Comment Comment

I mentioned in the last program that during the time before the last few away games in Sydney I caught up with Eddie Thomson, my old club coach from Sydney City and Sydney Olympic. Thommo had cancer, big time, and I commented on how he'd defied the odds and lasted much longer than expected. Well, as we all know now he finally lost his fight a week or so back. He was buried last Tuesday and the guest list was a who's who of the game in this country.

The morning after his death I was inundated with phone calls from journos wanting quotes on Eddie.

Apart from the usual stuff about funny stories and the like it got me to thinking a bit deeper than all that. It occurred to me that no-one in the contemporary history of the game in Australia has had so much influence over so many people currently involved at the highest level.

He coached me at club level for eight years and with the national team for four. Even my adversaries tonight, Ian Crook, Gary van Egmond and Clint Gosling were coached by Thommo at various stages of their careers. He had a big impact on the careers of national coaches Frank Farina and Graham Arnold, not to mention quite a number of the players that beat England a couple weeks back. I guess the point I'm trying to make is that Eddie left his mark.

When he came to this country back in the late Seventies he came to see out his playing day's and get involved in coaching but he never would have imagined his life taking the path it did or ending the way it did.

During one of our more recent conversations he told me he was angry when he was first diagnosed and had to go through the "chemo" and radiation.

But laying in hospital on one occasion he had to share a room with a young kid going through the same thing and it occurred to him that he hadn't been dealt such a bad hand after all. During my visits, despite him being incapacitated his personality was no different to the day I met him 25 years ago. His successes hadn't changed him and nor had the cancer.

He was still full of life so to speak, making the most of what he had. He wasn't giving up no matter what the circumstances – he wanted to beat his illness and he was going to fight it to the end. He was still making every post a winner and "losing" and "second" were still not in his dictionary. Maybe that is why and how he left his mark on life.



Australia A The Players Perspective

Two days before a Socceroos team picked entirely from overseas-based players registered our first win over England, Soccer Australia made an announcement designed to give hope to Australian-based players.

That announcement was that the governing body had decided to create an Australia A team, borrowing from the concept used in cricket, to be selected entirely from players playing their trade in the NSL and the state leagues.

A report in the Western Australian media quoted Soccer Australia board member Paul Afkos saying the team will be coached by Frank Farina and will play regular friendlies and tournaments against nations from the Oceania and Asia regions. Those Australia A players who impress can expect to earn selection in the full Socceroo squad.

Soccer Australia hopes that one of the benefits of introducing this concept is that it will encourage young players who hold representative ambitions to stay longer in Australia.

So will it really capture the imagination of Australian-based players and encourage them to stay put? Our own Brisbane Strikers have several players with ambitions to play for their country and for overseas clubs - including Jon McKain, Shane Stefanutto and Matthew McKay. Why not ask them?

Not surprisingly, given the poor timing of the Australia A announcement, McKain had not heard of it. But when told he reacted with enthusiasm.

"It sounds brilliant", he said. "It sounds like a perfect opportunity to develop players by playing them against better opposition and getting them together often as a team".

But would it make him think twice about pursuing a career overseas? "It would definitely be in the back of your mind", he said. "In every player's mind the best leagues are overseas, but there may not be that great urge to go overseas ASAP. And if you play in that side (Australia A) a few times a year you might get into the senior side and get recognised by (overseas) clubs anyway".

Stefanutto and McKay had both heard about the concept and had the benefit of a few extra days to think it over. It showed.

Stefanutto thought it was a good idea, but had a few doubts about its viability. "It's a very good concept. But who is going to fund it, and will it be funded properly? I'd like to see them get the national (Socceroos) side right first. And what would be the credibility of the side? The Oceania islands would be keen to play them, but I don't know if the likes of Japan and South Korea would like to play an Australia A side".

Stefanutto didn't think it would keep him in Australia if he had an offer to go overseas. "If something came up overseas I would go, but I'm not looking at it at the moment", he said.

McKay expressed a mix of excitement and doubts. "It's a great idea", he said. "It gives guys a chance to stake a claim, a chance to represent their country. It would be good to have a few more international games played".

But he didn't think the concept would keep him in Australia, because it would have to prove itself first. "I'm not certain", he said. "It would have to be going for a few years and getting a few players into the full side. Then, after about five years it might encourage a few of the younger players to stay around".

