








# Snapshots from the Junior Development Day

He is just a shadow of the man I've shared a lot of beers with but it was still good to see him despite the circumstances. And he certainly hasn't lost his sense of humour or his fighting spirit.

He told me that 2 weeks previous the doctor had given him just 3 days. "That'll show him" he said tongue in cheek, "I'm not leaving all my money to my missus just yet".

He was also quite serious about leaving enough money for one last shout for his old mates. I left him in good spirits and thinking maybe life ain't too bad after all.

The week ahead and the week just past could not be more different in terms of preparation for a match. With our last fixture taking place last Friday, this week has bound to have been (its Monday as I write this) one of the longest weeks of my life in more ways than one.


With 3 days of rest, 4 days and 6 sessions of training, and one day of return travel from Sydney following our match with Marconi making up the time in between games its easy to see what I mean in one sense. The other sense can only be explained by an eagerness to get out onto the park and attempt to atone for our recent performances and more importantly results.

In contrast, following tonights fixture we will have a very limited amount of time to ensure we are properly prepared for our away game against South Melbourne on Wednesday night. The next couple of days are likely to consist of a recovery session (of some sort, be it in the pool or on the park) on Monday, and a reasonably light session on the park on Tuesday before we fly out to Melbourne on the morning of the match.

Obviously we will have to wait and see what effect these situations have on the team, but I can certainly say that the vast majority of players would prefer the second situation to occur more often. That's not to say that having long periods between games doesn't have its benefits. It gives players more opportunity for a better recovery, and it allows coaches and players more training time to work on what's required for the upcoming game.

But playing a couple of games inside the space week isn't just about having less training (something that I believe most players actually enjoy). Its about having more of an opportunity to go out there and do what we do best, which is compete. whilst providing the challange of recovering and preparing in a relatively short space of time. Done just a few times over the course of a season it would also give us something like the 30 odd games (even before any finals series) that most other countries have in their fixture lists.

# Farina's Hard Line: A Courageous Decisison?

Next week will witness an all-too-rare event – an international football match featuring our Socceroos, this time taking on the might of England.

The match will mark the first opportunity our full strength national team has had to play since FIFA announced the Oceania region will supply one qualifier to the next World Cup - a decision which emboldened our national coach, Frank Farina, to make several statements indicating he expects a new level of commitment to the national team from our overseas-based players.

Farina made it clear immediately after FIFA's announcement that he would select his best players at every opportunity and expect them to be available.

"If they (the players, clubs) don't like it, that's tough", he said. "Whatever players I select, I'd expect them to be there. Everyone knows what's at stake".

Those words were music to the ears of anyone who longs to see the Socceroos be the best team they can be. No more caving in to European club coaches. No more cringing acceptance of players whose commitment to the green and gold seems wishy-washy when international duties interfere with club commitments. No more under-prepared Socceroos playing like strangers to each other.

But will Farina's fighting words persuade his overseas stars to fall into line behind him whenever he wants them? Or do they indicate, in the wry terms of Sir Humphrey Appleby, a "courageous decision".

The early indications were positive. Within days of Farina's pronouncement, Skipper Paul Okon said "It won't make it difficult for me if I am selected to be available. I cant speak on behalf of the other players but I personally think everyone will commit . . . Sometimes players can't be there for various reasons but I think it's going to need a commitment from everybody. That means everyone making themselves available whenever Australia plays."

But we soon had a reality check. Around the time that Farina and Okon were having their say, classy defender Craig Moore was being touted by former Socceroo skipper Paul Wade as Okon's successor - in large part because of his perceived pride in pulling on the green and gold shirt.

"I believe Craig Moore (should be the next captain)" Wade said. "To me, he has never suggested that playing for (Glasgow) Rangers is more important than playing for the green and gold".

Nobody, it seems, told Moore. In mid-January Moore was popped the old "what if" question about choosing between club and country. While speaking in the context of the current season, he answered, "If I was forced to choose (between playing international friendlies in Australia and playing for Rangers), then I would want to be with Rangers, because although it's always nice to play for your country, the games are not going to be as important".

Ooops! Not exactly a ringing endorsement of Farina's policy or Wade's confidence, that. Particularly when you consider that European clubs seem to feel that no time is a good time to leave them.

So who's sentiments, Okon's or Moore's, will the majority of Farina's players have most sympathy with? Probably Moore's. We must not forget that Okon, at 30, is nearing the end of his career and probably has only one World Cup campaign left in him - one chance to crown his career with an appearance on the world stage. Little wonder, then, that he seems prepared to commit himself readily to Farina's "Australia First" regime.


But Moore is only 27 and has potentially seven or eight more years of top class, high wage-earning football ahead of him. When push comes to shove, is he going to gamble this against a one-month-in-every-four-years event, or is he going to come down in favour of where his bread will be buttered week in, week out for all those years?

Somehow, it is easier to expect that the bulk of Australia's under-30 brigade will feel as Moore does. If that is correct, and Farina sticks to his guns, we might just see a few high profile Socceroos jettisoned before or during our next World Cup campaign.





But his rise to infamy is in most part due to his extravagant and death defying stunts. The most famous and definitely his most publicised feat was his jumping from a plane to land in the middle of a packed Suncorp Stadium before the kick-off of the 1997 Grand Final victory. Some of his other perilous adventures has seen him abseil from the top of the Grandstand at Suncorp, impress us all with his Fire Eating abilities, ride his much loved Motor Cycle spewing sparks from its rear end around the playing field and who can forget his impromptu performance with the Irish Dancers. He has reached true cult status amongst Queensland Soccer supporters and love him or hate him, everyone knows Thor. When you think of the Brisbane Strikers. Thor is not far from your thoughts and recently I have had the great privilege to spend some time with the Mighty Thor and conduct my first official interview for the Club. The legend of Thor would fill this Program twice over and still be a great read, so what I've come up with is a mix of questions that I hope will give everyone an insight into the Thor phenomenon and the man behind the success.

You have been the one constant at the Club since it's inception, what is the secret to your longevity?

I believe that my passion for the game and club has allowed me to keep the faith for so many years. I have played, managed, coached and supported soccer in Queensland for more than 30 years and will continue to do so for many years to come.

Is being a National League Mascot something you've always dreamt of doing, or was it something that just sort of happened?

At no point in my life or in my wildest dreams did I ever contemplate becoming a mascot of any description let alone in a national competition. As I have said many times I was volunteered by a long time friend and great Strikers supporter, Stewart Holmes, mainly due to my gregarious nature and the fact that I had been doing some amateur acting for a few years prior to the birth of the Strikers.

Did you ever imagine as you led out the team for the first time, that your reign as the Strikers Mascot and No 1 supporter would last more than a decade?

No. In the early days no one could have predicted the amazing events that have befallen the Strikers during this time. As mascot I think it is unprecedented in soccer or possibly any sport in this country.

You are quite easily the longest serving Mascot in NSL history, that must give you a feeling of great satisfaction and pride?

It is still hard to believe that I am still going after all these years. I am proud, honoured, humbled and overjoyed by the response from all sectors of our game and have innumerable memories to remind me of this great game.


