches.

With Brisbane City unlikely to play in the playoffs, third will play fourth in a knockout semi-final, so Rovers will meet the Coast regardless of who finishes higher on the ladder.

Sunday's game means much more to the Waves who are trying to avoid finishing last.

Their draw with Taringa last week pulled Waves a point further away from bottom side Mount Gravatt, but the difference is still only three points.

With three games left, it will be hard for Waves to achieve their coach Tony Walmsley's aim of finishing seventh but a win this weekend will give them some hope.

Bundaberg could at least move to eighth by grabbing a point this weekend, with Taringa expected to lose to Brisbane City.

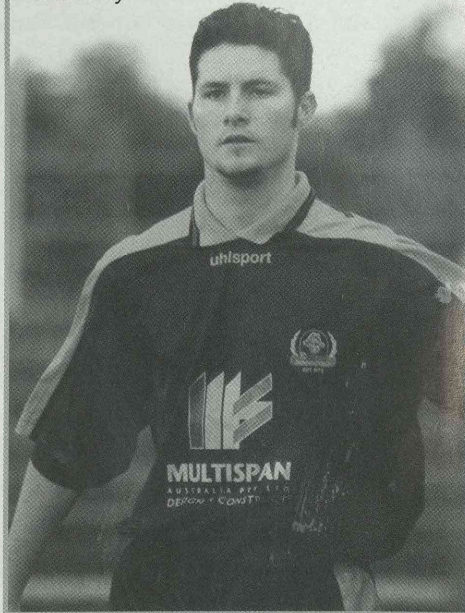
Walmsley's side has suffered from not finding the back of the net. In 24 matches, Waves have only scored 18 goals. That is four less than the side with the second worst total in the goals scored column, Taringa.

PREMIER PREVIEW - Ipsw. KNIGHTS v WYNNUM WOLVES

Fifth spot on the Premier League ladder is up for grabs when the Ipswich Knights host the Wynnum Wolves at Eric Evans Reserve on Sunday.

The Wolves currently occupy fifth but a recent slump has seen the Knights able to close the gap between the two sides to just two points.

Had the Knights upset Brisbane City at Spencer Park last Sunday they would have overtaken the Wolves, who suffered a shock 2-0 home defeat against Toowoomba.

But the Knights produced one of their worst performances of the season against the competition leaders, who could have won by five goals instead of the two that was enough to sew up the three points.

Ipswich coach Frank Pimblett was extremely disappointed with his side's performance and said he would make changes for this Sunday.

But he is again likely to be without two of his more talented players, Andrej Gacesa and Clint Scott.

Attacking young gun Gacesa will probably miss the rest of the season with a torn hamstring, while Scott, who along with goalkeeper Jason Lucas is the Knights best player, is battling a strained medial ligament in his knee.

Scott's brother Trent should return from a one-match suspension and he should add some bite to a Knights defence that struggled against City's powerful line-up.

Wynnum and Ipswich have met twice this season, with the Wolves prevailing both times.

WHO'S HOT: Knights 'keeper Jason Lucas kept his team in the game when his side struggled at Spencer Park last Sunday. The Wolves need Owen Filewood to start finding the net again.

PREMIER PREVIEW - TWOMBA RAIDERS v Gold Coast City

Gold Coast City could jump into third place on the Premier League ladder with a win over the Toowoomba Raiders at Gold Park on Sunday.

With Rochedale Rovers facing a tricky assignment in Bundaberg, the Coast could leapfrog the Peter Bannon-coached side.

But winning in Toowoomba is never easy and it's a little harder at the moment, with the Raiders enjoying good results in recent weeks.

Their 2-0 away win over the Wynnum Wolves was one of their best performances of the season.

It moved them well clear of the bottom three and has them within striking distance of sixth-placed Ipswich.

If the Knights lose to Wynnum this weekend and the Raiders upset the Coast, the margin between the Ipswich and Toowoomba sides with just two rounds to go would only be two points.

