PREMIER PREVIEW - BUNDABERG v BRISBANE CITY

PREMIER PREVIEW - MT GRAVATT v ROCHEDALE ROV

Mt Gravatt will host fourth placed Rochedale Rovers at Dittmer Park on Saturday evening.

This is a vital game for Rochedale as they look to consolidate their position in the top four.

"They (Knights) got a goal before half time to lead 2-1 at the break, but I thought we were still well and truly in the match.

"In the second half, we had a fair percentage of the play and probably should have got something out of the match.

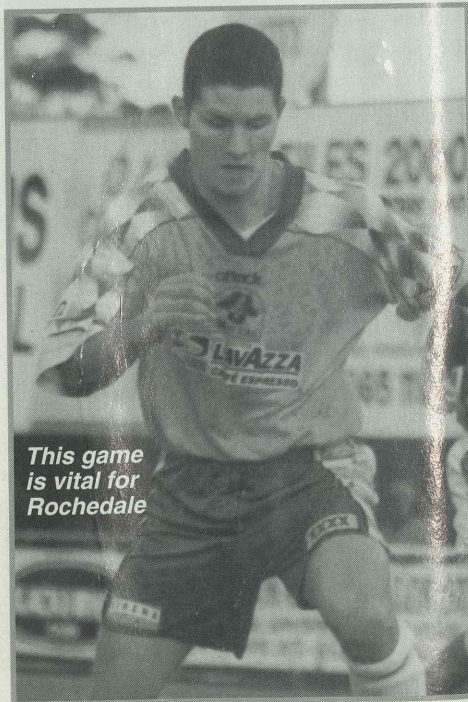
"But, at the end of the day, it was not a disastrous result for us by any means.

"Over the last few weeks, I've been trying to instil some passion into the side and its starting to pay off," he said.

PREMIER PREVIEW - BEENLEIGH v IPSWICH KNIGHTS

Beenleigh host the Ipswich Knights at Chris Green Park on Saturday evening.

This is a must win match for the Knights as they look to maintain contact with the top four.

On paper and form, Mike Mulvey's men should secure the three points, but Beenleigh has been steadily improving in recent weeks.

Coach Steve Dolan said he had been pleased with the commitment and effort of his players over the last few weeks.

"The lads did a fair job and played pretty well across the ninety minutes," Cox said.

"We had a couple of chances in the first half and tried to catch them on the break.

"We produced some nice build-up play, defended well and at half time, things were going the way that we had planned them.

"However, they (Knights) managed to score a couple of quick goals early in the second half and that really ended the match for us.

"We struggled for a while but kicked on and battled well to the end."

Cox said he had been buoyed by the performance of his team and was confident of snaring a couple of favourable results from the remaining league games.

"I can see us getting a couple of wins before the season ends if we keep persisting," he said.

"We've had a few players spit the dummy and leave the club and we only have a small squad now.

"But the people who want to play for the club have remained and that's an important part of building a team.

"In the first round, we lost 8-2 to City with a strong squad on paper, in round 2 we lost 4-1 with a slightly weaker squad, while last week we only lost 2-0 with our weakest squad.

"We haven't got the results we were after but the lads have been working hard and competing well and that is an encouraging sign."

PREMIER PREVIEW - BRISBANE LIONS v WYNNUM

Brisbane Lions face a tough test when they host the Wynnum Wolves at Lions Stadium on Sunday afternoon.

The Wolves have proved a bogey side for many of the top teams and their position on the league ladder belies the side's ability.

When the two teams last met in round 15, Wynnum inflicted a 2-0 dousing on Lions and Wolves coach Peter Tokesi is hoping for a similar result this weekend.

"There's no doubt that Lions will be out to avenge that loss and we'll have to be on our game to make sure they don't," he said.

"We want to prove for the rest of the season that we're no easy beats and we'll be trying to get maximum points from this game.

"We've got nothing to lose and grabbing a couple of points off one of the league's top sides would be very satisfying.

"We've got a lot of young players in the side that are happy to get out and play for a win and that might prove an advantage for us."

Lions coach Miron Bleiberg said three points were vital to his side's chances of making the finals series.

"The situation this week is that we must beat Wynnum in order to stay in the competition," he said.

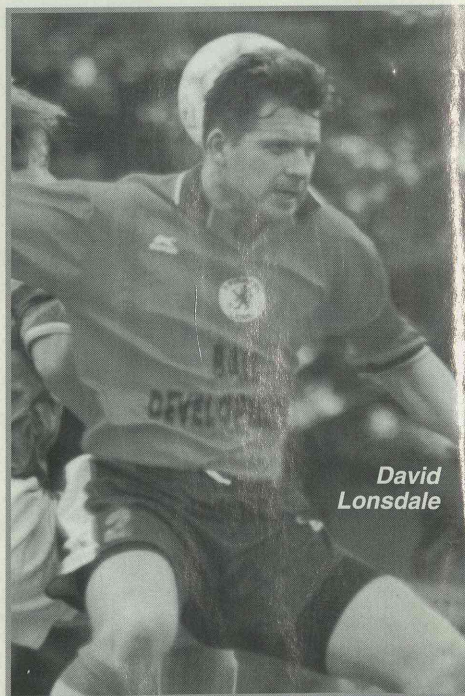
"Last time we played them they beat us and we definitely would like to reverse that result this weekend.

