The Adelaide locals that I spoke to stated that the Strikers players played courageously and committed themselves for the full 90 minutes and that they were certainly unlucky not to have scored one goal early in the game and that in the last 20 minutes our team could have scored 2 or 3 goals. However, the general comment was that it was a game that was played in such favour towards Adelaide that the match could have gone on for an additional hour and we may not have managed to harness sufficient luck to score a single goal.

The efforts of our team, coaching and support staff, Chairman, Directors and volunteers have been outstanding in our current season and my confidence is not dimmed by the narrow loss to Adelaide.

The atmosphere was electric and it was a great experience for all the boys to play in. With the crowd right behind them, Adelaide took a deserved 1 – o halftime lead.


The second half saw us dominate without any reward in front of goal, which in turn lead us to our first loss of the season.





## From the Benches

Its been a long four weeks since we last Played at home and it has been an eventful month indeed. The visit of Perth promised lots and delivered, with an absolutely cracking game of football by both sides. The Glory arrived hot favourites to take the 3 Points back to Western Australia. But they knew that they would have to be at their best to get anything out of their Match with a confident Brisbane outfit. The game started at, stayed at, and finished at a frenetic pace with both teams committed to open attacking football. Perth chose the long option for most of the game, while the Home side stuck to its winning formula of fast passing, free flowing football. Both sides had good scoring opportunities in both halves and if not for some desperate defending and world class Goalkeeping the score line could easily been 3 or 4 all. The Brisbane defence, led by inspirational Player/Coach Stuart Mclaren absorbed and repelled everything that the leagues most lethal front pairing of Mori and Despotouski had to offer and limited the pair to a handful of half chances. Going forward the boys always looked likely to score and brought the best out of the very experienced visiting defence. It was summed up in the Press Conference after the Game by both Coaches, when they both believed either side could have won it. but neither side deserved to lose it, so a share of the points was probably a fair indication of the contest.

The still undefeated Strikers next assignment was the always difficult trip to Bob Jane Stadium to face an inform South Melbourne, in front of 7000 plus South Fans, there to watch their heroes go around and celebrate federation day for their Club. South Melbourne started the better of the sides in the opening exchanges, playing in their traditional strip, at home for the first time this season. But it wasn't long before the visitors started to exert some influence on the game and by half way through the 1<sup>st</sup> half the South Melbourne defence were starting to show signs of cracking. Both sides went to the half time break ruing missed chances, but happy with the commitment. Immediately after the break. Josh Rose found some space out wide, and played an inviting ball across the box for Louis Brain to get in front of his marker and stroke the ball into the opposition net. To their credit the South Melbourne players went in search of an equalizer, but a solid Brisbane line up frustrated the now desperate home side and with the South Melbourne supporters not known for their patience, it wasn't long before they got on the back of their own players and many left as is the case in Melbourne. This is not to take away from a very solid team performance by the Strikers, which saw the side come away from the game with a much deserved and hard fought victory.

The Adelaide game was an old fashioned game of two halves as United dominated the first half, especially the early stages and Brisbane came out after the break and played the way we've all come to expect. The game was settled with a solitary goal by former Socceroo Carl Veart after a deflected cross fell kindly to the Adelaide striker in the box and he slid his shot into the bottom of the goal. The Strikers mental toughness and character was challenged by the enormity of the occasion and they came through with flying colours, and were a credit to themselves and the Club.

The Players and Staff are keen to record their first win at home this evening and would like to ask all of you to join in the atmosphere and celebrations at the end of the match.