The Raiders have lost three games less than Ipswich this season, but the Knights' tendency to either win or lose (the Frank Pimblett coached-side has only drawn one of its 24 matches this season) has kept them clear.

Toowoomba has only managed to win a quarter of its matches this season, hence its placing in the lower half of the ladder.

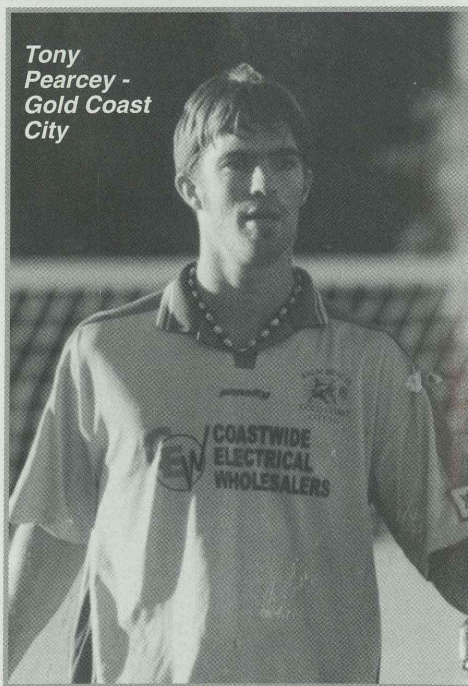
The Raiders face a tough end to the year, meeting the Coast, Brisbane Lions and Rochedale Rovers in consecutive weeks.

But with two of those matches in Toowoomba, the Raiders may grab between four to six points.

PREMIER PREVIEW - TARINGA ROVERS v BRISBANE CITY

Brisbane City could wrap up the premiership with a win over Taringa Rovers at Jack Speare Park on Sunday.

If Brisbane Lions stumble against Mount Gravatt on the same day, City can seal the title with a victory.

Even if Lions win, a City victory would virtually be enough with two rounds remaining, with the Richlands club - currently six points behind the leaders - unlikely to make up a goal difference of 12 that at the moment favours City.

City coach Danny Wright said the chance to win the premiership would be all the motivation his players need against Taringa.

But he said his side would not underestimate Rovers.

"Everyone wants to beat the champions and that's what we are after winning last year's grand final," Wright said.

Taringa had to be content with a 0-0 draw against Bundaberg last Sunday.

Only picking up a point has still left Rovers in wooden spoon danger, with bottom-club Mount Gravatt just three points away.

Unlike Rovers, City takes winning form into the match, having defeated the Ipswich Knights 2-0 at Spencer Park last Sunday.

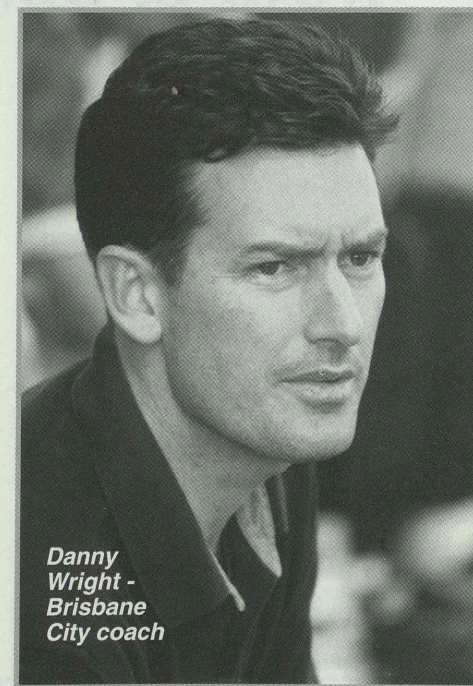
City outclassed the Knights all over the park and the margin would have been greater had the home side taken more of its numerous chances.

City coach Wright has been disappointed with his side's finishing for much of the year, despite the fact City has scored more goals (53) than any other team.