However, Bleiberg is not overawed by the challenge.

"One can look at our finish and call it hard, but I look at it and believe it is very exciting," he said.

PREMIER PREVIEW - Gold Coast v TARINGA ROV

Taringa Rovers travel south to Nerang on Sunday where they will meet the Gold Coast.

Rovers slipped into outright second on the league ladder with a hard fought 1-0 win against the Bundaberg Waves last week.

Taringa coach John Ogden said he was pleased to take the three points at the business end of the season.

"Bundaberg played very well especially in the first half but I thought we were well in control in the second half," he said.

"I was happy that we managed to keep a clean sheet once again and our sixteen year old goalkeeper Malcolm van de Graaff played very well.

"I was also very impressed with the efforts of another sixteen year old Darryl Hathway as he did some good work for us up front.

"We're using a lot of young guys this season and overall, I've been pleased with the way they have been coming along.

"That is something that we must try to keep in perspective when gauging our performances as you have to expect that consistency will be a problem at times."

Now that Taringa has moved into second place Ogden said it was important to maintain that position with a win against the Gold Coast.

However, the Coast have proved difficult opposition for Taringa this season.

In round 6, the Coast drew 1-1 with Rovers, while in round 15 Taringa snuck home 2-1.

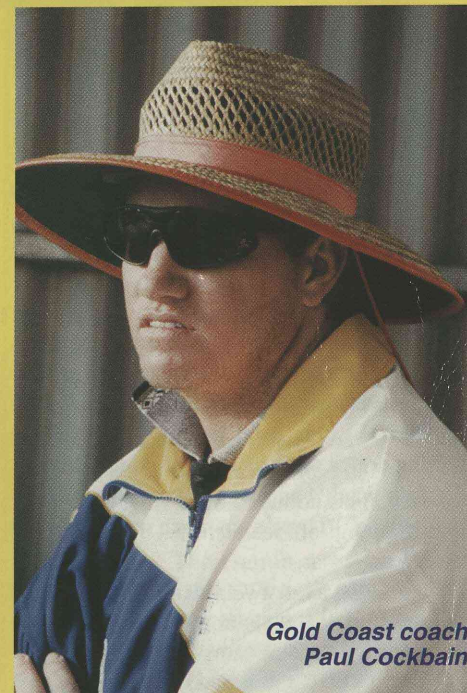
Ogden identified this match as a danger game for his charges.

"This is a tough match for us and we'll certainly have to be on cue to win," he said.

"The Gold Coast have put it to us twice this season and there has been nothing in the games.

"I'm surprised that they are not a little higher on the table as they're a lot better than their position would indicate."

Taringa have the added pressure of having a lot of key players just one booking away from suspension. Ogden said this was cause for concern with the finals just a month away.

Thistle Coach lambasts players Pine Rivers under siege

Grange Thistle coach Paddy Higgins has given his young team a real lambasting, following their 3-1 loss to Newmarket last weekend.

The victory for Newmarket was convincing to say the least, particularly for a side that has struggled to come to terms with the competition.

However that very criticism was the same one that Higgins used on his players, in a scathing attack on their level of commitment.

"Last week's performance was utter crap," Higgins said. "There's not much more I can say about it.

"It's quite clear after last weekend's effort that some of the players just don't have the ability to step up to the next level.

"There's no excuses and I'm offering none. Quite simply though, the players have got to wake up to themselves and make a decision about whether or not they want to play properly at this level or just play a bit of kick-ball in the park."

Last weekend's loss has kept the side in danger of securing this year's wooden spoon, with victory against Mitchelton this weekend, very important for the side if it is to avoid that dubious honour.

Mitchelton have their own race to run however, and now find themselves right back in the finals race, following their 3-2 win over The Gap.

That victory has put the club on an even keel with Pine Rivers, with goal difference the only thing separating the two sides.

However Rivers have a game in hand on Mitchelton, meaning Mitchy must take full advantage of any competition points that may be on offer to them... and that starts with Grange Thistle this weekend.

Semi-Pro North finals contenders Pine Rivers are under siege, with Mitchelton drawing level with the Frank Pimblett coached side, following last weekend's fixtures.

Mitchelton downed The Gap 3-2 to move onto 29 points, the same number as Rivers, however goal difference has kept Pimblett's side in fourth spot on the ladder.

