Since my involvement with the Club, a very pleasing element of our operations relates to the Club philosophy in providing opportunities for young people to grow and further their football aspirations. This year is no exception and the search for talent undertaken by Stuart McLaren and Luciano Trani (in the local league and elsewhere in the State) has proven to be both beneficial for the Club and to a large number of individual players. We have been delighted to witness the outstanding improvements shown by players such as Scott Higgins, Steve Fitzsimmons, Warren Moon, Luke Morley, Carl Dodd and Josh McCloughan and to see the progression of these players into the National Soccer League. We are also impressed with the improvement of Peter Clarke from Cairns and it will not be long before he progresses to the National Soccer League.

In addition to the above, the outstanding opportunity that has been given to a very large number of young players who have been recruited from Brisbane and Central Queensland is a credit to the Club and will only help to benefit sport in this State and greatly assist in the personal development of an increasing number of young Queenslanders.

In my many decades associated with the administration of Soccer at various levels, I have seen examples where young people have been denied opportunity for advancement by their own club for selfish interest and this has been always found to be counterproductive in the development of our code and for the fulfilment of ambition in respect to the individual young players. There are scores of present and former Australian

players of all ages who have been offered overseas contracts and have been precluded from accepting them because of a club failing to agree to a timely transfer. This has had devastating and had long-term effects on individual players.

Some of our very best supporters might question as to why our Club was pleased to release Shane Stefanutto to sign with a top Norwegian Club. However, we must all remind ourselves that we are not administering the game for our own good but, rather, for the good of the game and we must not forget that Shane has served our Club faithfully for six years, sometimes in difficult situations. He has also been a tremendous asset in promoting our code through his Junior Development activities. Shane leaves our Club with the very best wishes of our Board and we trust that he will reap the rewards that he deserves and we hope that he returns some day to the Strikers to add further value to the Club's development.

I was tremendously proud to witness first hand the immense amount of pleasure that was demonstrated by our Chairman, Dr Clem Jones and our Vice President, Dell Townsend, when they learned of the good news that Shane had been offered an overseas contract. They, together with other Board members, were thrilled that another young person had been given a tremendous once-in-a-lifetime opportunity. I do not know many Board members of other clubs who would have expressed their interest in such a matter in such a delightful way.


And the 21 year old is full of compliments for his rookie coach. "Stu has definitely got us all working together. There is a great deal of respect for Stu and he has got equal respect for all of us. And with Luciano Trani on board as well, we have plenty of technical and tactical information."

As one of the senior members of a young squad (in terms of NSL experience) Brain has put higher personal expectations on himself. "I think everyone at the club realises that we have to perform, I just



make sure that I give my all every time I go out on the pitch."

As for the team's prospects in season 2003-04, Brain is supremely confident. "I honestly wasn't sure how we'd go at the start of the season, but having proven ourselves, the top 6 is definitely the goal."



From the Benches

Nigerian Chimaobi Nwaogazi scored for the third straight game to earn improving Wollongong a NSL draw against Brisbane Strikers at a blustery WIN Stadium last Friday night. Nwaogazi, in his first NSL season, equalised for the Wolves in the 46th minute to cancel out Louis Brain's 13th minute strike. Both goals came from corners with Nwaogazi quickest to react to Stuart Young's deflected header while Brain was left unattended on the edge of the Wolves penalty box.

After a dreadful start to the season Wollongong have now gone four games unbeaten to move towards mid-table while Brisbane stay fourth with their point. The stiff southerly was a major factor last Friday night with Brisbane enjoying the lions' share of first half possession but Wollongong controlled the second stanza with the breeze at their back. Brisbane's early dominance was rewarded with Brain's goal.

Twice Wollongong failed to clear following the first corner of the match. The ball fell kindly to Brain, who had time to take a touch before firing into the bottom corner. Two minutes later a terrific challenge from Josh McCloughan on a runaway Nwaogazi preserved the Strikers' lead. Wollongong found their equaliser just 54 seconds into the second half with Young's deflected header rebounding off a Strikers defender and Nwaogazi on hand to knock in the equaliser from close range.

While it remained fairly tight for the rest of the second half, the best of the chances fell to the home side, but they were unable to take them. Brisbane remains in fourth, while the Wolves move one place closer to the top six.

Brisbane player-coach Stuart McLaren believed his side failed to build on a strong start. "We scored a goal and had a great half hour but then didn't get a second goal and Wollongong came back into the game just before half time," McLaren said. "They went close a couple of times, got a goal and from

there both teams had chances to win it. I'm not disappointed, I'm not annoyed and we came here for a win but a draw was a fair result." His Wolves counterpart John Turner agreed. "Both teams deserved something from the game," Turner said. "It was a cracking game, given the conditions, and both teams went out to win it."

For the Wolves, Young and Nwaogazi were outstanding while Blake had a solid game at the back. Brisbane wing-back Shane Stefanutto had a strong game on the left, while defenders McCloughan and Karl Dodd were impressive in the heart of defence.

A Warren Moon strike gave Brisbane all three points against an enthusiastic Melbourne Knights outfit and kept their unbeaten record at Perry Park this season intact. The visitors started the stronger and their early dominance led to a number of scoring opportunities in the first half hour or so. Brisbane began to get into their stride late in the first stanza.

It was after the break and obviously some words of encouragement from the coaching staff that the Strikers were back to their old selves and began to dominate the cautious visitors. It was on the end of some constant pressure that Moon, in his debut NSL season struck a perfectly timed left foot volley past the hapless Knights custodian to send the Brisbane faithful into raptures.

The 65th minute strike was just reward for a much improved second half performance. Perry Park is fast becoming a graveyard for opposition teams and it will be interesting to see if they can go unbeaten at home throughout the regular season.

League positions may not be accurate due to an earlier deadline because of tonight's game.





Our marking became ordinary, our work rate dropped off and the good teamwork of the first half disappeared as players became individuals.


Consequently we were punished by 3 ordinary goals resulting from our simiple errors. Shades of our game against Parramatta.

So, keep developing boys and we will see you in the seniors in the future.