PREMIER PREVIEW - MT GRAVATT V BRISBANE LIONS

Brisbane Lions coach John Ogden has conceded that Brisbane City has the Premier League title wrapped up.

"I can't see them being beaten," Ogden said.

But City's firm hold on the premiership won't stop Ogden urging his side to win its remaining three matches of the season, starting with Sunday's clash against Mount Gravatt at Dittmer Park.

Lions are currently six points behind City and need the Newmarket-based side to have a major slip up if they are to contend for first place.

Ogden realised his side had let good opportunities to haul in City over the course of the season slip away, but he still remains pleased with his side's effort.

"We're a very young team," he said.

The Mount Gravatt side is also a young outfit, with Hawks coach Mal Bland having performed admirably to mould the inexperienced combination together.

Despite their last placing, the Hawks have troubled many sides this season and have a win over Brisbane City to show for their efforts.

With three matches of the season remaining, Mount Gravatt can still avoid the wooden spoon.

Taringa and Bundaberg are only three points ahead, so even if the Hawks picked up a point against Lions it would help their cause.

Ogden respects the Hawks for their ability and knows the match will be anything but a cakewalk.

"They give us a tough time on both occasions this year," the Lions coach said.

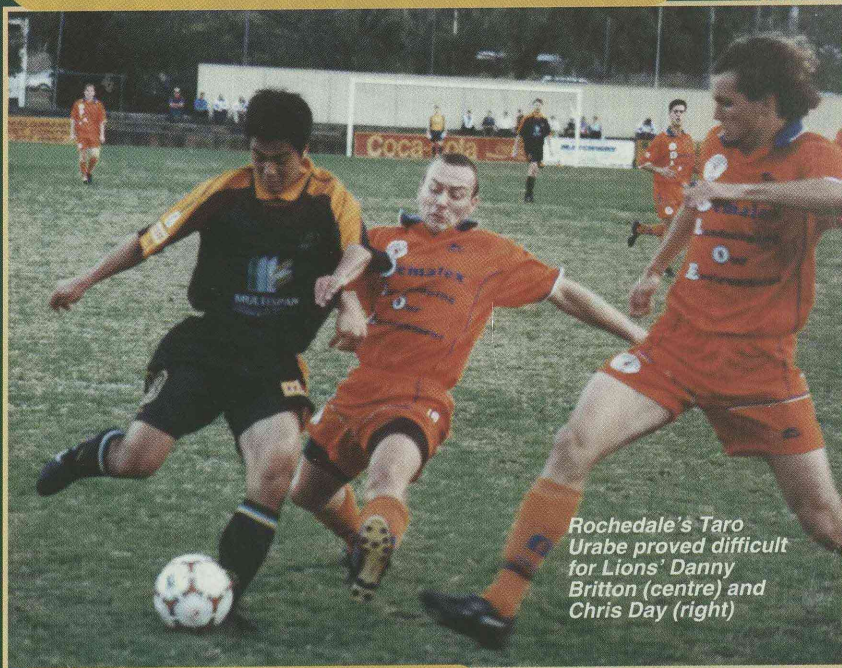

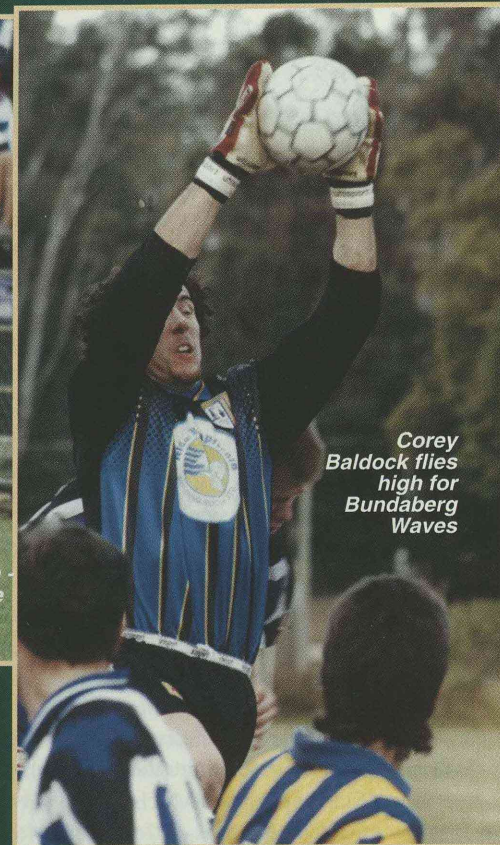

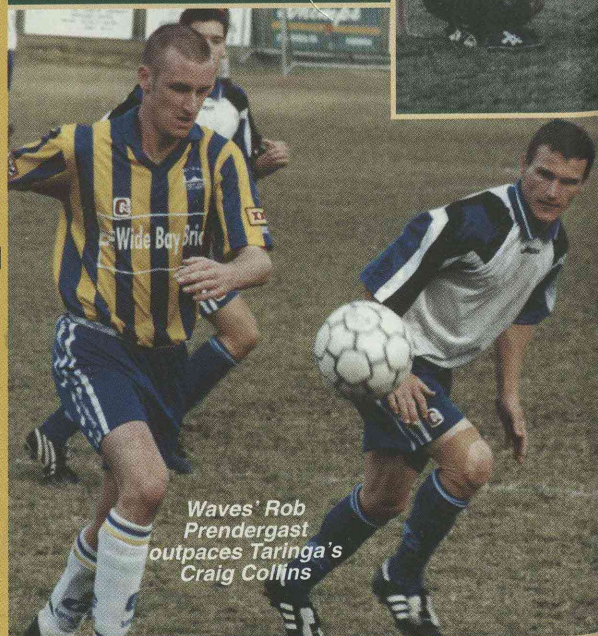

NORTHERN SEMIPROS AND CONS

The University of Queensland has taken a huge step in securing the 2000 northern premiership, after grinding out a 1-0 victory over fellow premiership contenders Mitchelton last weekend.

While not the most impressive win of the season, the victory has put six points between the students and the remainder of the competition with just three rounds remaining.

Billed as the match that could decide the title, the students needed to rally following a comprehensive 4-1 loss to Pine Rivers the previous week.

