We look forward to the day when Junior Soccer Headquarters will be also established and the inter-city and interstate Carnivals can be fought out on the one oval.

Mr. Dettmar Cramer, the International FIFA coach, through this brilliant coaching has left an indelible mark on all who came in contact with him. Our newly-formed Coaches Federation will, through the knowledge they have gained, as a result of his visit, pass on to all clubs and their members the experience necessary to improve our standard. Your co-operation is necessary and vital to ensure his mission in coming to Australia has been successful.

Again this year, as in the past, the Queensland Soccer Federation needs and expects your support in the promotion of this universal game of ours.

# FOOTBALL -- HOW DID IT START?

We know that Soccer football is now literally world football and is by far the largest of the various types of football played today. We know also that the game is controlled in all these countries by the same 17 Laws. We know that these Laws apply just the same to all games, league or cup, amateur or professional . . . but do we know how all this developed?

Apparently a type of football was played as far back as the year 32 B.C. in China by the soldiers of the Emperor Ch'eng Ti. Later football was believed to have been played by the Roman soldiers in England.

At this time the sport was a mob game, with very little in the way of tactics and the players relied mainly on brute force to drive the ball towards the goals.

Where do we look to find the origin of the kind of football as we know it today? (We will continue to refer to our code as football — after all this is what most of the world knows as football!)

It is thought that we shall find our answer about the middle of the seventeenth century in England. The "Merry Monarch", King Charles II, had been restored to the throne, and about 1660 he was almost certainly a patron of football.

In Italy about this time there was a game called "Calcio". Needless to say the Royalists who had left England at the time of Cromwell and taken refuge in that country, observed the game and probably brought back to England some of the points they had deserved.

It is recorded that there was a match played in 1681 between the servants of the King and those of the Duke of Albermarle. The next thirty or forty years saw the game's gradual development — mainly in the schools and country estates. The game was described by Joseph Strutt in 1801 at some length. Indeed, his definition: "Football is so called because the ball is driven about with the feet instead of the hands," cannot be improved upon, even today.

Certain rules were starting to be observed at about this time, particularly in the case of the Public Schools.

Around 1815, at the time of the Battle of Waterloo, several of these schools had adopted their own rules of the game. By 1825 the Eton School had their set of rules and it is probable that there were others.

It is interesting to note that about this time, in 1823 to be exact, a youth, by name Webb-Ellis, to quote "broke the rules of football as played in his time" and picked up the ball in his arms and ran with it. This act, which took place at Rugby School, is accepted as the foundation of Rugby Football.

By 1840, the captains of teams really governed their sides and were responsible for the observance of the laws by their players. It was the practice to display the rules in each school house at the beginning of the term. This was so that new boys could learn them and so avoid breaking them. We could comment here that it is a great pity this practice is not continued today, for many stoppages of play could be avoided by the players knowing the laws of the game.

Let us imagine that we are now in the year 1840. We are at the start of a 23-year period, up to the year 1863, when the game of football was played in many places with many different rules. It is significant that up to this time, all players were **expected** to know the laws of the game, and an umpire or referee was hardly necessary.

The problems of transportation prevented, or at least made very difficult, the arrangement of matches other than completely local ones. This, however, was soon to be overcome and by 1852 the first interschool games were being played. There is evidence that a game was played in that year between Westminster and Harrow, and by 1861 regular games were being played between several public schools.

From 1846, the game had started to develop at Cambridge University. Young fellows gathered there and, wanting to play football after coming from many different schools, found a major problem because they had previously played under different sets of rules. They formed a football club and framed their own set of rules, many of which became the basis of laws eventually adopted by the English F.A.

No copy of the original Cambridge rules has been found, but a copy dated 1856 has been preserved and is considered to be practically the same.

During the period 1855-1862 several clubs came into being. Notable of these is the Sheffield Club which is still in existence as an amateur club, and the Notts County F.C. which is still a member of the Football League.

On October 26, 1863, the English Football Association was formed and adopted a set of rules, which were eventually to become the Laws of the game. One of the original objects of the F.A. was to establish a set of rules which would be uniform and accepted universally, so enabling matches to be played between different clubs irrespective of their origin. By December 1, 1863, the new laws were finally approved.

We should perhaps pause to consider the remarkable fact that several

of the terms defining facets of the game are still the same today — 103 years later. Several of the laws were basically similar to those we use today.

Meanwhile, in the north of England, the Sheffield Club had been founded and in 1856 the Sheffield Club rules came into being. They were to govern a competition of clubs, some of which were Sheffield, Hallam, Heeley, Pitsmoor and Chesterfield. This was formed in 1867 and called the Sheffield Association. A game had been arranged between this body and the F.A. Because the contesting teams played under different laws, certain basic conditions were laid down. They deserve a special mention. They were:

- (1) The ground to be 120 yards long by 80 yards wide.
- (2) The dress of the London team to be white jersey or flannel shirt and white trousers.
- (3) The ball to be Lillywhite's No. 5.
- (4) Play to commence at 3 p.m. and terminate at 4.30.
- (5) Notice of the match to be sent to the following papers: The Field, Bell's Life, Sporting Life and Sportsman.

