

Coach wary of the Power

Parramatta Power has been the national league under achievers since its admission to the national league two seasons ago but Parmalat Strikers' coach John Kosmina is wary.

As the battle for the Top Six reaches fever pitch, Kosmina knows Parramatta is a serious contender for the play-offs.

The Power has 25 points on the ladder and is breathing down the necks of third and fourth placed Olympic and the Strikers who are equal on 26 points.

Nothing would be sweeter for Power coach David Mitchell than to make the finals after he learned late last year that he would not be reappointed as Power coach next season.

Mitchell, who has been at the club since they joined the league in the 1999-2000 season, is finally seeing the fruits of his labour although former Wollongong Wolves coach Nick Theodorakopoulos will replace him at the end of the season.

Despite an almost limitless budget, probably the biggest in the NSL, there is little doubt the Power were under-achievers in their first two seasons.

Large player turnovers, injuries and a lack of consistency and belief have hampered the club on the field.

Off the field fans failed to embrace the new entity which in the long term could threaten the club's national league existence.

However, despite the negatives, Mitchell has gone about his business in a professional manner refusing to criticise and has let his team do his talking after the Power board decided to look for his replacement.

"There's no use complaining," Mitchell said in a recent Sydney article.

"What's done is done. There is no use jumping up and down about it. Parramatta made a decision and I respect that. You simply have to move on. "I'm just happy to fulfill my obligations to the club for the rest of the season and do the job that is required.

"It will be great to get into the top six. Once we do that, then we want to finish as high as possible to give us the best shot at the championship," he said.

In a marked turnaround in the club's fortunes in recent weeks Mitchell's championship dream could well be fulfilled.

The Power is well placed in the run-up to the finals after finishing a disappointing 11th in their debut season and ninth in 2000/01.

Parramatta showed they had plenty to play for under the final months of Mitchell's reign when they beat the big spending Sydney Olympic 1-nil in their local derby clash last week.

The victory came as no surprise to Strikers' coach John Kosmina.

"They're a good side and played well to get a result against Olympic," Kosmina said.

"From what I've been told they were unlucky not to get more.

"They're a big strong physical side and we'll need to compete in that department against them."

Kosmina doesn't envisage any changes to the Striker's side, which came from behind twice for a thrilling 2-all draw against Northern Spirit last weekend.

The only doubt centres on defender Wayne Heath who suffered an ankle injury.

If Heath doesn't respond to treatment rangy defender Jon McKain will be recalled to the Strikers' line-up.

Kosmina also expects striker Lawrence Drake to improve in the countdown to the finals after returning from a long injury lay-off against Northern Spirit.

"Drakey was a bit short of a gallop against Spirit but he still had an effect on the game," Kosmina said.

Strikers snatch 2-2 draw

Northern Spirit coach Mick Hickman's pre-match instruction to "attack, attack, attack" went out the window as the Parmalat Brisbane Strikers came from behind to snatch a 2-all draw at North Sydney Oval last round.

Hickman had been concerned that Spirit had never been in front by two goals this season and issued the instructions to go on the offensive from the start.

The Spirit, who like the Strikers is locked in a ferocious battle for the Top Six play-offs, looked like carrying out Hickman's advice to the letter when Scott Thomas put his side ahead with his first goal for the club.

Thomas' goal, a well-struck drive, came after just two minutes to give the home side the perfect start in their bid for a third straight home win for the first time in two seasons.

Striker Pablo Cardozo, who struggled with a corked thigh, had a chance to extend Spirit's lead in the 43rd minute.

He found himself unmarked in front but his shot from point blank range was parried by Strikers' keeper Jason Kearton.

Apart from Spirit's early goal and Cardozo's close call, Hickman's instructions evaporated in the first half as strangely they retreated into wait-and-see mode and invited the Strikers to come at them.

Their tactics of protecting a lead backfired when Peter Grierson volleyed home for the Strikers' equaliser with a sweat left-foot drive on the stroke of half-time off a quality cross from John Carbone.

Brisbane dominated the second half with some dazzling attack but blew several golden opportunities to move ahead of the home side after the teams went to the break deadlocked 1-all.

Spirit keeper Paul Henderson denied Richie Alagich in the 59th minute and a howler of an error from the custodian minutes later almost cost his side dearly.

