

I am also impressed with all the league debutants performances and believe they will grow in confidence.


I can also assure supporters that this team will no doubt improve with every fixture.

From the BSSA

In recent weeks some of the BSSA members who have access to the BSSA e-mail list have participated in a very interesting, lively and sometimes heated discussion relating to print media coverage of our football code and to a lesser extent, the Strikers.

In a reply to an earlier BSSA editorial criticising the lack of positive media coverage relating to the launch of the current NSL season, journalist Ray Gatt of The Australian newspaper e-mailed a lengthy response, detailing as to what in his opinion are the shortcomings and failures of the NSL and the participating clubs.

Gatt's reply generated a great deal of comment and angst within our membership ranging from tacit acceptance of his diagnosis to what one member described as a "load of b*****s". Foremost in Gatt's assertions are that most NSL clubs fail to promote themselves, there is a general lack of direction within the NSL, no plan for the future, no sponsor or promotion, etc., etc. In the interest of unbiased reporting, we have published Gatt's reply to the editorial on the BSSA website www.go.to/bssa

Whilst realistically the BSSA has no argument with Gatt's assertions (and those of other journalists), we believe that he completely

misses a very valuable point, the average supporter wants to read in the newspapers positive issues about football, the teams, the individual players and the coaches. For too long we have been subjected in this country to negative type reporting relative to our football code. It is time to redress the inequity with more balanced journalism! It is at least gratifying to know that locally. Courier-Mail (Rugby League) journalist Bernie Pramberg can write and focus on positive issues about Football and the Strikers