That earlier loss allowed Mitchelton, Rivers and last year's premiers North Star right back into the premiership race, but the three points gained from the Mitchelton victory has given University some breathing space in the closing stages of the season.

It also means the students really just need to win one more match to secure the premiership.

North Star leapfrogged Mitchelton to move into second spot on goal differences, after hammering Newmarket 4-0.

The current title holders will have the chance to peg back University's lead, when they host the students this Sunday afternoon.

Anything other than a win for North Star will mean ultimate failure in the club's quest for back to back premierships.

A loss to the students would hand University the crown, with the students virtually assured of the title because of superior goal difference.

A draw on the other hand would ensure North Star remained six points behind the ladder leaders with only two matches to play.

With so much riding on the match and North Star currently enjoying an excellent run of form, the Zillmere lads would have to go into Sunday's clash as slight favourites.

One team that will be praying for a University loss or even a draw between the two sides, is Mitchelton, the team that let the students slip from its grasp last weekend.

Mitchy's run home is fairly good, with the club meeting Grange Thistle this Friday night at Teralba Park and hosting Albany Creek in the final round.

The tough one for the club will be the round 26 encounter against Pine Rivers at Wendy Alison Park.

The Mitchelton boys would have to take maximum points from these matches and rely on several other results to go their way, to have the slightest hope of taking out the premiership.

Nonetheless, mathematically Mitchelton remains a premiership chance.

Rivers appear to be coming home in a flood, with the club enjoying its second big win on the trot last weekend, downing Grange 4-0.

Still seven points behind University, the premiership looks to be an uphill battle for Rivers, which travel to Albany Creek on Friday night, before clashing with Mitchelton and North Star in the finals rounds.

Like Mitchelton and North Star, Rivers' must also rely on other results to decide its final standing.