Henderson's attempted clearance in the 68th minute travelled about five metres enabling Brazilian midfielder Fernando Rech to pounce but his shot from a difficult angle went well over the posts.

Spirit's much-maligned Adrian Cervinski again became his side's goalscoring saviour and their big hope to challenge for the playoffs with his fourth goal in seven games when he netted in the 74th minute.

Cervinski struck an early attempt, which was blocked by Kearton before clinically finishing off with his second opportunity to give the Sydneysiders a 2-1 lead.

But Cervinski's goal wasn't enough for Spirit as the elusive equaliser for the Strikers finally came in the 83rd minute when Rech broke free on the right and fired a shot that was parried by Henderson.

However, nippy substitute Michel Baird darted in to make amends for the missed chance with a header to make it 2-all.

Cervinski could have stolen the three points for Spirit four minutes from time when he fired a close range drive from four metres straight at Kearton.

Strikers' coach John Kosmina was content with the draw but was particularly happy with the brand of football displayed by the Strikers.

"We could possibly have won it in the end," Kosmina said.

"We played some really great football and there was a decent level of commitment from all the players.

"We were a hell of a lot better defensively.

"There first goal was scrappy and we got caught out on the break for their second but we had our chances of winning and so did Spirit."

The draw allowed the Strikers to maintain fourth place on the NSL ladder but are now being pursued by several sides with Top Six ambitions.



Ferguson's decision to re-sign sparred the club the agony of finding a suitable replacement for one the world's greatest ever clubs.

The most successful manager in the history of British soccer announced last May he would end a near 16-year United career this season.

But a combination of United's failure to land a suitable successor and the team's sparkling form over the past two months has led to a change of heart from both Ferguson and club officials.

Ferguson's decision to stay on also is expected to have a beneficial effect on playmaker and England captain David Beckham, who has been holding out on signing a new contract amid concerns about who would succeed Ferguson.

Beckham said he was "over the moon" about his manager's decision to stay on.

Beckham, who regained his place in the United side at the weekend after a spell on the bench, spoke of his delight at Ferguson's sudden change of heart.

"We had been hearing little rumours but we didn't believe them." Beckham said.

"He came in before training one day and told us it was a big decision and he had decided to stay on. I am over the moon."

Beckham said the only thing stopping him signing a new contract of his own related to image rights.

His current deal runs out next summer but the player hopes to have the matter resolved soon.

Sister clubs hope to unite

Newcastle United hope to know by the end of the month whether a sister-club partnership with their English Premier League namesake will eventuate.

The chairman of the Premier League giants, Freddy Shepherd, will return to Australia on February 28, possibly to sign off on a deal with United.

Shepherd met Newcastle United owner Con Constantine and general manager Jock Graham last month during a world tour to boost the club's profile.

Constantine ruled out selling the fledgling NSL club but there have been continuing discussions regarding a partnership.

Northern NSW would become a talent nursery for the English giants under the deal.

Meanwhile former Carlton coach Stuart Munro will see out the season as an assistant coach at Parramatta Power after failing in his bid for the club's top job next season.

Munro was a candidate for the job of senior coach at the Power, a position that will be filled by Nick Theodorakopoulos.

Theodorakopoulos will take over on July 1 from current coach David Mitchell and assistants Munro and Laurie McKinna.

Munro moved from Melbourne to Sydney to take up the post pre-season after finding himself out of work when Carlton collapsed.

As Parramatta announced Theodorakopoulos as coach, the club, which is funded by Parramatta Leagues Club, hinted its future in the league was uncertain if the competition remained in its current financial plight.

Parramatta Leagues Club chief executive Denis Fitzgerald said: "If things aren't looking any rosier than what they are currently, we'd have to seriously look at whether we continue our involvement at a national soccer league level."

Theodorakopoulos will be given a much leaner budget after Parramatta Power directors conceded the club spent too much money in its first three seasons.

Parramatta, which was able to sign almost any player it wanted because its contract offers trumped rival bids, has yet to make the finals.

"We have obtained the best available coach for us, we're obviously looking at the very minimum to be in the finals series in the next two years," Fitzgerald said.

Theodorakopoulos took the Wollongong Wolves to their first NSL championship two seasons ago, but left the club after falling out with officials over a new contract.