If these young Brisbane Strikers players are anything to go by, the feedback about the Australia A idea from the people it is aimed at seems to be: 'Great idea, guys - lots of potential! But you'll have to convince us that you're doing it right before we'll ease up on those dreams of playing overseas'.

Given the record of football administrators in Australia, you can't blame them. Too often there is a considerable gap between the announcement of a good idea and its successful implementation. Perhaps Soccer Australia has, on this occasion, got the first part right. The hard part is still to come.



Thor Rules Australian Sport Pt2

The reasons why the Thor character was chosen is well documented. What were some of the other ideas being bandied around at the time?

From memory, there was talk of a fuzzyheaded character of some type (I am not sure what exactly) and possibly cheerleaders. Beyond that I think the idea of Thor came up fairly quickly and not much else was discussed.

Your NSL debut was the Birth of the future BSSA, how many were in that group at the grass roots end that first game?

There were about 30 of us who started the support of the Strikers in that pre-season game all those years ago. We were all supporters of soccer and very passionate about our great game. Since then I have seen many different types of supporters groups with different views on the type of support but the one constant has been fervent, noisy support and I think it is now as loud as ever.

Thors Team of the Decade certainly caused some serious, and not so serious debate. Given the fact you've seen them all, who do you consider to be the best player to ever play for the Club?

Now you've put me on the spot. It is always very difficult to single out one player for special attention. However, I must make mention of a few of the greats of our club. Alan Hunter, a personal friend and probably one of the best defender's this country has ever had. Fernando Rech, one of the most gifted players to ever play in the NSL. Clint Bolton, a great goalkeeper and fellow heavy metal fan. Kasey Wehrmann, another of the best home-grown talents to grace our team. But think for overall contribution both on and off the field I would have to say Frank Farina. It was my pleasure to get to know Frank as a player, coach and media personality and was even interviewed by him for Channel Seven a couple of times. He embodied everything good in soccer and, of course, has gone on to greater things with his position as coach of the Socceroos.

You've been through all the highs and lows of the NSL for the past decade. What are your thoughts on the future of Australian Soccer, and in particular the future of the National Soccer League and FIFA's decision to allocate Oceania a direct berth into the World Cup in 2006?

Firstly, I think that a sweeping reform is probably long overdue at the highest level. Many have tried but, it seems to me, that it has always been either half-hearted or with their hands tied from earlier administrations. I cannot give you the answers but I hope that when the people who count give 100% to the game and forget any other reasons for being there then we may be on the right track. Secondly, The NSL is the longest running national football competition in Australia and as such needs to be promoted that way and a structure put in place with a league and sponsorship package that encourages our young players to stay here. Thirdly, the direct qualification to the World Cup for Oceania is an opportunity for Australia to put themselves on the world map and attract major deals with overseas and local sponsors to show what may be possible for our national teams. I am not saying that Australia has already qualified only that it is in the best interests of all concerned to make sure we do. This is firmly linked to point 2.

One thing I've noticed is the respect by visiting Teams for the "Thor inspired supporters" What do you attribute this to?

After travelling away on 9 occasions with the team it is always a pleasure to see opposition supporters both in their own environs and at our home ground. I feel that my positive attitude towards them and the Strikers with never a bad word said against either, except in jest, has set me in good stead for their warm receptions.

What does Thor do when he's not at the Strikers, and what do you do to relax?

I enjoy riding my motorcycles, watching movies, some amateur acting and spending time with my family

What plans, if any, do you have for life after the Strikers?

To continue to support the Strikers and soccer in Australia for many years to come. I also am planning to go back to compete in a type of offroad motorcycling called Observed Trials. I have not competed since 1993, which just happens to coincide with the birth of the Strikers.

More often than not, truly remarkable individuals are not recognised until they are gone, so with this in mind, the Club and myself are working overtime to ensure that Thor, both the Mascot and the Man, receive all the accolades and honours so rightfully deserving to him. So lets show our appreciation for this legend of Australian sports. When you hear the Mighty Thor raise his thunderous voice in support of our very own Brisbane Strikers, how about joining in, and make an old God happy.



A stunning 3-0 victory by visiting Brisbane saw incredable scenes on the pitch side as Kingz players decided to fight amongst themselves.