And the club cannot expect to have things all its way against Albany Creek this weekend, following the Creek's confidence boosting 4-1 victory at North Pine last weekend.

But while all of the top four clubs continue to battle for the title, the bottom line is that should University defeat North Star this Sunday, the students will win the crown.

Goal difference should see them home after a victory over North Star, however a draw against either The Gap or North Pine in the remaining rounds would seal it.

With all of the interest now focussed on the top half of the table, it's easy to forget there is one other match to be played this weekend between The Gap and Newmarket on Sunday.

Consistency has been a problem for both of these clubs throughout the season, but on their day, both can play marvelous football and fans can expect a very entertaining encounter.

SOUTHERN SEMIPROS AND CONS

Despite not even taking the field last weekend, Eastern Suburbs has maintained its unbeatable 15 point lead atop the southern semi-pro ladder.

Rocklea's shock 3-2 loss to Acacia Ridge ensured the Tigers remained five clear victories ahead of the rest of the competition, even though the club was inactive with a bye.

After wrapping up the premiership several weeks ago, the Tigers have been in cruise control in the latter stages of the season.

They have dropped several points and even suffered a loss to Capalaba a fortnight ago, however the club should be refreshed from its week off and fans could be in for a rugby scoreline when the Tigers host Beenleigh on Sunday afternoon.

The Beenleigh Lions have been on the end of a succession of hidings this year and last week succumbed 7-2 to Olympic United.

Things will probably not get any better for the club this weekend, despite the current lack of urgency being displayed by Eastern Suburbs.

Not surprisingly, the Tigers have the best attacking record in the competition and the second best defensive record. In contrast, Beenleigh has scored just 20 goals all year and let in 125, and that makes for a very lop-sided affair at Heath Park on Sunday afternoon.

And while the southern title race is over, interest is still strong amongst the next five clubs on the competition table.

Amazingly, just four points separate second spot from sixth spot, with a single point being the difference between second and fifth.

With spots set to be at a premium for any combined semi-pro competition next year, the minor placings have now taken on major significance, despite the fact that there will be no finals series.

Souths United shot back to second spot on the ladder after last weekend's 2-1 victory over

Capalaba, however Rocklea remains on equal points with Souths on 35. Percentage is the only thing separating the two clubs at present.

Olympic and Acacia Ridge are a further point behind Souths and Rocklea, with both having the chance this weekend to go past Rocklea, who will sit out of fixtures with a bye.

Further back on 31 points is sixth placed Capalaba, a club which has been in a little bit of turmoil this year, yet incredibly could still finish in second spot, should results go its way.

The Bulldogs have a fairly tough run home though, beginning with this Sunday's derby match against rival bayside club Redlands United, which has undergone a mini revival in the past couple of months.

Redlands is coming off a 1-1 draw with Slacks Creek and has had the wood on Capalaba this year, so despite the two clubs positions on the table, this match is one that could go either way.

The other interesting clash at the weekend, is the match between Olympic and Souths United at Goodwin Park on Sunday.

Again these are two sides that have developed a fairly fierce rivalry over the years and both are fighting for respect and a possible top two finish for the year.

Olympic's big win over Beenleigh last weekend was a good warmup for this match, but Souths certainly have had a tougher preparation after grinding out a 2-1 victory over Capalaba.

In the only other southern match this weekend, topsy-turvy Acacia Ridge will travel to Slacks Creek, on the back of a very impressive win over Rocklea United.

Another victory for the Ridge in this match and some favourable results in other games, could see the club move as high as second spot after the weekend of fixtures, with just two rounds remaining.

Rochedale's Rossy to retire

One of Queensland soccer's most enduring goalkeepers, Graham Ross, will retire at the end of the season, having "run out of challenges" in a game he has played since he was five-years-old.

The Rochedale Rovers and former Brisbane Strikers custodian admits he has found the going tougher this year and wants to leave the game while his "respectability" is still intact.