Theodorakopoulos took on a coaching job in the Greek second division, but returned to Australia after being shown the door by Kallithea after just three months in charge.

"We won't be going into the marketplace and bringing in 15 new players," he told journalists after his appointment.

"There's a base already in place and the junior development program has been fairly successful from what I can see. If we can pick up some quality senior players we'll be fairly competitive in the next season."

Theodorakopolous' appointment was a major shock with Socceroo assistant coach Graham Arnold the hot favourite to take over from Mitchell.


The southern media got it wrong believing believed Arnold had the inside running on Theodorakopoulos and fellow contenders AIS head coach Steve O'Connor and Munro.

Canberra investor pulls out

The beat from the tom toms out of Canberra say the former national league club has suffered another setback in its bid for re-inclusion next season.

After the collapse of Canberra last year, it emerged last week that another Sydney-based businessman was on the verge of launching a bid to secure a controlling interest in a new Canberra franchise.

It was believed to be the most credible attempt yet to resurrect Canberra.

An Australian sports management company had been negotiating since December with the potential buyer's representatives, with a view to setting up the infrastructure for a properly capitalised soccer club to flourish in Canberra.

However, according to the Canberra Times newspaper, discussions were abandoned last week when, at the 11th hour, the investor announced that he was not prepared to proceed.

The company's managing director, who spoke to The Canberra Times on the condition of anonymity, said negotiations had come 'frighteningly close' to a fruitful conclusion.

The investor had been willing to spend between \$1.2m and \$1.5m on a majority stake holding in the new club but had withdrawn from discussions after doubts were raised as to the ongoing viability of the NSL.

It was not the first time since the Cosmos'

collapse that an investor has flirted with the possibilities of bankrolling a new club from Canberra.

A consortium of local businessmen, backed by a French organisation, had been planning the creation of a Canberra club as long ago as September, even before the final nail had been driven into the Cosmos' coffin.

Last month Soccer Canberra called publicly for expressions of interest by potential investors, both within Australia and overseas but none has been received.

According to The Canberra Times' source, recent negotiations came desperately close to securing a deal

Proposal documents were exchanged and further meetings were held but at the last minute the Sydney businessman decided against investing in an NSL franchise.

The management company had identified several members of Canberra's soccer community who were willing to buy a minor stake in a new franchise and a potential major sponsor already had been approached.

The proposal contained details relating to the purchase of a licensed club and to the broadcasting of matches on Prime Television.

Furthermore, it provided for the donation to local junior clubs of \$2 per registered player as a development grant, the Times said.

Conditions of Entry

From the BSSA...

North Sydney Oval is a romantic venue for football or cricket.

However, the 'total package' of a match at North Sydney Oval is not to be compared with the match day experience of a Strikers home game at Ballymore.

There was not a match day program. None at all - even worse than the folded piece of A3 glossy paper which serves the purpose of listing team names and advertising at Parramatta Stadium.

The Spirit mascot - their weak attempt to emulate our Thor - cantered onto the ground before the teams, waved and disappeared.

There was no entertainment before the game or at half time, save for some kids pushing around large globes.

The Spirit team never acknowledged the crowd and did not come to the fence to greet the faithful after the game.

And you could not blame them really, as the crowd's favourite chant was "We've got the worst team in the World" although they were never behind during the game.

So value what you get at Ballymore. From my experience at Parramatta and North Sydney this season we get better value for money here than they do in either of those venues, especially when you take into account the entertaining football the Strikers play.

The BSSA, more than anyone else, wants to see money spent on promoting the Strikers.

Our great entertaining team has attracted crowds of two and a half to three and a half thousand. Without promotion the crowds will not increase.

However, (and there are two 'howevers' to end this piece) we do not have a bad or below par administration at the Brisbane Strikers. We have a group of dedicated football lovers working for the good of the team.

Indeed, at their own expense in terms of time, money and even health, our board and management have done all they can to further the team.

However, all is not dependent on money. The BSSA is working with the

marketing people at the club to promote the team's home matches in other ways.

Souths sample hot Chile

South Melbourne midfielder Con Boutsianis was again making news this month but this time it was not all his fault.

