#### A Long Hard Road

Next week Shane will join with more than 200 other young Australians playing in Europe. You can be sure every one of them has not progressed this far without having worked extraordinarily hard and by displaying commitment, dedication, determination, courage and at the same time possessing a high degree of physical ability and a strong and positive mental attitude.

In support of the above statement it is interesting to note the long journey and hard work Shane has undertaken before leaving for this new phase of his life.

His playing career commenced in Atherton at the age of 5 years and upon turning 10 he travelled 3 or 4 times (200 kilometres round trip) for 6 years to play in Cairns. Shane then moved to the Gold Coast to further his football and later spent 3 years at the QAS before commencing a successive 6 year career at the Brisbane Strikers.

To date Shane has travelled almost one million kilometres in the pursuit of his dream and has received almost 6000 hours of coaching tuition. Coaches that have influenced his career are Frank Stefanutto (Dad) (Atherton), Steve Davies (Cairns), Andrew Bettell (Gold Coast), Gary Phillips (QAS) and John Kosmina (Strikers).

Now he is to journey to Norway and take up a professional position with Lillestrom F. C. a prominent club in the Norwegian National Soccer League.

The Board of our Club, Staff, Supporters, players and our Soccer Community wish Shane all the best for this important journey and thank him for his care and duties to our club. We hope at a time appropriate to Shane's career that we have the opportunity to welcome him back home to our club.

When I say careful consideration, I mean not just for the players, but also and more importantly, for the supporters, officials, administrators and volunteers involved in our wonderful game.

With the demands on people's time and efforts as we celebrate Christmas and the New Year, it would appear commonsense to implement some form of mid-season break.

Some of you may point out that in the world's most commercially successful league, the English Premiership, the festive period is one in which a number of fixtures take place including a full round on Boxing Day.

But at this risk of becoming a bit too clichéd, I would argue that what is good for the goose is not necessarily not good for the gander. The point is proved as you look at what takes place at this time in other leagues across Europe, for reasons of an individual nature (for some it may well be climatic), many competitions in the Northern Hemisphere hold a mid-winter shut down.

I for one believe that we should, if not shut down mid-season, at least not have games being played too close to Christmas and New Year.

Butthen again, that is just one persons opinion, as long as everybody's is taken into consideration.


"It's a pity for us, but I'm sure we all wish him well. He's served us well and will always be special to us here at the Strikers. Good luck Shane," Alan M.



## The Olympic Dream

For many of these young footballers this years Olympics in Athens will be their only chance to represent their Country at an Olympic Games. The Under 23 restriction for Olympic Football means the best young players from around the world get to showcase their talents on the biggest and most watched stage known to man. For many it will be the highlight of their short careers, for others it will the springboard to superstardom. The familiar favourites tag does not apply at the Olympics, that is the essence of the games.

To earn our spot in Athens Frank Farina and his charges must first progress through the qualifying stages starting mid January. Public expectations and playing against Countries with nothing to lose can be a dangerous mix and Coach Farina has been quick to dispel any talk of complacency within the Australian Camp.

Farina chose a 20-man squad for the twoweek tournament that starts on January 14, and included five players from the Under 20 team that competed at the recent World Youth Championships in the United Arab Emirates.

North and Srhoj left Brisbane for the southern lights a few seasons ago, before finding their niche in the successful Perth Glory Squad. Jon McKain after having a solid year in defence for the Strikers was signed by Romanian Club, National Bucuresti, after a successful trial at the end of last season. His inclusion in the squad has come on the back of some solid domestic form, which saw him get a late call up for the Socceroo's squad in England last year.

To all the Players, Coaches and Staff, on behalf of the Brisbane Soccer Public, I would like to wish you well in your endeavours and let you know we are proud of you and your achievements no matter what the outcome.

For those of you at the game tonight, as I always say, It's time to sit back and enjoy the action.



Well once again I've babbled on more than enough, so all there's left to do is sit back and enjoy the action.



#### Strikers Youth vs Northern Spirit

Amidst all the turmoil surrounding Northern Spirit they are still able to turn out a quality youth team. Due to a youth recruitment and development program headed by Gary McGuiness (Ex regional doc of Rockhampton). A tough game was pending.

The weather didn't help as once again the boys were forced to play in soaring heat conditions and not for the first time this year we had to stop for a drink break.

Our boys showed a little mental toughness to cope, something they were unable to do in the first round.

This was evident as Northern Spirit scored first by way of a free kick just outside our penalty box. Josh Watson was given little chance to save as the free kick went through our wall (Be brave boys, we need a wall of bricks not straw!). So one nil down but not for long as Russell Woodruffe equalised with a fine goal off a set piece. It was all the more pleasing for Russell as he had a stint with Northern Spirit Youth.

Both teams were feeling the heat and patches of quality football were displayed by both teams. This quality could not have been more evident as we scored our second goal through fine passing which saw Chris Scuderi disect the Spirit's defence for Dean Peltohaka to slot home a great shot to give us a 2-1 lead going into half time. A welcome break.

Northern Spirit came out with all guns blazing and for the first ten minutes. We were under the cosh. To the boys credit we stood fast. Well done eventually we were able to hold the ball and put pressure on their defence. Spirit probably had the better of the second half, but to the boys credit we were able to hold on and could've scored a goal ourselves.

The final whistle went and a great sigh of relief from coach and players. This was a tough game due to weather and opposition. Satisfying from my point of view, not only did we win, but many of the boys finally got outside their comfort zone. Something I will expect and more importantly the players should expect from themselves in the future.

#### Strikers Youth vs Olympic Youth

Football is a funny game and who would be a coach? Just when you think things are going well something will happen and you will be back where you started. However we must continue. After our great win the previous week, we were expecting to continue in the same vein. Someone forgot to tell Olympic.

We kicked off, Passed backwards and then forward, to see the pass intercepted and fired forward to give Olympic a one on one with Josh Watson. As in the past Josh came to our rescue and made a fine save. 30 seconds into the game but we could've been one nil down. Just the reality check we needed. Its amazing we kick off, and they nearly score. However we got a second chance and settled down to play some good football and threatened Olympic's goal on several occasions. One such moment ended with Russell Woodruffe finishing some good lead up work. 1-nil after ten minutes.

5 minutes later Carl Giannangelo (playing his first game for the club) nearly scored after more quality lead up work. The shot went just wide of the post and Carl was cleaned up in the process by the Olympic keeper. After attention from the club physio Steve Whitlock he was given the OK to continue and played a big part in the first half.

Olympic had 2 fast forwards who caused some problems for our defence, but nothing they couldn't handle. We attacked well and often, but as it happens, didn't finish our chances. 5 minutes before half time we gave the gave away at the back and were punished with a goal from Olympic.

In the second half we caused problems for ourselves by continually not holding the ball and having to defend for long periods. Olympic's second goal came from a lack of concentration when the ball was out for an Olympic throw. A quick throw saw their mid-fielder run straight up the middle of the park and shoot.