"It's sad for me and there's going to be a huge hole in my life," Ross said.

"I'd like to thank everybody involved with soccer in Queensland. I've made a lot of friends over the years."

Ross is happy to leave the game now on his own terms rather than have to be told his career is over.

The 32-year-old won't be lost to the game totally, however. His plans next year include to offer his expertise to other goalkeepers by becoming a 'keeper's coach at clubs keen to develop their men between the sticks.

Ross will pass on a wealth of experience. He has played 10 seasons in the Premier League and enjoyed six campaigns with the Strikers.

He rates the Strikers 1997 grand final win at Lang Park as his career highlight, despite him being reserve 'keeper behind Clint Bolton.

Other career high points include a Premier League grand final victory with Rochedale and Queensland representation.

Ironically, another sign that told Ross it was time to hang up his boots was when he was

overlooked for state selection this year by Maroons coach Miron Bleiberg.

"Miron told me he wanted to give the younger guys a chance and that was fine with me," Ross said.

But such is the regard that he is held in, Ross was asked by Bleiberg to coach the three Queensland 'keepers, Jason Lucas, Jamie Irwin and Trevor Gilliland.

Ross himself lists former Brisbane City National League goalkeeper Kim Wishart as his greatest career influence.

Wishart was Ross' goalkeeper's coach at Coalstars and when his mentor went to coach Rochedale, Ross followed.

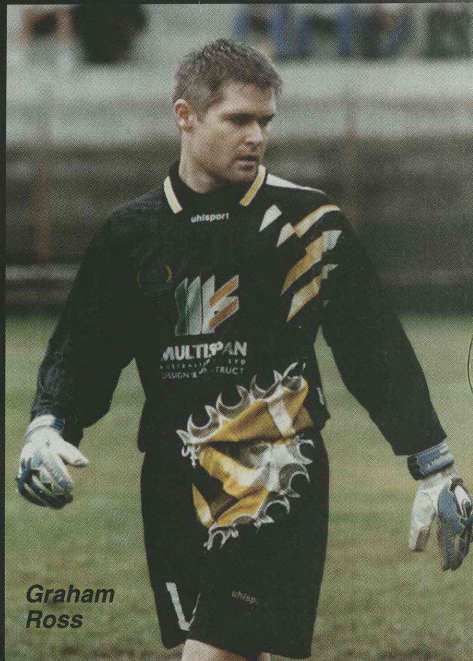
During a very distinguished senior career Ross has also played for Brisbane City and Olympic United.

Set to take over from Ross at Rochedale in his current understudy Todd Rumble.

"He (Rumble) has been the reserve goalkeeper for about three years and deserves his chance at the top level," Ross said.

As for his final season of playing, Ross rated it as a struggle for him and Rochedale.

It's official! Redlands area renewed outfit and a club hungry for semi-pro success. Just ask young goalkeeper Joe Moormann.

Even though Joe is just 20 years-old he should have some idea... he's been playing for the bayside club for thirteen years of his life.

"Yeah I've been playing for Redlands ever since the under sevens," Moormann said. "I guess you could say that I've come through the ranks at the club."

During his junior years, Moormann represented the various Brisbane South sides and played Queensland schoolboys as well.

His talents as a goalkeeper were not recognised until he was 12 years of age and the young custodian admits there are still times when he would like to get in among the midfield action.

"Sometimes it does get a bit frustrating staying at the back of the park, but I guess that's where my talents lie and for the moment I'm quite happy to play in goals for the club," Moormann said.

That comment represents a major change in attitude for the youngster, who only a matter of weeks earlier was looking hard for another club.

"Things have not been all that harmonious at the club particularly in recent months," Moormann said. "There's been a lot of rubbish going on off the field and I think that has reflected on our on-field performances."

"As a club we've lost quite a few players over the past few seasons mainly because of coaching changes and the like, so there has been a lack of stability in the club.