The significance of these conditions cannot be overlooked, for the first four apply to most representative matches today.

By 1870 the laws of the game had started to assume what we could term a modern wording.

The year 1871 heralded the introduction of the F.A. Cup, which was destined to become the greatest spectator attraction in England, so much so that the normal Cup Final crowd of 100,000 could probably be 500,000 if there was a ground capable of holding this number.

At the same time as the introduction of this level of competition, it became apparent that there was a need to have some punishment for breaching the laws. A "free-kick" was introduced. A ruling on the size of the ball also was included in the laws.

Let us reflect back to 1870, during this year there were three "firsts", all of which are of interest to the referee and the student of the game:

- The introduction of a new offside law. In this the term "Offside" was first incorporated in the law, and the idea of a player designated "goalkeeper" was also introduced.
- The idea of the opposite team putting the ball into play after it had been "in touch" was introduced.
- For the first time match officials were included in the laws.

Part of the wording of the law which specified this reads: "They shall be the sole judges of fair and unfair play and have power to give a penalty for foul play of any kind."

The administrators of the F.A. were soon to take a step which is still being debated by our local game (Australian Rules), and in 1874 they

made provision in the laws for officials to "rule out of the game any player who persistently infringed the laws", since this time it has been part of soccer that players who so misbehave may be sent off the field.

In 1875 it was decreed that a crossbar should take the place of the tape which had been in use up to then.

Evidence of the growth of the game was becoming apparent and each country was starting to form a controlling body of its own. In 1873 the Scottish F.A. was formed and three years later in 1876 the F.A. of Wales came into being.

Uniformity in regard to the "throw-in" was agreed upon in 1877, and it became permissible to "throw the ball straight in" instead of as before "at right angles to the touchline". This was soon followed in 1882 by the introduction of the two-hand throw-in.

At this time an outline of the duties of the referee were specifically outlined, and remarkable though it may seem to us today, the duties listed were practically the same as our Law V as it is now.

When laws were first codified in 1863 there were 14 laws. By 1870 this number had been reduced to 12, but was subsequently increased to 17 in 1898. This number has remained the same ever since. There have been several amendments, of course, but the actual number of laws has not changed.

The game has progressed greatly during this century, and has become by far the most popular of the various types of football being played all over the world. It has become truly international and has a spectator following greater than that of any other sport.

A controlling body called La Federation Internationale de Football Association was formed in 1904, and was destined to become the highest administrative body in the game, and to become generally known as F.I.F.A. It has more than 130 affiliated national associations within its membership today.

By 1937 the International Board had decided that the time was ripe to revise the laws of the game. This onerous task was given to Sir Stanley Rous, the then secretary of the English F.A.

The new sequence and definitions were completed in 1938 and accepted by the Board in June of that year.

Present Referee's Charts and printed copies of the laws of the game are all based on this revision, plus, of course, amendments which have since been approved.

It is significant that because all this development of the game took place in England, the authentic laws of the game are written in English and the English version is **always** accepted as correct. Nevertheless, as could be expected with any international sport, more than one language

has been used, and other approved official languages are French, German and Spanish.

We who follow our code in 1968 have seen other developments over the years.

Unfortunately we have also seen the standard of sportsmanship decline, and there are many who allow their emotions to get out of control. This state of affairs is not improved when we read opinions of people who are prepared to take upon themselves the mantle of judge and jury and report on the performance of players and referees.

Only last season we read the opinion of one scribe in a local newspaper, who decided that refereeing was of a lower standard than previously. Of course he only joined the ranks of many sports writers all over the world in this cry. These sort of comments are usually made without very much knowledge of the laws and frequently influenced by the many popular but incorrect versions of the law which have been handed down from old players to new players over the years.

Many ugly incidents could be avoided if players and club officials were to know the laws of the game. It has been proved in many cases, where films have been available, that the referee has had to make an unpopular but nevertheless correct decision.

There are now men in all states of Australia who have been trained by F.I.F.A. to instruct anyone who has the desire to learn the laws. They will help if asked. It is the duty of club secretaries to take advantage of F.I.F.A.'s, or the secretary of the Soccer Referees offer. No reasonable request will be refused.

Let us not dwell too long on the past, however. The game needs all the support and effort we can give it. The future is where we must focus our attention. There is still much to be done.

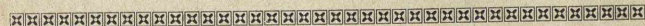

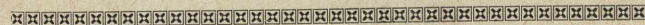