But that position could be under threat this weekend, with Mitchelton set to take on lowly Grange Thistle, in a match which should see them take maximum competition points.

Rivers must defeat Newmarket this weekend to maintain their spot in the top four.

However that's a task easier said than done. Newmarket have hit a purple patch in recent weeks, with the side lifting itself off the bottom of the table and moving into third last, six points clear of celler-dwellers North Star, and now just eight points shy of the top four.

And while a top four finish is certainly well out of reach for the Newmarket outfit, they have shown that they will definitely be nuisance value to some of the teams contesting for top four positions, Rivers included.

Newmarket latest scalp was Grange Thistle, and although it wasn't the most prized of scalps, the win nonetheless was impressive and allowed the club to maintain some level of consistency.

Rivers at Wendy Alison Park is one of the most daunting road trips faced by any side in the northern conference however, and with a spot up for grabs, Pimblett's men will certainly be fired up for a big one.

The former XXXX League club has lost just five of its 20 matches this season, although Newmarket have given them strong opposition on the two occasions they have met this season.

NORTHERN SEMIPROS AND CONS

All too easy for mighty Tigers

East once again showed their class and dominance of this year's Semi-Pro North competition, with a 1-0 victory over the inform University of Queensland last weekend.

The victory was the Tigers 15th of the season and has allowed them to maintain their hefty 14 point lead at the top of the table.

For University on the other hand, it has virtually cruelled their chances of a top two finish, with Albany Creek's victory placing them a comfortable four points ahead of the students on the table.

The win was also a psychological blow for the Tigers as finals time approaches, and the confidence of the students was riding high.

The challenge now for the Tigers is to motivate themselves for this weekend's match against bottom of the table North Star.

And while this contest on paper looks to be a one-sided affair, it would be folly to rule the young North Star outfit out of contention.

The side fought hard against Albany Creek last weekend, going down by just one goal to nil, to the competition's second best team.

That result would have given the youngsters plenty of confidence heading into this weekend's match against the ladder leaders, who really have very little to play for.

North Star on the other hand, are playing to avoid the wooden spoon. Currently they lie in last place at the moment, however they are just one point shy of Grange Thistle, with only one goal separating their goal differences.

The young side which began the season well would dearly love to move up off the foot of the table and a win this weekend against the top side could not only help them achieve that goal, but also give them enough confidence to string a couple more upsets together.

The Gap's hopes slipping away

The finals hopes of The Gap are fast fading, following their disappointing 3-2 loss to Mitchelton last weekend.

The result kept Mauro Saftich's side in sixth position on 25 points, four points out of the top four, with just a handful of games remaining.

There are still 12 points on offer to The Gap, however a recent drop in form at the business end of the season, has many pundits believing their season is all but over.

Pine Rivers and Mitchelton are the two sides most believe will contest the last finals spot, which means The Gap may be resigned to looking towards the 1999 season.

And that will certainly be the case if Saftich's outfit loses to the University of Queensland this weekend.

A loss to third placed Uni would almost certainly spell curtains for The Gap, a team that promised much in the early part of the season, but has failed to find consistency all year.

Victory would give the side three much needed competition points, which would keep them in touch with the other two sides fighting for the last finals spot.

But a victory is also a must for the University team. The students' 1-0 loss to Eastern Suburbs last weekend, allowed second placed Albany Creek to move four points ahead of them on the competition table.

That would make the race for second spot very interesting with just three rounds of the competition remaining.

Defeat for Uni this weekend against The Gap however, could also signal an end to their top two aspirations, as well as place some unwanted pressure on the side from both Mitchelton and Pine Rivers, as these two sides attempt to secure a finals berth.

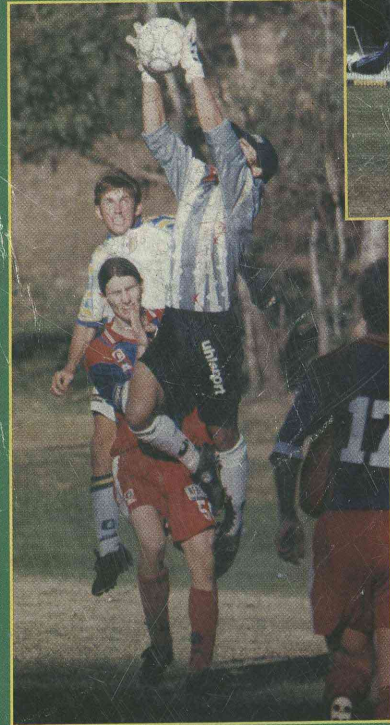

"Without taking any credit away from our previous goal keeper, Chris has been the difference the past few weeks," Hastings said.

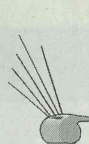
"His experience has allowed for much more stability in our defence and I think that was evident in last weekend's clean sheet."