"I was even looking at leaving the club myself earlier this season, but since Phil Kerr's become involved at the coaching level, my attitude and that of a few of the other players has changed considerably.

"Phil's brought a lot of coaching experience with him, including a stint with Beenleigh in

the XXXX League and that has shown in our intensity and professionalism in the past few months or so."

During Kerr's time at the coaching helm, Redlands have strung together plenty of wins and narrowly went down 2-1 to the competition leaders Easts.

However, Moormann believes it is more than just the coaching change that has led to Redlands positive recent results.

"I think the club has started to realise that on-field success can translate into off-field success, and because of that the club's hierarchy has adopted a far more professional approach themselves," the Redlands custodian said.

"Now we're being provided with proper physios and the facilities are being upgraded and that is all good for the club."

With so many changes taking place at the club, it appears Redlands has changed its objectives somewhat also, with the emphasis now on climbing the ladder and remaining competitive for the remainder of the season.

"There's no doubt we can be competitive in this competition and climb above several more teams before the season's out," Moormann said.

"The club has plenty of talent, which isn't surprising when you look at our junior base and even in the first team there are plenty of players who could step up to the Premier League."

Moormann himself has not ruled that possibility out either, whether it be with Redlands or an existing Premier League club.

"I do think that Redlands have the potential to re-enter the Premier League and of course I have ambitions to play Premier League some time soon, however if the chance doesn't come up with Redlands in the next few years, I will have to look at my options," Moormann said.

"The key for the club in the next few years however is to retain its youth players, because at the moment we just seem to be acting as a feeder club to the rest of the Premier League."

Sally Hayes, Southside Eagles' entrant in this year's Miss Queensland Soccer Quest, says she has found the experience "quite enjoyable".

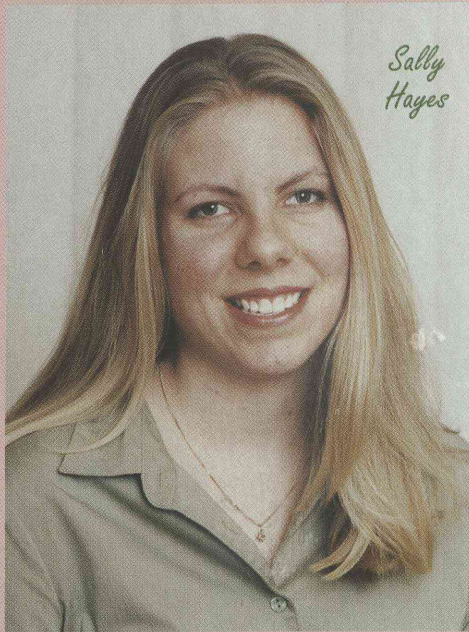
The 23-year-old media account coordinator is having fun being in the quest as it means she can stay heavily involved with a club that has strong family ties for her.

Michelle Hewett has been very busy in the last few months raising money for the Miss Queensland Soccer Quest.

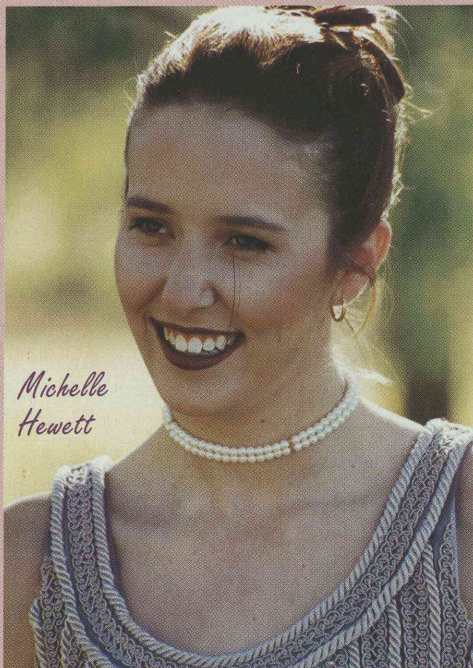
Among the Jimboomba's entrant activities have been several barbecues, a golf day and a trivia night.