A friendly soccer match between national league club South Melbourne and visiting Chilean side Colo Colo turned sour recently with an on-field melee leading to South's players walking off the field.

South coach Eddie Krncevic marched his players off Bob Jane Stadium late in the first half after the Colo Colo team became involved in an altercation with Boutsianis.

Amid angry scenes on the touchline, there were allegations of Colo Colo substitutes spitting at Boutsianis and other South players.

As referee Perry Mur tried to control that situation. Boutsianis then pushed a Colo Colo defender.

That sparked a pushing and shoving match involving most players from both sides including substitutes, which led to Krncevic's decision to pull his side off the field for what South officials called "an early halftime break".

The match had been a physical and spiteful affair to that point, with several of the Chilean players involved in off-the-ball incidents, cynical fouls and diving.

One particularly nasty elbow on South skipper Paul Trimboli left him with a cut lip.

The match resumed - without Boutsianis

who was substituted - after a half-hour break, which allowed tempers to cool sufficiently for the game to continue without further incident.

The break also ensured the aggression was confined to the pitch, with no crowd problems among the 4500 spectators - including a noisy Chilean contingent - despite what could have easily become a hostile atmosphere.

Krncevic did not attend the post-match press conference with assistant coach Jeff Olver saying the decision to walk off had been correct.

"At the end of the day, there were lots of allegations on both sides," Olver said.

"We felt the atmosphere was getting to boiling point. The break took the sting out of things. That proved to be a good thing.'

Colo Colo coach Juan Gutierrez said he and the referee had spoken to his players and asked them to lower their intensity, which at times approached that of a World Cup final.

"We wanted to provide a spectacle for those that came. I said that any players who showed aspects of unfair play would be pulled off."

Once Colo Colo started playing football in the second half, they showed some sublime touches in a match, which finished 1-1 - both goals coming in the first half.

Trimboli netted inside the first two minutes, before Gonzalo Fierro equalised for Colo Colo after 15 minutes.





Pele's shirt up for auction

The number 10 shirt worn by Pele during Brazil's famous victory over Italy in the 1970 World Cup final will go under the hammer in London next month.

Pele's piece of footballing memorabilia was expected to fetch up to \$A140,000.

But former Brazil soccer coach Mario Zagallo, who coached the 1970 Brazilian team, claimed he had the jersey Pele wore during the first half of the final and team fitness trainer Admildo Chirol had the jersey the star wore during the second half.

Pele's performance in the epic 4-1 victory over Italy, in front of more than 100,000 spectators, was arguably one of his finest performances on the World Cup stage.

"At halftime, Pele gave me his shirt. After, Chirol got the other," Zagallo told the Brazilian media this week.

A Brazilian newspaper also quoted Chirol's

son as saying he had inherited the jersey from his father.

In London, a spokesman for Christies said the auction house was confident it was in possession of Pele's famous number 10 shirt.

Christie's said the jersey belonged to Italian international Roberto Rosato, who said he traded jerseys with Pele after Brazil's victory at the Azteca stadium.

The spokesman for Christie's said the auction house was aware of the Brazilian press reports but was satisfied with the authenticity of the shirt and would push ahead with the sale on March 27.

Also up for auction is a 1966 World Cup winner's medal presented to England defender Ray Wilson after England's 4-2 win against West Germany at Wembley in London.

Christie's expects the medal to fetch up to \$A250,000.

Spiderman's net gun for World Cup

A new weapon – the net gun - is the latest piece of super technology to be used by Japanese police to restrain any hooligans misbehaving at the World Cup soccer.

"Anyone going wild will be trapped under a net and they won't be able to move," a Sapporo police spokesman said.

Sapporo is on the northern island of Hokkaido and will host three first round matches during.

On June 1 Germany play Saudi Arabia in a Group E match; Italy are up against Ecuador in a Group G match on June 3 and England meet

Argentina in one of the most eagerly-awaited matches in Group F on June 7.

Japanese police say the net gun — familiar arsenal in comic books — fires a restraining net without using gunpowder and can ensnare several people at once.

British security officers have advised Japanese organising officials that England's matches at the finals should be more heavily policed than others.

Squads of highly-trained, heavily-armed antihooligan police and security forces in Japan have been in training camps for months to deal with them at the World Cup finals.