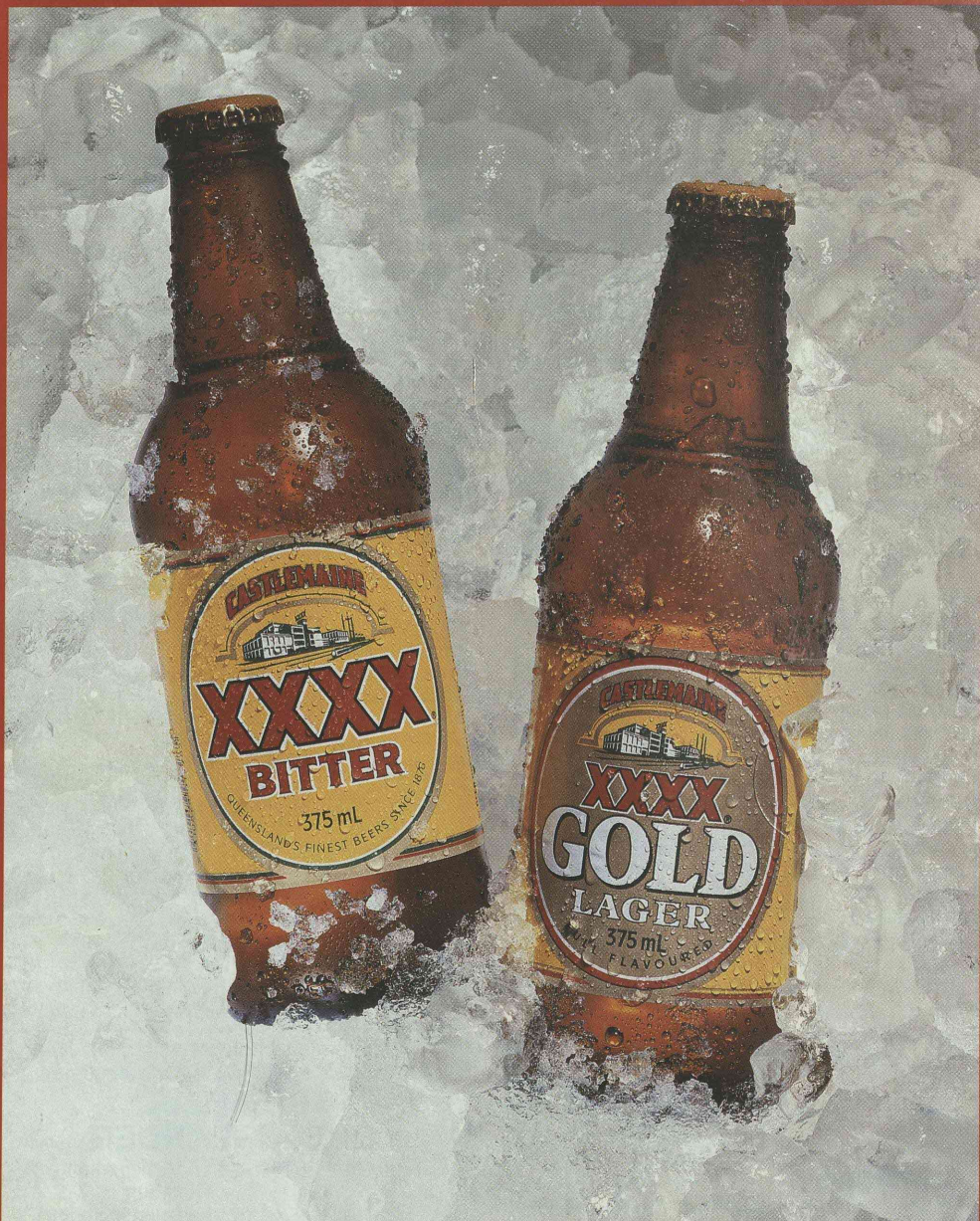
